Notes from the monthly meeting with ELS March 2021:







The US Sultana

The month of April 1865 gave the northern states a series of historical events. The Union Army won a series of battles that ended with the Army of Northern Virginia surrendering at Appomattox Courthouse on April 9, 1865. John Wilkes Booth assassinated President Lincoln at Ford Theater on the 14th of April. Then Booth was later cornered and killed on the 26th of April and General Johnston formalized his surrender to General Sherman on the same date. These events however overshadowed one of the war's saddest moments that became the worst maritime disaster in American history.



The Sultana was a side-wheel, Mississippi River steamboat constructed of wood by the John Litherbury Boatyard in Cincinnati, Ohio in 1863. It was 260 ft. long, with a 42 ft. beam, four decks including pilothouse capable of carrying 376 passengers and cargo, with a crew of 85. It usually ran a route between St. Louis and New Orleans but was frequently commissioned to carry troops.

On a trip to New Orleans the Sultana stopped at Vicksburg, Mississippi where Captain Mason was approached by Colonel Hatch, the chief quartermaster, with a proposition. The government was willing to pay \$2.75 per soldier and \$8.00 per officer, other reference sources stated \$5 per enlisted and \$10 per officer, to any steamboat captain that would take a group of released prisoners to the North. The colonel, seeking a kickback, promised a packed boat. The captain desiring to make a substantial amount of money agreed to the deal. He would pick up his promised passengers on his return from New Orleans.

On the return to Vicksburg one of the boilers sprang a leak about 10 hours south of Vicksburg. The vessel limped into port for repair and to unload cargo. Captain Mason, after being informed of the extent of the repair, did not desire to wait to make the proper repair. He could lose his precious cargo of prisoners to other boats during that time. He and his chief engineer convinced the hired mechanic to make temporary repairs. The reluctant mechanic hammered back the bulging boiler plate and riveted a thinner steel patch over the seam. Instead of 2 - 3 days, the repair could take place during the time spent in port unloading cargo and loading the paroled prisoners.

The passengers, paroled Union soldiers from Confederate prison camps, came from camp Cahaba, near Selma, Alabama, and Andersonville, in southwestern Georgia. They were primarily from Ohio, Michigan, Kentucky, Tennessee, and West Virginia and physically weakened from their stay in these camps. The vessel became so overloaded that thick wooden beams were used to help reinforce the decks to support the added weight.

The Sultana spent the next two days fighting the fast current of one of the worst spring floods in the river's history. On April 26, Sultana stopped in Helena, Arkansas where the photograph above was taken by Thomas Bankes showing the grossly overcrowded vessel. Later around 7:00 p.m. Sultana reached Memphis and unloaded its cargo of sugar and possibly about 200 men. She then left, heading north to meet some coal barges a short distance upriver. At around 1:00 a.m., after receiving more coal for their journey the Sultana headed north once again, at approximately 2:00 a.m., just seven miles north of Memphis, the first boiler exploded, quickly followed by the explosions of two more.

The explosion went upward though the crowded decks destroying the pilothouse and throwing pieces of the vessel skyward. One smokestack fell into the gaping hole created by the explosion. The other stack fell forward onto the crowded deck upper deck. The upper deck then collapsed into the exposed furnace boxes. The collapsed deck soon caught fire turning the vessel into an inferno. One paddle wheel fell into the water and when the vessel turned sideways the remaining paddle wheel fell into the water. Survivors leaped into the water to escape the intense flames. In their weaken state however they soon began to cling to one another or anything afloat, to help them fight against the cold, strong current of the Mississippi. Whole groups of exhausted soldiers went under together.

At around 3:00 a.m. the southbound vessel Bostona arrived on the scene and recued many survivors. Others drifted down to Memphis and yelled for help as they drifted by the waterfront. People along the waterfront saved as many as possible. However, bodies were still pulled from the river for months afterwards and many never recovered. The burning remains of the Sultana drifted down river about six miles and sank off the West bank of the Mississippi at around 9:00 a.m.

The normal passenger capacity of the boat was 376. It was carrying approx. 2,150 passengers with some references listing totals as high 2,500, more than six times legal capacity. Most of Sultana's officers and Captain Mason perished. Early estimated casualty counts ranged from 1100 to approx. 1260, some reference materials say as high as 1800. The official count by the US Customs Service is 1547 casualties, making the sinking of the Sultana the worst maritime disaster in American history.

The exact cause of the explosion is not known. Theories of sabotage have been proposed but discounted. The more plausible theories were exceeding recommended boiler pressures to compensate for the river current. Stress fractures in the boiler plate steel due to repeated heating and cooling cycles contributed to the failure. The official cause was determined to be mismanagement of boiler water levels, faulty boiler repair and severe overcrowding.

The ultimate decision to overload the Sultana was Captain Mason's. However, he perished in the explosion. Captain Hatch, the chief quartermaster of Vicksburg, was also blamed for overcrowding the vessel. He had a history of corruption and incompetence but was a competent thief. He had swindled the government out thousands of dollars and with his political connections however, always managed to deflect military charges. After the disaster he refused, on three different occasions, to appear before a trial to give testimony. He died in 1871, escaping any consequences of the Sultana disaster.

The war had for all practical intents and purposes ended almost three weeks earlier. These soldiers had survived the war. Many if not most had been prisoners of war, some came from one of the darkest prison camps in the south, Andersonville. They were so close, just days away from seeing their loved ones, from being able to live the remainder of their lives in relative piece.

There are many historical events that are deemed not relevant or worthy to mention and fade into obscurity. To keep this story from fading away, the city of Marion, Arkansas has created a temporary museum near City Hall to tell the story. On display are pictures, personal items from soldiers, pieces of the Sultana, and a 14-foot replica of the unfortunate steamboat.

On Memorial Day we pay homage to those who lost their lives in wars our country has fought. Lost in the day's observance is the fact that Memorial Day, originally Decoration Day, was created to remember those lives lost in the Civil War. On Memorial Day, in cemeteries that have memorials commemorating the Sultana disaster, you may see a history buff, re-enactor or a group of Civil War re-enactors standing by the lone memorial in silence. Thinking of the sad irony, that these soldiers survived a terrible war only to senselessly lose their lives on the way home.


