Summer is behind us, and I hope that COVID has improved. Betty is posting the social events coming up for the community. Lots of activities coming. As we move forward there will be more summer events



and we're asking for resident's input. We have received additional monies for the HOA, and we can add activities to our calendars and or buy something for residents. We could buy games, equipment needed for events, signs etc. Food for thought.

The HOA signed a lease agreement for three years. It is a 4% increase for the residents with a September increase lease date. This will be adjusted by ELS and at this printing it should be accomplished. In addition, ELS will give the HOA an additional \$2500 for events etc. ELS will also give the \$3500 that is part of the ROC contract from the sale of the park. The rent increase was based on fair market value. The Federation of Mobile Homes (FMO) will lobby that this can't be how rent increases can be determined. If successful, this will be part of the Fl statute 723 and make it easier for rent to be negotiated with park owners. The FMO will speak briefly *...continued on page 5*

Things That Make You Go...Hmmmmmm?

History of Serendipity Mobile Home Park

Service the event of the park and streets after reading the book titled "The 3 Princes of Serendipity". The Park consists of 56 acres in northern Pinellas County and was developed and registered with the county as a mobile home park. There are no registered surveyed and individual plotted lot lines. The Park was developed in three phases. The first phase started in 1971 at Serendipity Drive (Main Office Building) and extends east to the first power line easement. The second phase of the mobile home park started in 1978 and went from power line easement east to the Curlew Creek drainage ditch which runs along the park's eastern property line and the second power line easement. The third and final phase started in 1984 and was the "A" phase where all the lot numbers end with the letter "A" at the very front of the park (King and Imperial Drive).

The late 1980s and early 1990s saw the rapidly growing trend of homeowners purchasing communities as a solution to increasing rents. That certainly was the case with Serendipity. In 1993 Mr. Whitehurst was approached and negotiations began. The existing HOA could not come up with enough potential shareholders to satisfy the lending agencies and the effort failed. In 1995 the renters started another drive to buy the park. This proved more difficult than the first attempt. The lending agency was not satisfied with the number of potential shareholders, so Mr. Whitehurst bought five dummy shares. That met the lending agency's requirement, and the park was purchased in June 1995 for \$10.5 million. Mr. Whitehurst also offered the Serendipity Plaza to the shareholders, but they declined for obvious financial reasons.

Thus, the park was off and running as a resident owned community. The new board of directors then proposed a rent increase for 1996 of \$20/month. To say that this was not well received would be a serious understatement. The park exploded in disarray. At least 16 people moved their homes out of the park. Another park owner had enticed a Serendipity owner to help him get people to move out of Serendipity to his park. Another 20 people just abandoned their homes. Literally just leaving them to the park and just walking away from them. This obviously put quite a strain on the park finances. Fortunately, volunteer residents help get the lots and the abandoned homes in shape to sell. The 1996 rent increase that kicked up a storm was the last increase for 5 years.

In 1999 the original loan was negotiated for a lower interest rate. The financial picture began to look a little more improved. Some shares were being sold and new units arrived on empty

lots. It was time to look ahead and do some longrange planning. The replacement of the original East clubhouse was at the top of the list. A finance committee was set up in 2004 and the loan was refinanced in 2005. The park had a balance on the loan of \$9.1 and they got an additional \$1.9 million for construction of the new East clubhouse for a new mortgage of \$11 million. There were major interest expenses involved with this transaction

which resulted in a substantial loss of in 2005. The refinancing cost and the write-off of the old East clubhouse and maintenance building resulted in negative retained earnings. The years 2005 through 2010 were required to write off these negative retained earnings.

Planning began for a new East clubhouse in 2005. The first approach was an architect designed building, but it faltered due to cost over runs. The final design consists of 11 sections of manufactured segments bolted together. The old East clubhouse and maintenance building were torn down in 2006 to make room for the present east Clubhouse. About the same time the county was requiring the park to install a new hydrant system and plans were made to upgrade that system at a cost of \$500,000+. In 2007 construction started for the new clubhouse, new maintenance building now on Imperial Drive, and the park hydrant system and all three were completed in 2008.

Now the park is over 425 occupied lots with two pools and two clubhouses. Numerous improvements have been made to the park and in 2013 shareholders voted to do a roof-over of the shuffleboard courts. A new building just south of the East pool was built and became the fitness center. In March 2018 the park was sold to ELS (Equity Lifestyles). They are the largest owner of real property in the United States.



"Marilyn's Recipe Corner"

Yield: 8 servings Zuppa Toscana Soup

Make this Zuppa Toscana Soup recipe at home! A copycat Olive Garden recipe full of spicy Italian sausage, fresh kale, and russet potatoes in a creamy broth.

Prep Time 15 minutes Cook Time 30 minutes

Ingredients

- 1 lb. bulk mild Italian sausage
- 1 tsp. red pepper flakes
- 1/2 lb. bacon, diced
- 1 small onion, diced

Instructions

- 1. In a large soup pot or Dutch oven, crumble and brown the Italian sausage with the red pepper flakes over medium-high heat, until the sausage is no longer pink. Drain and set aside.
- 2. Cook the bacon in the same pot, over medium-high heat, until crisp. Remove the bacon to paper towels. Drain all but 2 tbsp. of the bacon grease.
- 3. Add the onions and garlic to the pot; cook until the onions are soft, about 3-5 minutes.
- 4. Add the chicken broth. Bring to a boil.
- 5. Add the potatoes and kale; lower the heat to medium and cook about 15-20 minutes, or until potatoes are tender.
- 6. Add the reserved bacon and sausage to the pot.
- 7. Stir in the cream. Heat through.
- 8. Serve hot.

Notes

- Feel free to substitute Italian sausage links. Cut the links open, crumbling the sausage, and discard the casing.
- Use whatever kind of Italian sausage your family prefers sweet, mild, or hot.
- If you prefer, diced potatoes can be used in place of the sliced potatoes.
- You can omit or reduce the amount of red pepper fl1.akes if you are sensitive to spicy foods.



Total Time

- 45 minutes
- 64 oz. chicken broth

- 4-6 medium potatoes, scrubbed and sliced
- 1 small bunch kale, stems removed
- and leaves chopped (about 3-4 cups)
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream



The Opium Wars

It is thought that China established trade with some western countries long before Marco Polo. Chinese historians have records by people thought to be emissaries from the Roman Empire in the 2nd and 3rd centuries AD, and new evidence suggests regular contact between the 1st Emperor of China and the West before the formal establishment of the Silk Road. As the countries of Europe developed, the monarchs



and their subjects desired to trade with China for porcelain, silk, and tea. The demand for these goods drove England to trade with China. However, since England did not produce anything of interest, China insisted on silver as payment. England was forced to buy silver from other European countries and Mexico. Eventually, its trade deficit became huge, and England had to find a solution.

Opium, illegal in England, was occasionally used in China to treat a range of physical ailments, although a few individuals had concerns about possible addiction. The few Chinese that smoked it did become addicted. Around 1750, seeing an opportunity to reverse the flow of silver from its coffers, England started to use The East India Trading Company to help smuggle a stronger opium from India into China to satisfy China's growing demand. The stronger opium, mixed with tobacco, accelerated addiction among China's population. Research suggests that in the early 1800s, American ships with Turkish opium also tried to enrich themselves in this narcotics trade.

On four different occasions, in 1729, 1799, 1814, and 1831, opium had been banned in an attempt to curb addiction among the Chinese people. The emperor became alarmed that millions of subjects had become addicted and concerned about the amount of silver leaving China. In 1839, Imperial Commissioner Lin Zexu instituted laws, again, banning opium in China. Lin Zexu confiscated all the crates of the drug in Chinese harbors and on ships at sea, and arrested 1700 dealers. He then threw 2.6 million lbs. of opium into the ocean. Angry British merchants pressured the British government to compensate them for their lost merchandise. England didn't have the money and declared war on China to settle the issue. "The Century of Humiliation" was about to begin.

In an attempt to pressure China, Britain set up a blockade around Pearl Bay restricting commerce. In November 1839 two British merchant ships tried to run the blockade. Chinese war junks and fire boats were sent out to escort the merchants. The British enforcing the blockade, fired upon the escort vessels, exploding one and sinking three more. Their return fire wounded one British sailor. In June of 1840 a force of 44, or 16 according to other sources, British ships arrived, with heavy cannon, rockets, and infantry with accurate rifles, to launch a military campaign against Canton. The Chinese, with antiquated weapons and tactics, were dealt a series of devastating land and naval defeats.

There were people, in the British government that thought it was atrocious for Britain to wage war on a friendly country to advance its own interests in the illicit drug trade. The motion to end the China campaign was narrowly defeated in Parliament in 1840. The war ended in 1842 with the Treaty of Nanking, considered the first Unequal Treaty between China and Western Powers.

The Treaty of Nanking gave Hong Kong and smaller surrounding islands to Britain. It also continued on page 39

established five treaty ports and imposed a 21-million-dollar payment, with 6 million to be paid immediately, the rest in specified installments. The following year, another treaty granted Britain most favored nation status and provisions to exempt the British from Chinese law. (Extraterritoriality) Opium was still illegal in China.

China had been considered the regional superpower for centuries. Losing the Opium War and the harsh treaty conditions exposed China as a paper tiger to its neighbors and especially Japan. Shortly afterwards, around 1844, France and the United States obtained very favorable (unequal) trade concessions. Later in 1854, Britain had the audacity to demand additional concessions, including the opening of all ports to foreign trade, the legalization of opium, and 0% tariff on British imports. China delayed implementing these requests but in October of 1856 escalating tensions came to a head.

Resentment towards the western powers had been building for some time. Since 1853 a convert to Christianity believed that he was the brother of Jesus Christ. His following was large enough to almost seize the capitol city of Peking and had control of many Northern provinces. A considerable portion of China's army was occupied addressing the rebellion. This didn't stop the appointment of a new commissioner determined to eliminate the illegal opium trade. After all, China did not feel that it was right for a country to impose trade of an illegal substance upon a country that was also illegal in the exporting country. In 1856 he seized the Arrow, a ship known for smuggling in the past, with a Chinese crew and expired British ship registration, placed the crew in chains.

On October 23rd the British fleet bombarded and captured forts guarding the approach to Canton, then proceeded to bombard Canton. However, the Admiral had insufficient forces to take Canton. During a riot within the city on December 15th commercial property was destroyed and in February a French missionary murdered. The Governor of Hong Kong requested military assistance and for a second time Britain went to war with China, this time with support from France. Between December of 1857 and mid-1858, English and French forces captured two cities and a fort complex. China surrendered and was forced to sign the Treaty of Tientsin in June of 1858. There were members of the emperor's



court that did not desire to adhere to the punitive conditions of the treaty. His advisor convinced him not to ratify the treaty. The army was sent to engage the Anglo-French forces sent to support their embassies. China lost 10,000 soldiers, Anglo-French forces captured Peking and for the mistreatment of prisoners, ransacked the Summer Palaces. In October of 1860 a revised version of the initial Treaty was confirmed by the Convention of Peking.

China lost more territory to western powers, opened more ports to unrestricted trade, legalized Christianity, the opium trade, and had to pay 8 million dollars. Russia, through pressure or potential threat, received some northern territory, and the treaty permitted the transportation of indentured laborers to the United States. It can be argued that the arrogant behavior towards the Chinese and the punitive treaty conditions placed upon China by the western powers at the time, has contributed *continued on page 43*
