'Everything you love will be lost'

riter Franz Kafka (1883–1924) never married and had no children. According to a story, he liked to walk through a park in Berlin where one day he met a girl who was crying because she had lost her favorite doll. She and Kafka searched for the doll unsuccessfully.

Kafka told her to meet him there the next day and they would come back to look for her. The next day, when they had not yet found the doll, Kafka gave the girl a letter "written" by the doll saying, "Please don't cry. I took a trip to see the world. I will write to you about my adventures."

Thus began a story which continued until the end of Kafka's life.

During their meetings, Kafka read the letters of the doll, carefully written with adventures and conversations that the girl found adorable.

Finally, Kafka bought another doll and gave it to the girl. "It doesn't look like my doll at all," said the girl.

Kafka handed her another letter in which the doll wrote: "My travels have changed me." The little girl hugged the new doll and carried it home.

A year later Kafka died.

Many years afterward, the now-adult girl found a letter inside the doll. In the tiny letter, signed by Kafka, was written: "Everything you love will probably be lost, but in the end, love will return in another way."

So no aliens, but still a fascinating phenomenon for scientists to study.

Here's the thing—you don't need a captive audience to be heard. You need better true stories, well told. You don't have to rely on luck to tell better stories, you can do it with intention and practice—by design. You don't need permission to take the stage. You need to find and practice telling stories that matter.

Decoration Day became Memorial Day officially in 1967. In 1968 the Uniform Holidays Act established it as one of three holidays (including Veteran's Day and George Washington's birthday, now called President's Day) celebrated on a Monday to

create a convenient three-day weekend. Memorial Day is now observed on the last Monday in May.



Keep the fog out

e'll probably be wearing masks to protect ourselves from the coronavirus for at least a few more months, and one problem masks present for people who wear glasses is fogging. Masks cause the warm air of your breath to rise up, creating fog when it hits the cooler air above. The New York Times offers this advice for keeping your vision clear:

- Get the right fit. Look for a mask with an adjustable nose-bridge wire, which can limit how much warm air rises up to meet your lenses.
- Use tape. You can use paper tape to secure the upper part of the mask to your face, like doctors do.
- **Protect your lenses.** Apply a little baby shampoo or hand soap to your lenses. This can reduce the surface tension of water molecules, stopping moisture from becoming fog.
- Use antifog spray. Just don't use a spray containing alcohol, which can damage lenses. Also, sprays may not work on glasses with antireflective coating.


