EDITOR'S CORNER GOOD WORKS: VOLUNTEERING AT PALM HILL

n April, volunteers across the country are recognized during National Volunteer Week/Month.

Here in Palm Hill, the spirit of volunteerism

makes our world go round.

Within the pages of the April and May LINKS,

you will read stories from and about Palm Hill residents who volunteer here or for whom volunteering has been a way of life. Some of the stories are from relatively recent arrivals to Palm Hill who are getting to know their neighbors through volunteering, and some are from long-timers. One story is about a husband and wife who have been volunteering here for more than 38 years!

The Palm Hill board is composed of nine (9) volunteers who commit a minimum of three years to work with each other and the management team, leading the legal corporation of which we are all shareholders – the Home Owners of Palm Hill, Inc. We are as large as some small towns in the United States, with 1,100 homes and more than 1,700 residents.

Fifty-seven names are on the lists for the ten (10) standing committees that help manage and maintain Palm Hill and its business. But it may be that hundreds of others step up to volunteer at Palm Hill events and activities or contribute behind-the-scenes volunteer work for others. Just following the Golden Rule.

Volunteers sometimes say they get more out of the work then they give. National Volunteer Week is a great time to say "thank you" to those in Palm Hill who volunteer their time, skills, care and concern to watch out for others and to keep Palm Hill a vibrant and unique community. Another way to say thanks is to join them.

If you are inspired by the stores, talk to those who organize the various events or activities (which are gradually resuming), or let a committee chair or board member know of your interest to help out.

PICK YOUR PASSION

Volunteering can be a one-off activity, like putting up/taking down holiday decorations. Individuals launched the annual Christmas Golf Cart Parade, created traditions like the Valentine's Day Dance or the biannual New Year's Ball, which can take a small army of volunteers to produce. They plan and organize Memorial Day and Veterans Day honor and remembrance events. They organize golf events and charity tournaments (pre-Covid). They

plan and organize the Halloween Costume Party and the Kentucky Derby Party. They lead exercise classes in water and on land. Events and opportunities are announced at the coffees or listed on bulletin boards at both clubhouses. The coffees are also organized by volunteers.

They plan and recruit others to help produce the annual Casino Night, dinner events and the book club. Volunteers run the two Palm Hill libraries. Volunteers manage our helping services, offering medical equipment for loan, conducting food drives or fund drives for hospice, making calls to people who live alone, helping residents get rides to medical appointments. Volunteers walk their neighborhoods, delivering the monthly LINK.

Residents help each other individually and quietly – assisting the family of a resident who passes away, helping put down shutters to weather a coming storm or assisting neighbors pick

up after hurricane damage.

Volunteers lend their skills to manage the website, to enable ZOOM meetings and widespread communications through our Webmaster email blasts, TV station Ch. 732 or the LINK. They collect donated furniture for sale in the Palm Hill Bazaar. Prior to the Covid restrictions, they cooked meals and held potluck dinners or organized Bingo and a myriad of activities for like-minded Palm Hillers.

Sometimes people get inspired situationally to tackle a project or step up to fill a need, such as manning the golf pro shop during the former manager's illness, leading a Palm Hill improvement or beautification project. Big things or one-project jobs, Palm Hillers step up when help is needed.

And it is amazing to say – the list above does not cover all the acts of concern and caring that happen every day throughout Palm Hill.

One way to learn about Palm Hill and get involved as a volunteer is to attend the committee meetings. The committees are made up of volunteers who take personal responsibility to monitor the maintenance and constant improvements that affect the quality of life here: Building and Grounds, Communications, Finance, Golf, Planning and Environment, Real Estate, Rules and Regulations. (Information on the committees is on the Palm Hill website (www. palmhillcountryclub.net; go to Members section, then choose Committees of Palm Hill.) Be alert for the emails about upcoming committee meetings, now being held via ZOOM.

Instructions on how to attend the meetings are embedded in email ZOOM invitations. Anyone whose email is registered on the website should get those invitations. And "attending" is possible at any time because the ZOOM meeting recordings are posted on the Palm Hill website.

Meeting notices, events and activities are also posted on Channel 732 and on the website. Volunteers will be featured in this LINK and again next month, in the May LINK.




a sign, creating a puzzle pop-up. Word got out.


MARY AND HERB LESLIE, 33 Years of Volunteering at Palm Hill

uestion is? Why does one want to, or even care to, volunteer. In most cases we find that organizations such as Palm Hill rely on folks helping to provide services that we as homeowners want to enjoy. Same is true with many other organizations that could not continue without the assistance of volunteers.



Fortunately, I have been able to volunteer in many different positions because of several reasons. First, because there was a requested need to assist the organization. ISCAL YEAR BUDGET APPROVED; NEW MONTHLY FEES: The new fiscal year began April 1, and shareholders will notice their monthly fees will increase to \$396. The Board approved the \$5.3 million budget at its meeting March 22. The increase works out to \$4,752 per household for April 1 through March 2022.

The monthly fee covers: personnel, mowing, trash and recycling pickup, water and sewer, cable and internet, common grounds and facilities management, maintenance and upkeep, Park management services, governance costs, taxes, insurance and rent to Park owner as well as a contribution to building the Reserve account. Copies of the budget are available by request at the Office.

IN OTHER BOARD ACTION at the March 22 meeting:

The Board voted to:

- initiate payment for current Park insurance bill
- move forward with electronic voting for the 2022 election,
- initiate a new flea treatment program this summer to treat all homeowner lots in Palm Hill. This will supplement flea treatment now being done on a regular basis on Palm Hill common areas,
- install metal-topped shelters at the sanitation area to shield workers and volunteers from the sun and bad weather.
- appoint a standing committee, the Compliance Committee, that will serve as an appeals committee when the Park issues citations/and/or fines to homeowners for violating Palm Hill rules and regulations.

Also, as of March 8, restricted hours for guests at the pools, shuffle courts and tennis courts were eliminated, but restricted seating and social distancing continues to apply. CAPACITY

Adhere to posted capacity (number of people permitted in pool areas).

Daily sign-in sheets are required to be filled out.

Residents enjoy priority of use as compared to visiting family members and/or guests in the event pool capacities are being filled.

NORTH LAUNDRY

The North laundry will be accessible between 8:30 a.m.to 8 p.m. daily.

Access is by key fob. Sign-in sheets will be used and residents are required to sanitize folding table surfaces before and after use. Note: The north laundry may be closed for repairs and remodeling at some time in the near future.

CORONAVIRUS UPDATES/RESOURCES:

OVID VACCINE ALERT: PHONE SCAMS: The State Attorney General's office has issued warnings about vaccine phone scams.

Beware of phone calls that come in on your phone as "Florida Vaccine Center" or "Fl Vaccine Center" even if it appears to be from a Florida exchange.

Check the veracity of any unexpected phone call. If in doubt, ask for the name of the agency calling so you can call back independently, and ask for the name of the caller's supervisor. Do not provide personal info. Phone scammers/impersonators try to get you to say the word YES in the beginning of the conversation, and then record your voice for possible use later. A common initial question is: Can you hear me? Do not answer with the word yes. Instead, begin asking questions to verify their identity, or just hang up.

AGÉ RESTRICTIONS ARE LOWERING FOR VACCINE ELIGIBILITY

As of the April LINK deadline, age restrictions on vaccines are lowering in some parts of Florida. In addition, the Veterans Administration, Publix, and some health organizations are distributing vaccines to patients, and in some cases, patient's spouses, in addition to those 65 and older.

Latest eligibility information, as of March 19, 2021: www.floridahealthcovid19.gov
As of March 19, 2021: Note: These Florida residents are now eligible to register for the vaccine at www.patientportalFL.com:

- Anyone 60 and older, (with proof of age; 50+ eligible on March 22)
- eligible health care workers 18+ (with ID),
- 50 and older sworn law enforcement, firefighters and K-12 school staff (with ID).
- Medically vulnerable residents with a physician form

Teachers under the age of 50 may schedule their vaccine appointment at Publix, CVS, Walmart or Sam's Club, or may go to the Federal Vaccination Site at the Tampa Greyhound Track.

Vaccine supply is limited, and you must be a full-time or part-time resident to be vaccinated in Florida.

Homebound residents can let the Florida Department of Emergency Management (FDEM) know they are in need by emailing HomeboundVaccine@em.myflorida.com. FDEM will send them a survey and then work with DOH strike teams to deliver vaccines.






