#### **ROADS AND GROUNDS**

The major water line leak by Beaver Dam has been fixed. Unfortunately, it took much longer than anticipated to make the repairs. Fortunately, due to 3 blowouts a second unknown leak was discovered. This resulted in a new better valve being put in place of the two existing valves, one of which was unknown to us and was most likely stuck in the open position.

We have purchased a water line leak detector and over the next several months I will be out and about searching for any additional leaks. This will necessitate walking between homes where they are back-to-back and behind homes where they have open space behind them. You will be able to recognize me as I will be wearing headphones, hopefully a hat, and have an orange tablet shaped device hanging in front of me along with a funny looking cane, connected to the tablet, with a sizeable transducer with a metal probe sticking out the bottom of the transducer. The device works by listening for the hiss of water coming out of a crack in the pipe, leaky valve, or a leaky pipe joint.

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





Hind out more about the natural setting of Briar Creek on our monthly bird walks. We are now at 116 bird species on our all-time bird list for Briar Creek, and we added one on our March walk. In March, on the 1st, six of us of us saw 36



species. Our new addition to the park list was a Black-throated Green Warbler seen in the oaks along Birch Creek Drive. In the boat parking area, a Hermit Thrush (only the second time for this bird!) perched on the sign marking space 11, and we all got good close-up views. Other highlights included Nanday Parakeet, Limpkin, and Northern Parula Warbler. Check this URL on the internet for the complete list: ebird.org/checklist/S163336328





These are non-domesticated animals which search for food on their own and take care of themselves in the wild.
