 This is your best protection and can possibly help apprehend the party.

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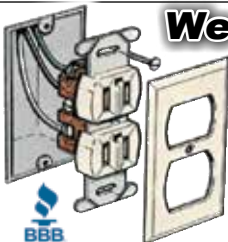
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From the Board of Directors

This is necessary as part of the Fair Housing Act and our designation as a 55+ community, and is detailed in our documents. If you have questions or need paperwork, contact Tammy Hendress for assistance.

For our pet owners, a reminder that pets must be on a leash at all times, and the leash can be no more than six feet long – this is a county ordinance – and can only be walked in the pet section. Your cooperation is appreciated.

If you are heading away for more than 1 week, please have someone look after your home, and be sure to remove all objects that could be tossed around in a storm.

Vice President Wendell Hickerson is looking after things while I am up north. I will continue to participate in the Monday operations meetings via telephone and be involved in any projects that arise. Moving or Estate Sale Form

This form is new to everyone; it was voted on and approved at the last board meeting, held in March 2026. The purpose of this new form:



- Provide notification of the sale so the board and the community can make any necessary preparations for the safety and convenience of residents
- Ensure that whoever is holding the sale has been advised of the rules
- Provide tracking since only 1 sale is allowed

Forms can be found in the form holder inside the clubhouse, near the door to the bathroom hallway. It must be turned in to a board member or placed in the Blue Jay Association lock box at least 2 weeks prior to a sale.

Rodent Problems

Rodents in Florida are drawn to homes by food, water, and shelter. Accessible pet food and open trash containers provide easily accessible food to rodents. Leaky pipes, AC units, or containers holding standing water are an invitation to rodents. Dense vegetation and undergrowth, overgrown trees, and general clutter provide ideal shelter for rodents to hide. As temperatures drop or during heavy rain, they seek dry, warm areas like the crawl space under your home, using small openings in the underpinning for access.



Preventive Steps:

- Landscaping and Foliage: Reduce excessive plants or vegetation, dense mulch, and debris piles. Keep trees and shrubbery trimmed and keep undergrowth and excessive vegetation cleared out as it provides excellent hiding areas.
- Seal Access: Make sure the underpinning of your home is sealed well.
- Cleanliness and Food Sources: Openly stored garbage cans can provide even small amounts of food. Be sure garbage is in sealed in airtight containers and remove yard debris.
- Water Sources: Dripping AC units, leaking hose faucets, and standing water provide a source of water for rodents. Have AC units serviced as needed, replace leaky faucets or hoses and eliminate standing water in pots or open containers.

New to Blue Jay or Just Need a Refresher?

Ever wonder what the correct procedure is to address issues you may find yourself dealing with here at Blue Jay. If you're new to Blue Jay or just haven't had a need before, knowing the correct process can seem confusing. In general, residents should refer anyone, resident or not, to a board member for official business, do not attempt to provide official information or permission regarding Blue Jay rules and polices. The social committee can help with any questions or concerns you have with games, events, or other activities. Below is an overview of who, when, and how to address concerns.

Board of Directors Communication and Meetings

Blue Jay Estates Damage or Comment Form: This can be found in the form holder inside the clubhouse, near the door to the bathroom hallway. Use this form to provide feedback, suggestions, lodge a complaint, or notify the board of damage. It **does** require a name/signature however, it is confidential. The name of the person submitting the form is **not** shared outside of the board. Once completed, drop it in the Blue Jay Association lock box in the same location. These forms are retrieved and reviewed on Monday during the Operations Meeting. This form should not be used for an emergency notification of damage.

Operations Meeting: This meeting is at 8:30am on Monday; it is open to all residents. There are discussions amongst board members regarding maintenance, upkeep, and general operating topics. Residents can add their input as well. Damage and Comment forms are reviewed during this meeting. If you have questions about interpretation of the Blue Jay rules or how to do something this is the best place to ask. If applicable, items discussed in this meeting may eventually be put on an agenda for a board meeting if it requires a vote or rule change.

Board Meetings: Board meetings are held on the third Tuesday of the month, October through April. These meetings have an established agenda that is followed. Agenda items are discussed and voted on as needed. This is not the venue for new issues; new issues should be addressed during the Monday Operations meeting.

Members Meeting: This meeting is held in February. This is when the budget is approved and elections take place for new board members.

Social Club Communication and Meetings

The Social Club includes every adult homeowner, resident or renter in Blue Jay. There are 4 officers elected each year; Chairperson, Co-Chairperson, Treasurer, and Secretary, commonly referred to as the Social Committee.

Social Club Feedback Form: This can be found in the form holder inside the clubhouse, near the door to the bathroom hallway. Use this form to provide feedback, suggestions...etc to the Social Committee. The form is not a requirement; you can always share your thoughts with any member of the Social Committee. However, it allows you to convey your ideas/concerns directly to the entire Social Committee as they will review the forms as a group. It does require

a name/signature however, it is confidential. The name of the person submitting the form is not shared outside of the Social Committee. Once completed, drop it in the Blue Jay Association lock box in the same location.

Social Planning Meeting: This meeting is at 10am on Tuesday and is open to all residents. The 4 elected officers meet each week to plan the upcoming schedule of events and discuss any projects they have planned.

Coffee Hour and Social Club Meeting: This happens every Wednesday morning. Coffee Hour starts at 9am and the meeting starts at 10am. During the meeting we will discuss upcoming activities and events, you can sign up for events and hear reports regarding what is going on in the park. It is the best way to stay informed about everything going on around Blue Jay.

Blue Jay Facebook Page: The Blue Jay Facebook page is a private group reserved for current residents. Content is limited to Blue Jay community and social related items. The board of directors and/or the social committee will use it to announce upcoming events or alerts regarding something significant happening in the park. Members of the group may submit posts that will then be reviewed and approved or declined by the administrators of the page. Please remember it is not for personal announcements, airing grievances, or advertising/promoting companies. The complete group rules can be found on the facebook page.

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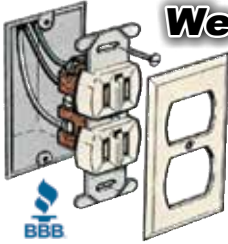
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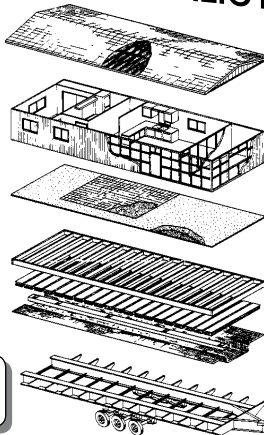

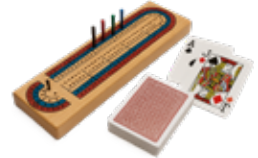

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Things to Remember

1. Eastbound cars entering Blue Jay Estates from Curlew Road **ALWAYS** have the right-of-way.
2. Parking & Driving in Blue Jay Estates
 - a. **ONLY** park on one side of the street based on which side other cars are parked on.
 - . This allows room for FIRE & EMS trucks to get through.
 - b. **DO NOT** park on sidewalks.
 - c. No parking at the corners.
 - d. Must obtain permission, in advance, to park in someone else's driveway.
 - e. Cars parked at clubhouse overnight must be moved by 8:00 am.
 - f. Speed limit is 15 mph.
 - g. This applies to residents, visitors and workers.
3. **No dumping** of any kind in the RV lot.
4. Run off created by cleaning your house, car etc. will end up in our ponds. Consider this when selecting your chemical/cleaning products.
5. **Any** modifications or new additions to the exterior of your home or lot must be reviewed by the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) and approved by the Board of Directors before any work begins.

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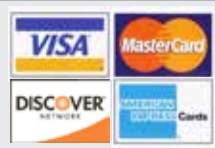
