ELECTION OF NEW SOCIAL CLUB EXECUTIVE BOARD

s you may know, many of our elected Social Club officials stayed on much longer than their stipulated terms due to COVID. It is now time to start the process of electing a whole new Executive Board. The positions that are open are President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and three Directors. You do not need to be a year-round resident to run for office, but you must be a home owner, not a renter. Per the Social Club by-laws this is what will occur:

■ September 2021 – the Acting President will appoint a Chairperson and two other Club members to serve on the Nominating Committee. No person on the Nominating Committee may stand for election of any of the Executive Board positions. If you would like to serve in this capacity, please contact Judy Glenn.

■ October 12, 2021 – At the regular business meeting, after coffee, the Nominating Committee will be presented to the club membership in attendance. Any club member who owns a home in Teakwood East may be nominated and run for any of the Executive Board positions, however, they may not hold more than one office at a time. Those Associate Club Members who rent are not eligible to run or vote.

■ November 9, 2021 - At the regular business meeting, after coffee, the Nominating Committee shall present the candidates for Social Club Officers. At that time only, additional nominations will be permitted from the floor.

■ December 14, 2021 - At the regular business meeting, after coffee, the election of officers will be held by ballot or by absentee ballot. Absentee ballots will be sent to requesting members during the month of November and are to be mailed and received back by the Secretary the Monday before the election (December 13th).

The newly elected officers shall take their positions as of January 1, 2022. It doesn't matter if you have lived here for years or are new to the park. This is a great opportunity to get involved and maybe bring some new ideas to the club. The variety of Social Club functions is one of the reasons that makes Teakwood Village East such a desirable place to live.

MISSING MAN TABLE

n Friday, September 17, 2021, Teakwood Social Club will set the MISSING MAN TABLE. This observance takes place on the third Friday of each September & this will be Teakwood East's 6th presentation this event. (The 2020 event was not held due to Covid-19 restrictions). Ben Cortez & Cheryl Tracy are inviting all residents & friends to attend this program. It begins at noon in the Aloha Hall. If you have not attended before, you will be impressed.



Several residents of the park set a table in honor of those who are/were POW's and in memory of those who are Missing in Action.

The <u>Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA)</u> official site says more than 83,000 service members are missing from conflicts from World War II to the present time. Of that number, the majority (more than 73,000) are missing from World War II. The number of POW/ MIAs from the Korean conflict number just above 7,000. Vietnam has over 1,600 listed, with the Cold War at 126 service members listed as POW/MIA. Conflicts since 1991 have six people still unaccounted for.

Of the more than 83,000 service members listed as POW/MIAs, approximately half are "presumed lost at sea" according to DPAA.mil. Roughly 75% of the entire number of POW/MIAs are thought to be in the Asia/Pacific theater of operations.

Repatriation efforts-cooperative projects with other nations to bring POW/MIAs back homeare ongoing. Efforts in Vietnam and Korea are ongoing, and there are still identifications being made on remains from World War II. The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency is tasked with making continuous efforts to account for the 83,000 service members who still have not come home from conflicts around the globe. POW/MIA Day is but one moment in that ongoing effort, but it's an important one.

rouper's on the Gulf; 1401 Gulf Blvd. Indian Rocks Beach; NEW HOURS 12:00-9:00 pm daily, Closed Wednesday. https://groupersonthegulf.com/; 727-266-4276 This is the essence of casual beach dining. Grouper's is a relatively small restaurant with a laid-back atmosphere that makes you feel at home. Mark & Betty, the owners, don't try to get fancy; they just serve good, simply prepared, fresh food. When not away at college, two of Mark and Betty's sons help out at the restaurant along with their oldest son who recently graduated from Florida State.

If you like grouper, which is almost a must in this area, there are 6 different menu items featuring this lovely buttery tasting fish. My favorites are the "Grouper Sandwich" served with coleslaw & fries (\$14) and the "Grouper Taco" served with coleslaw (2 for \$9 or 3 for \$13). I've also had the "Shrimp Taco", also good and the same price. A prominent IRB resident (no name dropping) likes the grilled "Salmon" with garlic bread & coleslaw (\$12). My brother is a big fan of their "Lobster Bisque" (\$5) and "Street Taco" (2 for \$6) made with your choice of beef, pork or chicken and their hamburgers (which aren't on the web-site menu). One of these days I am going to splurge and try a slice of the "Island Girl Rum Cake" (\$5) which sounds yummy! If there is more than one of you dining out or if you have a tremendous appetite, you might want to try the "Steamer Bucket" filled with 1/2 LB shrimp, 1/2 LB mussels, cluster of snow crab legs, corn on the cob and red skinned potatoes (\$29) – it is more than I can eat by myself. Grouper's has a decent variety of regular and premium beers and wines as well as the usual soft drinks. On Thursday nights there is live entertainment. This is a good place to have a girls (or guys) night out. There are also a few outdoor tables for those who may be concerned about indoor dining at this time. I do hope you will stop in and say hi to Betty...Mark will be in the kitchen slaving over a hot stove!

Slow Cooker ribs

One onion, chopped 6 tsp. Smoked Paprika 1 tablespoon of garlic powder 1/2 tsp.of salt 4 pounds of spareribs trimmed cut into 4 to 5 ribs sections 1 1/2 cups of ketchup 1/3 cup apple cider vinegar Lime Slices (optional)

Place onion in 6 qt slow cooker

Combine 4 tsp. paprika, garlic powder and salt rub over both sides of ribs


Combine ketchup, vinegar and remaining paprika, pour a half a cup of sauce mixture over ribs. Refrigerate remaining sauce in covered dish.

Place ribs in the slow cooker and cover. Cook on low until tender, about eight hours. Using wide spatula transfer ribs to serving platter no cover.

Skim and discard fat from liquid in the slow cooker. Transfer liquid to a pot, add reserved sauce. Heat over medium high heat until hot about 7 to 9 minutes.

Brush a 1/4 cup sauce over ribs serve with remaining sauce.




Brussel sprouts with Honey Butter

Lavender Milk Bath

Let the soothing properties of this lavender milk bath whisk you away into pure tranquility!

You Will Need:

1/2 cup powdered milk, 1/2 cup epsom salt, 1/4 cup baking soda, 1/4 cup dried lavender buds, 4 drops lavender essential oil

Craft Tools:

8 oz glass container, medium size mixing bowl, measuring cups and spoons

Combine all ingredients in a mixing bowl and mix together with a spoon.

Store in an air tight container. Optionally, tie a bow of twine around the rim of the jar. If you are using an 8 oz container, you may have about 1/4 cup extra milk bath. You can either use a larger jar for storage or you can seal the extra in a Ziploc bag. The shelf life of this lavender milk bath should be close to a year. However, keep in mind that the lavender essential oil will not be as potent the longer it sits. This milk bath is typically used fairly quickly, however, a good rule of thumb is to go off of the powdered milk expiration date.
