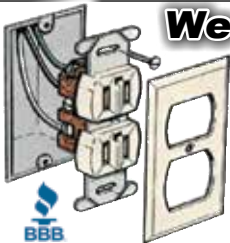

BOARD COMMUNICATION

The Board of Directors sends out email communication on items of importance that you need to know. They send out an email informing residents when there is a water leak and the water will need to be turned off, an upcoming Board of Directors Meeting and notification when the minutes of the meeting are available for you to read. There are also other items such as the lawn mowing schedule that the Board sends out to keep you informed. I know many residents have signed up and are getting these emails but if you are not, send your email information to our contact at Ameri-Tech Property Management – Laura Franzese at lfranzese@ameritechmail.com and she will add your information.

It has been brought to our attention that there are many homeowners that do not have a computer, cell phone or email address. If you are one of these homeowners, the Board suggests that you contact one of your neighbors that does have a computer and receives these communications and ask them to inform you of any communication from the Board that may affect them.





PARKING IN COMMON AREAS AND ON THE STREET

Ray Jablonski, Director

The rules which have been in place for several years for parking a vehicle in any of the BC1 common areas are as follows.

The East Clubhouse parking lot (the lot by the shuffleboard courts) of the clubhouse is for longer term parking 48 hours to 14 days maximum with permission of the board. Parking in the common areas of the BC Mart, and laundromat are for shorter term needs - 3 days max. When parking in the common areas the requirement is to put a visitor parking form, located by the board office in the clubhouse, on the car dashboard with your name and phone number where the owner, whether **resident or visitor**, can be reached if an emergency or other need arises and your car needs to be moved, for more in depth information please refer to the Briar Creek 1 Parking Policy. The common parking areas are for temporary parking. (Example if a resident is having work done on their house and the driveway cannot be used or they have visitors.) If a form is not on the dashboard of the vehicle the owner will be notified they are in violation of our policy and may be fined.

The amended and restated restrictions of Briar Creek Mobile Home Community 1, Condominium state that no vehicles are permitted to stand overnight in the street except for the purpose of preparing such vehicle for a trip within the following forty-eight (48) hours. Violators will be subject to our fining policy, which states that fines of \$100.00 per day up to a maximum of \$1,000.00 can and will be implemented. Please be considerate of your neighbors and thank you for your cooperation.

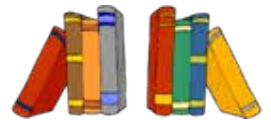

Google answers your health questions

- Trouble breathing

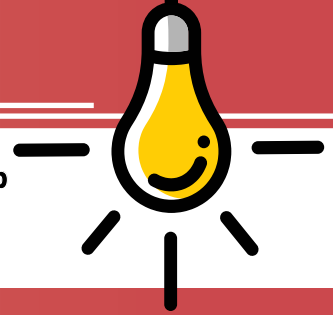

Admittedly there are some who have a hard time acclimating to having to follow rules in a Condo Association or HOA, after moving here from previous areas where there were no specific docs or rules to follow. Whatever the case, our community is the way it is because of these docs, and with your help it will continue to be. Please remember as you prepare your home to be vacant for the Summer to remove, or secure items outside your home so they don't become projectiles should severe weather move in.

Giving the access code to anyone that does not utilize the R/V Parking Area is in direct violation and can result in loss and privilege of using the R/V Parking Area. Before you begin any work on the exterior of your property - from a fresh coat of paint to a landscape overhaul or new paver patio - written board approval is required.

This helps ensure:

- **Property Value** - Consistent standards ensure our neighborhood remains attractive to future buyers, safeguarding your investment.
- **Avoiding Costly Mistakes** - Getting approval before starting prevents the stress and expense of having to undo work that doesn't meet community guidelines.
- **Fairness for All** - A formal process helps to ensure every neighbor is held to the same clear standards, preventing conflicts.

It is also important to stay within the scope of your approved request. We love seeing homeowners enhance their properties. However, several recent issues have arisen where projects have expanded beyond what was originally approved in the authorization letter. Please remember that the Board's approval applies only to the specific details (dimensions, materials, and colors) listed in your original request. Adding "extra" features or expanding the footprint of a patio during construction may void your approval. If you decide to change your plans mid-way through, please reach out first. It is much easier to approve an amendment on paper now than to ask you to remove a finished project that wasn't authorized.

Board Approval vs. Municipal Permits

It is equally important to remember that Board approval is not a building permit. While we review for community aesthetics, many projects, including, but not limited to: roofing, siding, concrete work, HVAC, patios, and tree removal all require permits from Safety Harbor and/or Pinellas County. It is the homeowner's (or contractor's) responsibility to check with local building departments. Failing to do so may lead to municipal fines or issues when you eventually try to sell your home.

Three Simple Steps for Outside Alterations

- **Submit your plan to the Board:** On your request form provide a written description and sketch of the area. List materials, dimensions, and provide color samples if applicable.
- **Get written Approval:** Wait for Board approval in writing.
- **Obtain Municipal Permits:** Once you receive your Board approval letter, check with local authorities (Safety Harbor) and acquire any necessary permits.

Along with the rest of the Board of Directors, I am here to be a resource for you. If you have any questions, just ask. Let's keep our community looking it's absolute best together.

ARTHRITIS

Dr. Marty Finkelstein

Well once you turn the age of forty and above you begin hearing the term arthritis. Sadly too often it is never explained and what preventive measures can be taken to prevent, reduce, restore, and live out a healthy life doing the things you love well into our nineties. Treating and helping my own patients for 40 years it was a common occurrence when a patient came in and said my doctor told me I have arthritis and it was just normal for aging, and nothing could be done for it other than taking medication for pain and inflammation. My first question was did your doctor explain what type of arthritis you have, and what stage your arthritis was in. 99 percent of the time their

eyes look like a deers caught in the headlights of an automobile. Sadly too often when it comes to the most important aspect of our life, our health, intelligent people do not ask questions or the right questions in the doctor's office. Yet here is why in this scenario it is so essential. Let's imagine you are 55 years old and told you have arthritis, and it's just part of aging, and not with a doctor who shares and explains what is necessary to change or alter in your lifestyle, guaranteed your arthritis is going to continue to get worse with ongoing loss of function and mobility.

So first what kind of arthritis do you have.

1. Degenerative Spinal Arthritis.

This most common arthritis mostly affecting the joints of the spine is usually associated with 4 specific stages. The cushions between the discs which act like a shock absorber, and allow separate motion between each vertebrae of the spine. Stage 1 because of wear and tear and basic activities of life that disc can begin to thin and narrow the space between vertebrae. In other words just gravity itself, has pressure overtime build up, regardless of any specific injuries. Stage 2 on an x-ray or MRI one can begin to observe further thinning and bulging of the disc. Stage 3 if this process continues a tear can occur, something that is usually referred to as an herniated disc which also can be distinguished by a mild, moderate, or severe tear. And Stage 4 is when someone has a major loss of function because of severe calcium buildup called spurs causing degrees of fusion along the spine. Pain in itself can manifest in any of these stages and actually more pain at times at Stage 1 and 2 because most folks are being more active where inflammation occurs pinching nerves. If you have known people who are immobile they are not usually in great pain because of the sedimentary life and a list of pain pills.

Rheumatoid Arthritis is an autoimmune disorder where the immune system is attacking the joints of the body. This arthritis is more complicated. It usually affects the midback, the neck, and the hands, and fingers. The sooner there is a proper diagnosis catching this early there is more opportunity to prevent it advancing to severe levels of loss of function.

3. Ankylosing Spondylitis is a chronic inflammatory disease causing vertebrae to fuse mostly in the lowback and sacro iliac joint.

All 3 of these types of arthritis can significantly affect one's lifestyle, yet the good news is besides taking medication for pain which does not prevent these problems from getting worse, we can begin to seek professional understanding of what Stage arthritis I have and what various therapies, exercises, changes in our relationship with food can assist our body preventing and even reversing the condition. Physical Therapists, and Chiropractors, are excellent in explaining what is going on and what you can begin to do as a lifestyle to have a life you are able to enjoy. Just this week someone I know who plays tennis and pickleball finally had an MRI taken of his knee after much prodding from me because of his complaining of pain. The good news was the Orthopedic doctor said everything was fine and gave him a cortisone shot. Well I asked him what did the MRI report say, he simply mentioned the doctor said nothing. Case in point unless



an MRI shows something of significance warranting surgery, your given a shot and sent home. I asked him to please send me the report, which he did. Well from the MRI doctor the report did reveal a minor lateral meniscus tear and early degeneration. So moral of the story if he begins the proper exercises now on a daily basis he can prevent these problems getting worse. If not it is guaranteed to get worse, and the Ortho will be eagerly waiting.

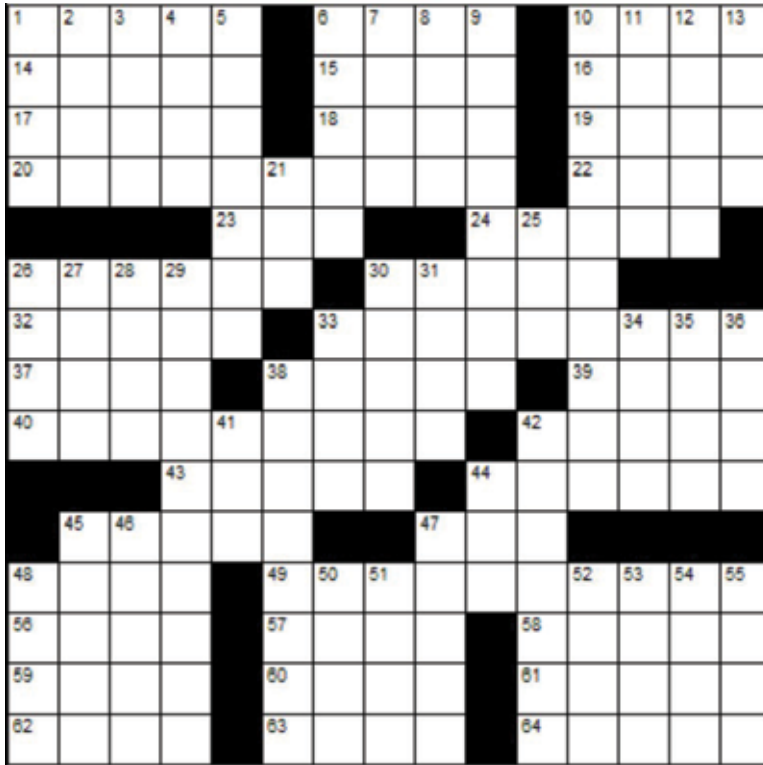

Get in the habit of good health
