EDITOR'S CORNER: MEMORIAL DAY IS MAY 31. At 3 p.m., STOP TO REMEMBER

A arking Memorial Day as a national day of mourning began after the Civil War. It was called Decoration Day in 1868, because people decorated the graves of those who died during the war. In the Civil War, more than 500,000 are said to have been killed. It is reported that 7,000 died in one battle – the three-day campaign at Gettysburg. In all the wars involving Americans, an estimated 1.2 million died.

The first national celebration of Decoration Day took place May 30, 1868, at Arlington National Cemetery, where both Confederate and Union soldiers were buried.


The National Moment of Remembrance, created in 2000 by the U.S. Congress, encourages all Americans to pause wherever they are at 3 p.m. local time on Memorial Day for a minute of silence to remember and honor those who have died in service to the nation. This year, Memorial Day will be commemorated on Monday, May 31. At Palm Hill, a program and picnic are scheduled. May 15 is Peace Officers Memorial Day. Begun in 1961 and held during National Police Week, May 15 honors all local, state, national and federal officers who died or were disabled in the line of duty.

As I searched for quotes about Memorial Day, one quote by an unknown author spoke directly for those who gave the ultimate sacrifice, and for their loved ones who had to go on without them.

"Our flag does not fly because the wind moves it.

It flies with the last breath of each soldier who died protecting it."

We hear the expression "we are all volunteers "during conversations within Palm Hill, and wonder who are these volunteers, why do they volunteer, what's in it for them, and why would I put my name forward to become one of "those".

My name is Ruth Butler, and I was asked to put pen to paper on those topics. With modesty, here is my story.

My journey into the realm of volunteering in Palm Hill started out from business practicality. I qualified as a Pilates instructor in Canada and when joining the Palm Hill community, I wanted to look after my own fitness by continuing with Pilates activities. A light bulb oh-no awareness made me realize I could not start a business in Palm Hill, and would be hounded by the IRS if I charged for my services. So, I volunteered, continued with my own "keeping fit" regime and provided a service to others. So, my reasons could be qualified as being selfish reasons.

Not for me I thought. So, when I was asked if I would be willing to take my teaching acumen and put it together with country music, and I said yes, then suddenly I was the line dance Instructor. Let me tell you I have had many hours of scrambling around YouTube to find dances suitable for our community, but with the huge support of my husband who acts as my DJ, I now savor that weekly line dance activity. My only hesitation is that I feel we as line dancers unintentionally swarm dances with our line activities, so I am always open to any suggestions on how to balance line dancing with more traditional dance floor activities. So, again, this all stems from a personal life need, and in so doing includes my husband which helps to physically and psychologically balance our relationship.

UPDATES ON COVID RESTRICTIONS AT PALM HILL (Detailed updates are also on the website: www.palmhillcountryclub.net. Go to Home Page, then HOPH Information page.

REMINDER: CLUBHOUSES REOPENED WITH RESTRICTIONS: As of March 8, the Clubhouses were reopened with restrictions. The following activities were reinstated: Bingo, coffees, use of libraries, billiards rooms and laundry facilities.

Sign-ins, masks and six-foot social distancing are required to access Clubhouses and amenities. use key fobs to access. Fifty-person limit at Coffees and Bingos.

No visitors/guests are allowed at Coffees or Bingo until further notice.

The Palm Hill Covid Restrictions Updates as of March 8 – sent out by email and posted on Palm Hill television channel 732 – should be consulted by all unit owners who are or will be in residence and unit owners should pass them on to anyone renting their residences. The updated restrictions, new clubhouse and activities hours and rules are posted on the Palm Hill website – palmhillcountryclub.net. Look on Home Page under Quick Links on left; click on Covid Protocols and Guidelines.

Also, as of March 8, restricted hours for guests at the pools, shuffle courts and tennis courts were eliminated, but restricted seating and social distancing continues to apply. Sign-in at the

It is anticipated that measures requiring mask wearing in public, limiting gatherings to 10 or fewer in common areas, six-foot social distancing, as well as the updated restrictions for use of facilities and common spaces at Palm Hill, will be in effect for the next several months, given the continuing spread of the Covid virus. Use of common space requires advance approval from Office.

Board and committee meetings are being held via ZOOM technology, allowing remote attendance by shareholders and board members.

For example, the ad for ASC, Aluminum Specialty Contractors, Inc., has this on its right side: a square shaded box with the number 26, a star below that, and a shaded circle with the number 29 below the circle. Some ads have those codes in other locations in their ads.

Square Box number means ASC has been advertising in the LINK for 26 years.

The star means the publisher has not received any complaints about that company.

The circle with the number 29 means that's how long ASC has been in business.

The rest of the ad also includes the company's license number whether they are insured, and list their website and phone number along with other messages. Some include coupons.

If there are no squares, stars or circles, that means the advertiser is new to the LINK. A company has to advertise for a year to get that first square with a number.

The ads tell you a lot more than you see at first glance.

VISITING FAMILY MEMBERS AND GUESTS:

- MUST REGISTER with the office with photo i.d. (ex. driver's license or passport) before they can make use of any park amenity.
- GUEST BADGES: must have and display their guest badges when using any amenity (as permitted re. restrictions as noted in guidelines).

POOLS:

Hours at both North and South pools for residents and families or guests are the same:

Number of people allowed in pool areas is limited. Please check signs at each pool and spa and numbers of people present before using facility. Residents have priority use if the pool numbers hit maximum. Sign-in is required.

Pool area users may bring their own chairs. A limited number of chairs and loungers will be available and spaced to comply with the social distancing requirement of six (6) feet. Chairs and loungers should not be moved. Residents and guests should bring a towel to sit on and should sanitize any common use furniture before and after use.

CAPACITY

Follow the posted capacity (number of people permitted in pool areas).

Daily sign-in sheets are required to be filled out.

Residents enjoy priority of use as compared to visiting family members and/or guests in the event pool capacity limits is reached.

NORTH LAUNDRY

The North laundry will be accessible between 8:30 a.m.to 8 p.m. daily.

Access is by key fob. Sign-in sheets will be used and residents are required to sanitize folding table surfaces before and after use. Note: The north laundry may be closed for repairs and remodeling at some time in the near future.

CORONAVIRUS UPDATES/RESOURCES:

COVID VACCINE ALERT: PHONE SCAMS: The State Attorney General's office has issued warnings about vaccine phone scams.

Beware of phone calls that come in on your phone as "Florida Vaccine Center" or "Fl Vaccine Center" even if it appears to be from a Florida exchange.

Check the veracity of any unexpected phone call. If in doubt, ask for the name of the agency calling so you can call back independently, and ask for the name of the caller's supervisor. Do not provide personal info. Phone scammers/impersonators try to get you to say the word YES in the beginning of the conversation, and then record your voice for possible use later. A common initial question is: Can you hear me? Do not answer with the word yes. Instead, begin asking questions to verify their identity, or just hang up.

HOMEBOUND RESIDENTS can let the Florida Department of Emergency Management (FDEM) know they are in need by emailing HomeboundVaccine@em.myflorida.com. FDEM will send them a survey and then work with DOH strike teams to deliver vaccines.

FDEM is working on writing up more information for how this program will work and will provide information to counties when complete.


