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

FEDERAL PACIFIC ELECTRIC PANEL

Many of our homes have/had this type of electric panel inside our homes. This type of panel is known to have significant safety risks, including the potential for electrical fires due to faulty circuit breakers. The breakers used in these panels are known to have a high failure rate. You should look for the following labels on or inside your panel door: **“Federal Pacific Electric”** or **“Stab-Lok”**. There is a possibility that insurance may not cover damage caused by the failure of one of these breakers, since they no longer meet electrical codes. Replacement cost, for a new replacement box, may be in the range of \$1000 to \$2400.

As a side note, one of our residents tried to remove a malfunctioning breaker and found it had welded itself to the electric bus bar making it impossible to remove. Several years ago, when I had a breaker fail, I found that Home Depot had removed all replacement breakers for sale for this type of panel.





There are two interesting facts which may provide valuable insight and/or information to the resident population here in Briar Creek.

Sunstar EMT/Ambulance

Sunstar, the company that provides EMT and ambulance transport for Pinellas County, offers annual membership programs. In the event that your medical insurance provider does not cover the entire cost of medically necessary transportation for a patient to the hospital, if the patient has a membership with Sunstar, the copay costs will be covered.

An annual membership fee for a single person is \$89. A family membership is \$133. A typical emergency transport fee is \$1,037.

Music

Musicians, especially violinists, experience neuroplasticity engaging nearly every area of the brain all at once, leading to long-lasting cognitive improvements, stronger language and verbal skills, and spatial reasoning. Listening to music also has benefits for the brain. Studies have shown listening to classic music can improve memory, reduce stress, boost mental health, remove causes of depression and put a smile on your face. (classicfm.com)



Some may protest that classical music is “not their thing” but it may be worth giving it a listen to check out how you feel while listening. Or, listen to music that makes you feel good. . .makes you dance or brings back fond memories. Music, like everything, has different vibrations, beats and frequencies. Certain frequencies are suggested for different purposes. Google or Alexa can provide accurate information and suggestions. For example, listen to music/sounds to help with sleep at 528 Hz and healing at 432 Hz and 852 Hz. YouTube has a plethora of selections and choices for almost anything you might think about listening to. Most are free and will include the length of time a piece will play. Some do have ads (at completely different frequency) and can jolt one awake. Not all do.

On a personal note, and an advantage of living alone, I often select a piece to help me fall asleep. I have used selections to help me heal from various maladies. Does it work? I have to say, yes (for me). Will listening to music or sounds be helpful for you? Try it. It won’t hurt. Possibly help. The only way to know is to experience it for yourself. Perhaps give a listen during a nap.


