

olunteering has been something I have done most of my life. My current volunteer position is North Librarian. I had offered to help Sue Bolton a few days. That evolved into becoming assistant librarian, then librarian. I enjoy organizing and arranging things so it is a good fit. One resident remarked, "That must be the most boring job in the world." I think it is fun!

Volunteering can be fun, hard work, and rewarding. I was the second woman on the Washington (Illinois) Fire Department Rescue Squad in the 70s and 80s. We were on call 24/7, ready to drop what we were doing to rush to answer the call. We handled medical calls, accidents, fires, storm watches and many other things.

Many times, volunteering begins with small things. I have learned that God often works that way in our lives. I volunteered to help pack suitcases of donated clothing for six women from Russia who were attending a Woman's Aglow International Conference held in Orlando. Following that, Ben and I were invited to attend the Eastern European Aglow Conference in Prague. From there, we went to Krasnoyarsk, Siberia, to meet with and teach at the first Aglow group in Russia. For the next nine years we spent three months each year teaching in Krasnoyarsk, and other Russian cities. God is faithful to lead and protect us as we step out into new things.

This experience brought home to me how incredibly fortunate I am and what a blessing it is to be able to share resources,

My love of travel has taken me to South Africa, South America, Cuba and so many other places where I have tried to link with people in local communities, learning about their cultures and just how much more we have than most of the world. We often need a translator in other parts of the world but

wherever I have gone people are truly appreciative of our help and were very friendly.

At home I have always served on community and church boards and tried to help where needed. In Palm Hill I have been an active volunteer since my arrival in 2008.





THINKING OF VOLUNTEERING?

Here is a Check List to help you decide.

- 2. Think about what you are passionate about. Consider the various components of your passion and identify the factors that are most important to you. A few examples: Sports, home improvement, health/medical, education, music, sewing, crafts, law, dance, exercise, religion, cooking, visiting, beautification, gardening and organizing (just to mention a few), and then research to see if there is a committee or if you need to form one.
- 3. Refer to the listing of committees you considered. Find a committee or committees that is/are interesting to you and where you feel you can add the most value. If there is a gap and you have a passion to create something new, then take steps to do so. An example, if your goal is to volunteer for a health/medical cause then you would research the need and find others with like minds and opposite perspectives. This will help you create a well-rounded volunteer cause. It is important you do your research and don't give up.
- **4. Begin your research.** For a new cause, conduct preliminary research by finding the need and complete a needs assessment. For an existing committee, research what they are currently doing and what success and/or struggles they have they had in the past.
- **5.** Narrow your list. Figure out the top two-to-four volunteer opportunities. If you don't find any groups that meet your specifications, you may want to broaden your search by focusing on one or two primary factors to analyze a committee's cause.
- **6.** Create a list of questions. Based on any questions you have from your research, your personal values, and any special needs, create a list of questions for the committee you wish to volunteer for. Get to know them before you commit.
- 7. Contact the committee chairperson and committee members to ask your questions. These days, email may be the best way to communicate. Ask your questions and request contact information for further discussion. Ask them hard questions about their experiences and committee.
- **8.** Choose. Select the committee that matches your interests and aspirations most closely and begin the volunteer process. Decide if you want to be a team player or do you want to take a leadership role with the committee. Let the committee know what type of role you would like to play.
- **9. Manage your time.** Realize once you start volunteering, you are going to feel energized and will want to spend time with the committee. You will need to set your goals including the amount of time you would like to volunteer. Don't over promise what you can do.
- **10. Commitment:** Once you commit, participate. The residents of Palm Hill are depending on you.





Email Survey Tentatively Set for June

id you know that studies have reported that 10 percent of the world's population has a disability and this doubles to 20 percent for those who are aged 70 or older and increases to 50 percent for those aged 85 and older? Seniors and elders are also more prone to loneliness and mental health issues.

The resident responses to the survey will guide the Committee in its recommendations to the Board of Directors.

- •A Wellness Support Hub is defined as any indoor area and/or space where Wellness activities take place.

MANAGER'S CORNER: PREPARE FOR HURRICANE SEASON JUNE TO NOVEMBER

URRICANE SEASON STARTS JUNE 1 and runs through November 30. It is time to plan what you will do if a hurricane is forecast to hit the Tampa Bay area. If an evacuation order is issued, Palm Hill is a mandatory evacuation zone as are all mobile home communities.

Should you choose to remain in the park and need medical or emergency assistance, the authorities will not respond as they will be dealing with other emergencies and you should have heeded the evacuation order. The nearest shelter is Largo High School at 410 Missouri Avenue North; this is a pet friendly shelter but will probably fill up quickly. The two Clubhouses here in Palm Hill are not rated as hurricane shelters and therefore cannot be used by residents as a shelter.

Due to liability issues both Clubhouses will be locked down when an evacuation order is issued. Please ensure that your gutters are cleaned out and any pots, chairs, planters or anything that may become airborne are stored either in the shed or inside the home.

Maintenance is responsible for ensuring that the common areas are secured, and, if time allows, we will pick up items that were not stored and remove them to the sanitation field.



n June 14, 1877, the first Flag Day observance was held on the 100th anniversary of the adoption of the Stars and Stripes. As instructed by Congress, the U.S. flag was flown from all public buildings across the country. In the years after the first Flag Day, several states continued to observe the anniversary, and in 1949 Congress officially designated June 14 as Flag Day, a national day of observance.

DID YOU KNOW?

• When the flag is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem, it should be destroyed in a dignified and ceremonious fashion, preferably by burning.

• Most American Legion posts will conduct an annual ceremony, often on Flag Day (June 14) to retire old or worn flags; contact your local chapter if you are not able to dispose of the flag yourself. You could also ask your local Boy Scouts or Girl Scouts troops about retiring your flag.



odes in advertising in the LINK tell you how long the companies or vendors have been advertising in the LINK. A boxed star tells the reader that the publisher, / Monthly Media, has not received any complaints about that business.

For example, the ad for ASC, Aluminum Specialty Contractors, Inc., has this on its right side: a square shaded box with the number 26, a star below that, and a shaded circle with the number 29 below the circle. Some ads have those codes in other locations in their ads.

Square Box number means ASC has been advertising in the LINK for 26 years.

The star means the publisher has not received any complaints about that company. The circle with the number 29 means that's how long ASC has been in business.

The rest of the ad also includes the company's license number whether they are insured, and list their website and phone number along with other messages. Some include coupons.

If there are no squares, stars or circles, that means the advertiser is new to the LINK. A company has to advertise for a year to get that first square with a number.

The ads tell you a lot more than you see at first glance.


