ST. PETE WATER PIPE REPLACEMENT

ity of St. Petersburg personnel and personnel from the company contracted to do the work of replacing the blue pipe over the Lake Tarpon Outfall Canal with an underground pipe, gave a presentation on how this will be done, on Wednesday the 7th of February.

The work may start late Fall of this year and last for about 6 months. At this time they are waiting on permits from the Army Corps of Engineers.

They will be pulling 1700 feet of 54-inch welded plastic pipe from our side at the end of Sugar Bear to the other side of the canal in Gull Aire. The depth of the pipe under the canal will be about 70 feet down into bedrock. Boring will be done from the Gull Air side of the canal. Most of the equipment being used on our side will be brought in through Mease Hospital roads and onto the easement behind Sugar Bear, New Fawn, Deer Trail, Honey Bear, Bear Run, and Fox Trail. Some pipe may be brought onto the easement before the first island in the road along BC Blvd. The pipe will come in 50-foot sections and when assembled on rollers, will stretch from the NE end of Sugar Bear to almost the beginning of Sugar Bear. They will be putting up security fencing along the easement for safety and sound barriers at the pit location, at the NE end of Sugar Bear, due to the noise that will be generated during the final phase of the project. When the pipe has been assembled and the horizontal hole under the canal has been bored, and everything else is ready, they will begin pulling the pipe from our side to Gull Aire's side. This will be a continuous 24/7 operation that may take up to 2 days to finish. At the end of the project, they will restore the easement grounds to their original condition.

They will also be trimming/clearing select trees in the easement. Any private items, sheds/



planters, our owners have placed in the easement must be removed by the owners.

A copy of the informational flyers handed out at the meeting will be placed on the association bulletin board in the clubhouse. We will be posting further information through various means as it becomes available.

The eyeglasses are then taken to an optical center and then sent to the Lions Club. As we age and need new glasses, your old eyeglasses,

reading glasses, and even sunglasses can be recycled to be used by those less fortunate. I have repainted and updated the box for the glasses and moved it to a prominent location just inside the front clubhouse doors. Below is an excerpt from the Lions Club describing this endeavor. If you have any questions, please contact Pat Arend, 727-698-7763.

Why Recycle Glasses? An estimated 120 million people* are visually impaired because of uncorrected refractive errors (far and near sightedness). Almost all cases can be corrected and normal vision can be restored with eyeglasses, contact lenses or refractive surgery. The lack of eyeglasses denies children and adults opportunities for education, employment and a better quality of life. The Journey of Recycled Glasses: 1. Lions and Leos collect used eyeglasses at various community locations. 2. The glasses are shipped to the nearest Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center where trained volunteers sort, clean and determine the prescription strengths of the glasses. 3. Volunteers at the recycling center carefully package the prepared glasses and store them until they are required for eyeglass dispensing missions. Glasses that are not suitable for reuse are recycled for scrap, with the earnings benefitting local Lions and Leos projects. 4. At the mission site, eye care professionals and trained Lion and Leo volunteers perform vision screenings and dispense the appropriate recycled glasses, free of charge, to children and adults in need.





WALKING SAFETY

Talking is a healthy activity, but it's important to know the rules of thumb of pedestrian safety. This is especially true if you are walking in an area where there aren't sidewalks or paths separated from the road. To stay safe walking:

- Walk facing oncoming traffic walk on the left side of the road.
- Always stay aware of your surroundings. Pavement may be uneven. Remember motorists might not notice you.
- Possible distractions while walking might be using a mobile device, visiting with fellow walkers, or the pet you are walking.
- Be visible. Don't wear dark clothing, especially at night. When walking at night, wear light-colored clothing or a reflective vest, to be visible. Be just as cautious at dawn or twilight, as drivers still have limited visibility or may even have the setting or rising sun directly in their eyes.
- Know when to stop walking. Heat sickness, dehydration, heart attack, or stroke can strike walkers of any age. Learn the symptoms of these medical emergencies and carry a cell phone to call for help.

FOBS

Last year the Board replaced the keys to the Clubhouse and Pool Area with FOBS that increase the safety of all residents of Briar Creek. Remember to bring your FOB with you when you are going to the Clubhouse or Pool. Do not assume that someone will be there and open the door or gate – this defeats the purpose of issuing FOBS for security.

CLUBHOUSE/POOL AREA

After use of the Clubhouse or Pool Area remember to do the following:

- Relock any doors you dogged in the open position
- Turn off lights
- Turn off any fans you used also fans on back deck by the pool
- Return any items you used from the kitchen and, if needed, empty the trash

Walk your bike or scooter or any other item across the Bridge. There are signs on both ends reminding you of this!





I realize that for some it will never be enough but for most they find that TLC is doing a good job. You also want to remember that any alteration to your landscaping requires an alteration request which details your plans. This is mandatory so we can ensure that our lawn mowing company (TLC) doesn't get bogged down doing their job because of how someone landscaped their property. We want to keep the cost as low as possible for this service and by maintaining a property that is "mower friendly" it will help not only the lawn mowing company (TLC), but our bottom line and our pockets. Now for those of you who have removed your block skirting and installed vinyl skirting, which I have done myself, please make sure you have some type of barrier between the skirting and your lawn. TLC is "not responsible" for any damage to vinyl squirting. Again, make sure you have some type of barrier between your skirting and your lawn. This also applies to your downspouts. TLC is "not responsible" for damage to the ends of your rain gutters / downspouts. Make sure there is room between the downspouts and your lawn. You might want to add a diverter just to make sure.






