With all groups you need to register in advance. Once registered, some will contact you when an appointment is available. Others you need to check back frequently to see if new appointments have opened up. It is recommended that you register on multiple sites. However, if you get an appointment through one site, DO NOT double book an appointment through a different site. This could deprive another Florida resident from getting the vaccine. If you are married, each individual must register independently. Below is information on registering at the various sites:

FLORIDA STATE PATIENT PORTAL:

- Residents must first create an account at www.patientportalfl.com and then elect an available time. Creating an account does not guarantee availability for this round of appointments. There will be no vaccines for residents without appointments, and there is no waiting list.
- Patients must show proof of Florida residency to receive a vaccine. Examples include: a valid Florida Drivers License, state issued ID, deed, or utility bill with the patient's name and address. Part-time residents will be asked to provide part-time rental agreement.
- Those without internet access or who need assistance with the portal can call (844) 770-8548. The call center is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and can provide guidance in English and Spanish. Any resident with the ability to access the internet is strongly encouraged to use the online portal, as phone wait times can be lengthy.
- Notifications of new vaccine appointment openings in Pinellas will not be available through sign ups on the patient portal. Residents are asked to check the website, Facebook and Twitter for regular updates and future vaccine availability.
- Appointments will be scheduled at sites in various parts of the county. Details about access to the vaccine distribution sites will be given to residents upon appointment confirmation. Appointments for the required second dose can be made at the time of scheduling.

WINN DIXIE:

People who qualify can visit <u>WinnDixie.com</u>, for updates including vaccine availability details, participating store locations, and to conveniently schedule an appointment online, when available. The vaccines are free, with or without health insurance. People with health insurance must provide their health insurance card during their scheduled appointment, and people without insurance will need to present a valid driver's license or social security card.

PUBLIX:

To register and get further information go to <u>publix.com/covid-vaccine/florida</u>. These appointments are scheduled by county and will give you a list of available locations. The down side is, like other facilities, these book up very quickly and you may have to check back often before being able to register and get an appointment




FLEA MARKET NEWS!

FROM THE EDITORS – FEBRUARY 2021

s this is our first article of 2021, I'd like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a Happy New Year and our fervent wish that it will be a less stressful year for all of us. This is our first edition of the newsletter this year because we had taken a short break due to illness. I am so thankful for those who reached out to help make sure the newsletter contained some articles from Teakwood West, especially Barb from Monthly Media.

Thanks to everyone for their care and concern over the past few months. On October 24 at 10 minutes to 6 in the morning I woke to hear Al making horrible grunting noises. As he is subject to nightmares, I reached out to wake him and make the noise stop. My usual "kind" ministrations and rolling him onto his side made no difference and I soon realized this was not his nightmare but the beginning of mine!

I turned on a light and realized he was having some type of a seizure. I could not feel a pulse and he didn't respond to vigorous shaking or to me doing a sternal rub (making a fist and rubbing your knuckles across his sternum as hard as you can). Putting my head on his chest I could not hear a heartbeat either. I dialed 911 and started CPR. As an emerge nurse I have done CPR many times in the past – but NEVER to someone I love.

I am fortunate that I know how to administer CPR and that your brain goes into autopilot when something like this happens. I hauled him off the bed and onto the floor as I realized the mattress was too soft and gave all the needed info to the 911 operator. I didn't have my glasses on of course and couldn't see the phone to find the speaker button so I threw the phone down when I couldn't keep it on my shoulder any longer and just yelled really loud – that allowed me to do chest compressions much more effectively. I heard his ribs pop a couple of times so I knew my compressions were strong enough. He complained about sore ribs for weeks!

It seemed to take forever, but Fire arrived within 10 minutes with Paramedics close behind. We live in a secure building but Fire and EMS have access to a key for the outside door, I had to stop CPR long enough to open our apartment door but ran right back to start again. Fire and EMS took over his care on their arrival while I gathered up his meds and health card and moved furniture to give them more room. The Paramedics also gave him IV medications and shocked his heart once to get it restarted again. They then transported him to hospital, where he was intubated and put on a ventilator.

It took less than an hour from the time I found him till he arrived in the emergency department. Because we had no idea how long he was down prior to me starting CPR, and wanting to preserve brain function, he was placed in a cooling blanket and kept sedated for 48 hours.



On waking, Al was able to tell them who he was and identified both his daughter and I. What a relief! He remained in hospital for two weeks during which time he had a defibrillator implanted in his chest. Al has no recollection of any of these events – lucky for him – but also has no memory of almost a week in hospital.

He has had no further heart incidents and his defibrillator has not fired at all. He denies chest pain but does get short of breath easily. He has however been left with some minor memory issues – the seizure activity was likely caused by lack of oxygen to the brain. Most of this revolves around short term memory.

He is working with our local Brain Injury network to help cope with these issues. I have had many people say how lucky Al is that he had a nurse next to him in bed. While I recognize the truth in that statement, I feel that everyone could have the same advantage if we all knew how to do effective CPR. Cardiac arrest is reversible in most victims if treated within minutes.

Cardiac arrest differs from a heart attack in that it is an electrical problem where the heart malfunctions and suddenly stops which stops circulation to the rest of the body and without oxygen cells start to die. A heart attack is a circulation problem where blood flow to the heart is blocked but the heart continues to beat. Most heart attacks do not lead to cardiac arrest. If telling our story encourages even 1 person to learn CPR it is worth the telling. The important things to remember if someone is having a "cardiac arrest"

CALL 911

START CPR – if AED is available, use it but don't stop CPR to get one Push hard and push fast (to tune of Staying Alive) Breaking ribs is not unusual Do not stop till relieved by EMS/Fire.

If someone is having a heart attack:

Call 911

Chew 2 baby aspirin

never leave them alone

If you have never learned how to do CPR, it is never too late to learn.

Please, take a CPR course as soon as you are able, if you haven't had a refresher recently it's never too late. Doing something is so important, bystander CPR saves many lives every year and we are living proof it CAN happen. American and Canadian Heart Associations offer courses as do some colleges and local Paramedic services here in Ontario and I'm sure in other areas as well. We have decided to continue doing the Newsletter for now. If it becomes too much for us to cope with, we will at least be able to give more notice than previously. opefully this finds everyone well and thriving. The roll-out of the vaccines against Covid 19 are promising, especially in Florida. Here in Canada, the roll out has been very slow comparatively speaking. I'm also hearing that this vaccine may end up being like the flu vaccine where we will need a yearly booster. I hope not, but the variants of the disease are making it look likely. For now, we need to continue to wash our hands and socially distance including wearing masks to protect others, especially the most vulnerable populations.

If you have read last month's article you will know about Al's health issues. I am forever grateful to the fire response and paramedics who showed up and stabilized Al prior to his transfer to hospital. The medical staff were also incredible. Al has no recollection of the two weeks after his cardiac arrest.

Because of the interruption of blood flow to his brain he has been left with some minor issues. His brain injury has manifested as poor short term memory. He occasionally forgets phone calls or things like passwords etc. I would have thought that that would be very frustrating but he is handling it very well.

One of the things we have discovered through this process is the types of assistance that are available. Brain Injury Services is an organization that I had never heard of. They have supplied services such as an OT who visits regularly and is assisting with coping skills for Al. They also have peer support not only for the victim but for caregivers. There website has numerous articles for coping with all kinds of implications from brain injuries. It is a wonderful resource. We were fortunate to be hooked up with a social worker in hospital who gave us many resources and hooked us up with social work on an outpatient basis. The social workers assisted with the forms that need to be filled out for government assistance. Some of the medications they wanted to put him on would have cost over \$600/ month. If you are like us and have no benefits and like Al who is under 65 years old, that becomes a major lifestyle change!

I truly feel fortunate to live in a place that has such amazing resources.

We have been asked numerous times whether we will be able to return to travelling the way we used to. Because Al had a defibrillator implanted, the medical community assure us that "he is fixed". Now if the insurance companies feel the same way, we should be able to travel without having to sell our first born to pay for the insurance. Time will tell, we have to get him over the worst of his brain injury first. He has come a very long way since October and we realize that he will never go back to the way things were pre-injury. We appreciate the love and support of family friends and neighbors.

The point of my sharing this with you, is that often it is not just the event itself that is a game changer in life. Did I know we would be dealing with a brain injury? Absolutely not! If I, as a retired nurse was taken by surprise, it stands to reason that others also would not have this knowledge. We are always learning and this information is something we can all benefit from. God Bless and stay safe till we see one another again

RECIPES OF THE MONTH -FEBRUARY

Sandra Harrison

A

delicious winter meal, perfect for the colder weather of Feb. or for a Valentine's dinner. Serve with a salad & a loaf of crusty bread.

Belgian Beef Carbonnade

Makes 6 servings

- 3 Tbsp vegetable oil, divided
- 2 lb diced stewing beef, cut into 1 inch cubes (I used a boneless blade roast)
- 1/4 c flour
- Salt & pepper
- 1 med onion, peeled & diced
- 1 celery stalk, diced
- 2 med carrots, peeled & cut in 1/2 in slices
- 1/2 lb cremini mushrooms, quartered
- 2 tsp chopped fresh thyme
- 1 cup pitted prunes, cut in half (yes, prunes! They add a sweetness)

- 2 c low sodium beef stock
- 1 c dark beer, such as stout or porter (I only had Bud light & it was fine)
- 1 Tbsp packed brown sugar
- 1 Tbsp red wine vinegar



- 1. Preheat oven to 325F.
- 2. Place 1 1/2 Tbsp oil in a heavy-bottomed ovenproof med Dutch oven over med- high heat. In a bowl, toss the beef with the flour & season lightly with salt & pepper. Shake off & reserve any excess flour, add half the meat to the pan & brown for 2 3 min, until browned, & then transfer to a plate. Repeat with the remaining oil & beef. Set aside.
- 3. Reduce the heat to medium & place the onions, celery, carrots, mushrooms & thyme in the saucepan. Sauté the vegetables for about 5 min, until the onions are translucent. The moisture from the veggies will loosen any flour stuck in the pan. Add the reserved flour & stir for another minute.
- 4. Stir in the prunes & then the stock & beer & bring to a simmer. Once the liquid is simmering, reduce the heat to low. Cover the pan & cook in the oven for 90 min, or until the meat is tender but not falling apart. (Alternatively, you can simmer the stew gently over low heat on the stove for 90 min)
- 5. Immediately before serving, stir in the vinegar & sugar & season to taste.
- 6. You can serve this as you would a stew or over egg noodles.



In most cases, the demonstrators simply forgot why they were even there.

Officials considered a curfew starting at 9 p.m. but since that's the time when most of the residents go to bed anyway, it was decided that it wasn't needed.

Community leaders concluded that part of the problem was that residents were restless because they had too much time on their hands since the recreation centers, pools, theaters, boutique stores and especially the bars were closed due to the coronavirus.

Community officials wanted to form a committee to look further into the problem, but the next day no one could remember why they were meeting.
