
GATEWAY NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

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

EARLY BIRD DINNER THEATRE UPDATES



Parking in Vacant Lots or Empty Driveways- We are not supposed to be parking on empty slabs or vacant lots, you are taking a chance of getting towed. DO NOT PARK IN DRIVEWAYS THAT BELONG TO THE PARK-YOU WILL BE TOWED. I have recently had some residents calling my office because of arguments with their neighbors about parking in abandoned homes driveways. (WE ARE SUPPOSED TO PARK IN OUR OWN DRIVEWAYS ONLY- If you park in a residents driveway you must have written permission).

Keep in mind that most all residents who go away for a short while or even extended periods usually make arrangements with friends and neighbors to conduct routine home checks. And this will often include information as to parking arrangements. It is rather upsetting when while away to receive a call that there is a vehicle, owner unknown, parked in your carport.

Keep in mind also that incidences of Home Squatting are not uncommon in Florida and have occurred at Gateway. Those strangers in your neighbor's home might not be there with the permission they say they have. Do your best to contact your neighbor to verify they are aware of what is occurring at their home.



PERSONAL SAFETY — BE PREPARED

UCLA Crime Prevention Unit

y taking a few simple precautions, you can reduce the risk to yourself and also discourage those who commit crimes.



- Educate yourself concerning prevention tactics.
- Be aware of locations and situations which would make you appear vulnerable to crime, such as alleys and dark parking lots.

STREET PRECAUTIONS

- Be alert to your surroundings and the people around you—especially if you are alone or it is dark.
- Whenever possible, travel with a friend.
- Stay in well-lighted areas as much as possible.
- Walk close to the curb. Avoid doorways, bushes and alleys where someone could hide.
- Walk confidently at a steady pace.
- Make eye contact with people when walking.
- Do not respond to conversation from strangers on the street—continue walking.
- If you carry a purse, carry it securely between your arm and your body. Although a purse-snatcher's intent is to steal the purse, your personal safety may depend on not clinging to it.
- Do not use or wear anything that will impede your vision or hearing (i.e. iPods).

CAR SAFETY

- Always lock your car doors after entering or leaving your vehicle.
- Park in well-lighted areas.
- Have your car keys in your hand so you don't have to linger before entering your car.
- Check the interior of your vehicle for intruders before entering your car.
- If you think you are being followed, drive to a public place or a police or sheriff station.
- If your car breaks down, open the hood and attach a white cloth to the car antennae. If

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someone stops to help, stay in your locked car and ask them to call the police, sheriff or a tow truck service.

• Don't stop to aid motorists by the side of the road. Make a phone call requesting help for them.

WHILE WAITING FOR A BUS

- Be alert to your surroundings and the people around you.
- Try to avoid isolated bus stops.
- Don't open your purse or wallet while boarding the bus—have your pass or money already in your hand.
- Keep jewelry out of sight; don't flash jewelry; turn rings around so the stones don't show.

ON BOARD BUSES

- During off hours, ride as near to the bus operator as possible
- If someone bothers you or makes you feel uncomfortable, change seats. Inform the driver of the situation.
- Carry your wallet inside your coat, or in a front pocket.
- Keep your belongings in front of you and hold close to your body with both hands.
- Be alert to pickpocketers on crowded buses; check your purse or wallet if someone is jostling, crowding or pushing you.

OFFICE SECURITY

- Never leave your purse or wallet in plain view or in common accessible areas.
- Don't leave cash or valuables at the office.
- If you work alone or after business hours, keep the office door locked.
- If you work late, try to find another worker or a security guard to walk out with you.
- In an elevator, be mindful that there is a distress alarm on the control panel.
- Be alert for pickpocketers on crowded elevators.
- Report all suspicious persons and activities to the proper authorities (office manager, building security, law enforcement).
- Be aware of escape routes for emergencies and post the police and fire department numbers near telephones.

Finally, if a crime does occur...REPORT IT! Everyone should consider it his or her responsibility to report crime. Many criminals develop favorite areas for committing crime, as well as predictable methods of operation. When you report all the facts about a crime, it helps the police assign officers in the places where crimes are occurring or where they are most likely to occur, and your report may help prevent a crime from reoccurring.

At least half of the crimes in the Unites States go unreported, either because people don't think the police can do anything about it, or because people don't want to get involved. If you don't report a crime, this allows the criminal to continue to operate without interference.

In many cases, it is the information provided by victims and witnesses that leads to the arrest of a criminal. So tell the police as much as you can; no fact is too trivial. The police need the eyes and ears of all citizens.

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
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

RUMOR MILL & OTHER THINGS

he following is from the 2019 August NewsNDos and deserves repeating. In addition I would add that throughout the past year I have received multiple 'Friend Requests' from FaceBook 'friends' I already have. Prior to accepting 'added requests' you should contact your 'already friend' to verify they have created a new account or to warn them that their account information may have been compromised.



I have been an online computer user from the earliest days of personal computing and even prior to the perils of identity theft and debit cards to purchase gasoline I was aware of and concerned for personal information privacy and security. I have been a purchaser and user of Norton/Symantec Security software for decades and can recall fondly how I was the one being called by friends when their systems had been compromised and was able, through the use of Norton/Symantec tools to get them back online and virus free.

Craigslist and Online Selling

I have bought and sold multiple items using this popular online market place web site. Typically to avoid scammers I DO NOT list a phone number for contact with regards to the listing. It seems that scammers often respond with text messages offering to buy your item(s) at



an inflated price saying they will send a 'check' and then you are requested to deposit the check and 'pay to ship' the item. The check they send is BOGUS and you will be out your property and will have paid them to take it if you accept their offer.

Everything I have sold was posted to the local Craigslist without a phone number and those interested first contacted me via email and purchase and delivery arrangements (local McDonalds, Post Office parking lot, one came to my home on the river) were made. I listed a couple monitors and shredder and included a cryptically displayed phone number. Within minutes I received a text message from another area code inquiring whether the items 'were still available.' I responded 'YES' and then added that 'items would not be shipped' and never received a reply. My suggestion, do not include a phone number when offering things for sale online and never include your home address in an online advertisement.





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
