Neighbors are helping neighbors by giving them rides to their appointments when needed. We are all in this together. Thank you again Susan for your help, time and patience. It was much appreciated.

As I have said throughout the season, residents are getting projects done both inside their homes and outside their homes. Our men, who have worked on cleaning out the ditch and trimming or cutting down diseased queen palms, are still on those jobs and have also tackled some new projects. They have become so efficient that on a given day the team can split up and tackle two or more jobs at once.

At the same time, the brick edging around the garden at our entrance was also refreshed with a new coat of paint. Our entrance looks welcoming. Thanks go out to Ron Martin, Rick Martin, Doug Sutton, Joe Brodzinski, Rex Pranger, Darby Boyd, Keith Brogan and Bob Martin for their work.

For many days, you would see different piles of brush out by the roadway near the beginning of Michigan. Our men kept working their way down toward our clubhouse cleaning up the space between our property and Deerfield's. Thanks go to Rob Bocchinfuso, Dale Lenss, Greg Huettig, Pete Spangler, and Doug Sutton for their hard work.

As I said back in September, Scott from JSS Construction had promised to bring in four loads of dirt to continue to fill in the ditch. He was successful in finding dirt in Florida and brought two loads at the end of February. He encountered some wet ground and found himself and his bobcat stuck in the mud when he was trying to spread out the two loads of dirt in Nick and Michelle's backyard on Michigan. Bob Bulmer took pictures of all of the action and the huge vehicle that came through our park to give assistance. Later, in March, Scott came back and emptied two more loads of dirt which added to the half load of dirt still on the ground from the first drop off and there it all sits on the grass between #12 and #11.

time making sure no duck succumbed. Those first five ducks would then sit on the edge of the pool watching their cousins continue to race. All 200 ducks were gathered in a pearly white basket and thrown into the pool. Hoses came on, cannonballs dropped and the race was on. Strays were gotten away from the edges of the pool by the hose workers. As the ducks got closer and closer to the floating silver hoop, this was the point where the spotters were so important. Snatching the first five ducks out of the winners circle. What a race. This was repeated nine more times with the excitement

of the sponsors growing. The 10 heats were completed and the 50 winners were on the side of

the pool drying and fluffing their feathers. The 150 losers were exhausted. Some were upside down completely worn out. It would have to be another year, maybe next year, for them to mature, develop their muscles and try out again. Maybe, just maybe, next year would be better. All sponsors of the 50 winning ducks got their \$5 back. These 50 ducks were gathered into the pearly white basket and the race was on. Hoses fired up, cannonballs dropped and the sponsors called out their support. The spotters had to be



keen eyed and had to call out in order of getting into the silver hoop the winners, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 5th. Those winners were shouted out by Rita to Rex who recorded on the big chart. Ingrid and Dennis shouted out the



winning sponsors. First round done. The 45 ducks still anxious to show their stuff got into the pearly white basket. The second final was about to begin. His stories would go on for awhile and you would take it all in, sometimes laughing so hard you would cry.

Our men work hard no matter what year you are talking about. Gene was part of the crew that helped make the entrance island garden basically what it looks like today. Linc, Butch, Mike (Michelle's father), Lyle, (sorry can't remember the fellows name), Ken and Gene worked



hard on that project.

All year rounders are special folk who look after the park when you all leave. Gene was a good neighbor. Last summer, when some of us thought that Bill Lawrence's railing at his side entrance was broken by vandals, Gene investigated and found that the screws holding the railing to the side walkway were completely rusted out. 


