Swimming Pool Rules

Tust want to remind residents and their guest to please follow the swimming pool rules.



- A. Colonial Village swimming pool is generally open seven (7) days a week from 8:00 AM until DUSK.
 - B. Anyone alone in the pool swims at their own risk. No lifeguard.
- C.No running around the pool, jumping or diving into the pool, no splashing near other swimmers'. Please be considerate of others.
 - D. No glass or breakable items around the pool
- F. Smoking is only permitted in designated areas, Throw all trash, cigarette butts, ashes, etc' into can at poolside.
- G. No alcoholic beverages are allowed in the pool area. Non-alcoholic drinks are allowed in cans or plastic containers. Glass containers of any kind are NOT permitted.
 - H. A shower must be taken before entering the pool.
 - I. People with incontinence, coids, skin eruptions, athlete's foot and infections are not permitted to use the pool.
 - J. No parking or riding bikes around pool.
- K. Children who are not toilet-trained are not permitted in the pool unless they are wearing special leak-proof diapers specifically designed for swimming. Children wearing all other types of diapers are not permitted in the pool. If a Resident, or his or her guest, causes the pool to be contaminated, the Resident shall be held financially responsible for the restoration of the pool to swimming condition.
 - L. Recreation flotation devices: i.e. Inner tubes and rafts are not permitted in the pool. Wearable safety flotation devices and noodles are allowed.
 - M. Please read the rules posted at the pool. All rules must be obeyed when using the pool.
 - N. Colonial Village reserves the right to exclude any person from the use of the pool.

KINDLY INFORM YOUR GUESTS OF THESE RULES BEFORE THEY USE THE POOL Remind them this is a 55+ village pool, not one found in someone's back yard or a hotel








Before You Head North

Then you are preparing to leave for the season, keep in mind that there will be a box in the Clubhouse for canned or dry foods you don't want to bring home with you or leave in your cupboards here. The food must be unopened and nonperishable. They will be donated to local food banks. A box will be available through the end of April. Thank you and safe travels.

Also be sure the office has your "northern" home address and telephone number. Many Snowbird residents cancel their Largo telephone number and forget to provide the office with your away number and an emergency number. The office has a 'Before You Leave' form for you to complete; to include date of leaving, date of returning, contact information and contact information for the person looking after your unit in your absence. Not only is this a Park Rule but it is essential in case of an emergency here in the park. Thank you.

Tie-Down Project Update

The Colonial Village project began late February and is expected to be completed sometime in April according to Scott Oke #148 who is overseeing the project for the park. There was a good response from our resident when the presentation was made in early December. There are 120 units currently signed up for the free program. The State of Florida



Loss Mitigation Program is paid in full from funds furnished at no expense to the residents. The State of Florida and Gulf Coast State College Mobile Home Tie-Down Program involves only the enhancement of the tie-down and anchoring system of the unit. The program does not intend to bring existing mobile homes up to code but to make the home as wind resistant as funding, physical characteristics and condition of premises permit.

Scott says approximately two months post the park work being completed, each resident will receive a Certificate of Completion as well as a diagram which outlines where anchors and stabilizers were used on the home. This information if passed along to your insurance company, can be used to potentially reduce your insurance costs. Thank you, Scott, for overseeing this project for the park.



Colonial Village History

published in the Park Pictorial Directory, 1970

n January 2nd, 1965, the new Colonial Village Mobile Park had its Grand Opening at 2000 E. Bay Drive in Largo, Florida. It was the completion of the first big step in the dreams of its two find owners, Len Collman and Lew Brower. They have planned and developed one of the finest such Parks in the state, which was destined to attract the finest people you could meet from 23 states and Canada. Now starting its fifth year Colonial numbers 34 senior citizens from New York, 31 from the state of Michigan, 27 from Ohio, 21 couples from Illinois, 14 from Indiana, 13 from New Jersey, 6 from Iowa, 5 each from Connecticut, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin, 3 from Maryland, 2 each from Canada, Minnesota, and Georgia. They following nine have but one each: California, Delaware, Kansas, Kentucky, New Hampshire, Oregon, Rhode Island, Texas, and Virginia. We who live here, are most proud if our park, its people and our homes. Sports and activities galore are available to all residents without charge under volunteer leadership and organization, each group represented on the Activity Board. Shuffleboard for fun has over 200 members and participants on our 8 official courts, day and night. Two fine teams represent us in the "Big Ten" league on the Sun Coast, playing weekly matches. Bowlers, golfers, fishing groups, craft and sewing, and horse-shoe pitchers have regular schedules and big participation. Illustrations that follow the above, also show square dancing, monthly pancake suppers, Park dinners, weekly coffee-hour; bingo, and special entertainment nights.

The five families below, "pioneers" on opening day, grew to 49 at the end of the first year, about 130 in the next park expansion, 140 in '67, and the addition of Mayflower Avenue n '68, makes 180 homes now at full capacity. Pioneers: Riley and Helen Morgan, Alice Rudolph, Howard Burket, Dorthy and Howard Gatley and Bea and Cliff Bradshaw.

The Village Activity Board consisted of Charles Smart, Thelma Peterson, Mary Holzhaur, Thea McPhee, Marion Harris, Fannie Frutiger, Claire Eckman, Harry Holzhauer, Ed Morrison, Vic Cookson, Bill Vagts, Ted Hildebrant, Homer Curry, Carl Loucks and George Gillesby.

Colonial Village History

Park (CV) property in her beautiful historic home, where the Largo Recreational Center is today. They owned grapefruit and orange groves on their many acre homestead. Once the fruit was harvested, it was bagged and shipped by train to markets. Although not an open-to-the-public fruit stand, some fruit was sold from the barn nearby by their farmhand Wilbur. Back in the 1970s Jack and Peg Moore would visit Jack's parents (Bruce and Helen, Unit #139). Jack and his dad would take trips to the barn to purchase the fresh fruit and Wilbur and Jack became good friends over the years. Wilbur lived in the barn during the day and went home each nightfall after work. He, an African American, was a hard worker with minimal pay, packing the fruit in 20-pound bags that were full and very heavy to carry...for \$1 to \$2 for all bags each trip. Not more than 3 or 4 people from Colonial Park were aware of Wilbur. Jack would give Wilbur a lift home and would give him food and his men's clothes.

By then Mrs. Lainey's husband had passed away. Most times when Jack went and drove away from the barn, Mrs. Lainey was on her back porch and waved her hand 'hello' and smiled. This went on for years. A few time she came off the porch and they would talk, so she knew Jack. One day her wave was a 'beckoning' wave and they talked for an hour plus about her life, the property, and her health plans (She was having some health issues.). She had no family and friends she could trust.

At the time, late 2002, the 180 Colonial Village Mobile Home Park residents paid a monthly rent for the unit space at \$70 and a monthly maintenance fee of \$30 to the CV office. CV in turn paid rent to Mrs Lainey, the land owner. Jack asked her if she ever thought about selling her property and she said she had. Jack told her to think more about it and they would talk again in two weeks. Jack told her he would take her to lunch to a place of her choosing, a place she hadn't been to previously.

They went to Clearwater Country Club and spent two hours talking. Two week later Mrs. Lainey asked to go again and they did. This time Jack brought the CV treasurer, John Price and again they talked at great lengths and she became very comfortable with them and the negotiations. Jack and John said they would go back to the CV 'selected' staff people to discuss and they would get back to her again. The CV 'staff' talked and put together a plan and included the park's lawyer, Bryan McGlothan and money advisor s. Jack went back to Mrs. Lainey to advise her of the CV proposal. She was very satisfied. The plan was for CV to purchase the land and become a 55+ resident-owned park. The purchase of the land took place late 2002 for \$1,500,000. Mrs. Lainey eventually sold the rest of her property to the county. The county demolished the house and barn and built the community recreational center and developed the park.

Canada Extends As Far South As California.

anada is famously known as the Great White North, but most of its citizens live in the country's southerly regions — which are more southerly than you might think. In fact, 90% of Canadians live within 100 miles of the U.S.-Canadian border, and around 60% of all Canadians live south of Seattle, Washington. All in all, 27 states in the U.S. are totally or partially north of Canada's most southern point, at Middle Island in Lake Erie in Ontario. Areas above that highest point even include a small sliver of California, which may seem counterintuitive considering the state contains one of the hottest places on Earth (Death Valley). Utah and Nevada also contain land north of Canada's most southern point.

Why do so many Canadians cling to these southern regions? In large part, agriculture. According to Canadian historian William Lewis Morton, commercial agriculture in these warmer climates formed a network of towns, which then developed into modern cities following the Industrial Revolution. These numbers could change as the world continues to warm, and Canada's colder regions prepare for an influx of climate refugees. In 50 to 100 years, Canada likely won't resemble the Great White North anymore. Canada has the longest coastline in the world. The size of Middle Island, Canada's southernmost point is 46 acres. The distance from Canada to France's Islands of St. Pierre and Miquelon is 16 miles; a French possession and the last remnant of France's once-vast colonial empire in North America,

Three often-cited yardsticks describe the lopsidedness of Canada's demography: 90% of Canadians live within 100 miles (160 km) of the U.S. border. More than 70% of Canadians live below the 49th parallel. More than 60% of Canadians live south of Seattle.Jun 7, 2023 38.25 million people live in Canada in 2021. 37.74 million live in Canada in 2024. One Canadian Dollar equates to 0.73869 US Dollars.

The land area of Canada is 3, 855, 103 square miles compared to America's 3, 794, 083, making Canada 1.6% larger that the States. Even though Canada is a larger country, the United States has a population of 307,212,123 people compared to 33,487,208 people in Canada in 2010.

Facts About Citrus Fruit



lorida is one of the world's largest producers of citrus, yet citrus did not have its beginnings here. It originally came from southeast Asia and spread westward. Oranges first reached the New World in 1493, carried aboard ships commanded by Christopher Columbus. Soon afterwards, the Spanish brought citrus to Florida.

United States citrus utilized production for the 2020-2021 season totaled 6.9 million tons, down 12% from the 2019-2020 season. California accounted for 60% of total United States citrus production; Florida accounted for 38%, and Texas and Arizona produced the remaining 2%.

Citrus growers often bundle together bunches of oranges in mesh bags, which you may have noticed are made from red plastic. It's no coincidence; red bags against orange peels create an optical illusion that makes the fruit appear more vibrantly hued and enticing. The trick works for other citrus — like mandarins, clementines, tangerines, and even some grapefruit — though not all. Yellow citrus, like lemons, are often sold in yellow or green bags to create a similar color-popping effect.

Many researchers believe that all citrus fruit can be traced back to just three species: pomelos, citrons, and mandarins. Citrus trees of different species are reproductively compatible with one another; over time, cross-breeding between these "ancestor fruits" created the hybrids known as grapefruits, oranges, lemons, limes, and other citrus varieties enjoyed today.

Oranges are a go-to food for many when battling a cold, thanks to the fact that they're packed with vitamin C — though some research suggests that the nutrient doesn't actually prevent colds, and may only slightly cut short how long a cold lasts. Another hitch in eating



oranges to help illnesses is that much of the fruit's vitamin C is found in its peel. Just one tablespoon of the outer rind contains 14% of the recommended daily dose of vitamin C, which is about three times more than what's found in the inner flesh.

Regardless of the flag they were working under, nearly all sailors of the past shared a common enemy: scurvy. The disease, caused by a vitamin C deficiency, plagued sailors who were unable to regularly consume fresh fruits and vegetables while out at sea. The British Royal Navy began supplying its sailors with lemons and lime juice in 1795, though not all countries picked up on the practice. During the War of 1812, skeptical American sailors nicknamed then British counterparts "limeys" to mock the practice — though the U.S. Navy eventually started doing it too.

Pomelos are grapefruit-like citrus native to Southeast Asia, known for their yellow rinds and pink inner flesh — not to mention their size. The jumbo citrus fruits can grow up to the size of a basketball and weight as much ass 22 pounds. In comparison, kumquats are the smallest known citrus, maturing at a max length of around 2 inches. (Kumquats are also the only citrus fruit you can easily eat without peeling.)

What's small, orange, and easy to peel? Both clementines and mandarins, which explains why these two nearly identical citrus fruits are often confused. However, botanists say there is a difference. Clementines are an offshoot variety of mandarins, created by <u>crossing mandarins</u> and sweet oranges. That means all clementines are technically a type of mandarin, though all mandarins are not clementines.

Grapefruits are packed with vitamins and fiber that <u>support heart and gut health</u>, though people who rely on some medications are often warned away from consuming the fruits. That's because grapefruit juice can affect how medications work. Some drugs, like those for cholesterol and high blood pressure, are metabolized in the body by the CYP3A4 enzyme found in the small intestine. Grapefruit juice can block that enzyme, which stops the medication from breaking down and causes too much to enter the bloodstream. Other drugs, like fexofenadine (Allegra) for allergies, use proteins called transporters to enter cells in the body; grapefruit juice can block this process and cause too little of the drug to circulate, rendering it ineffective.

Oranges are relatively inexpensive today, though 19th-century Europeans who woke to find them in their stockings on Christmas morning considered the fruits a grand gift. The tradition of receiving an orange as a holiday present dates to the 1800s, when Christmas revelers widely began hanging stockings on the mantle, and is commonly linked to the tale of St. Nicholas of Myra, a fourth-century bishop who reportedly tossed bags of gold into the drying stockings of poor maidens. Oranges — which were generally a rare and expensive fruit in Victorian times — represented St. Nicholas' gifted gold, and became linked with the holiday.
