- 8. Still need volunteers for the North Canal Committee to coordinate with City Officials for storm water run-off and any associated tax reimbursement. John Tyson, Board Vice president, has volunteered as liaison. First meeting scheduled for 7:00pm, Thursday, 28 October in the library.

Meeting Objectives: chair election, canal background, and potential St Petersburg municipal players.




We will be discussing "Big Lies in a Small Town" by Diane Chamberlain. Picture this, North Carolina...

What she finds under the layers of grime is a painting that tells the story of madness, violence, and a conspiracy of small town secrets.







Helping Hands: Myths about Health, Part One

These are myths we have believed about good health from Consumer Reports on Health:

- 1. 1. Oatmeal is just for breakfast. It can also be eaten for lunch or dinner or as a snack since it has been shown to bind to cholesterol and keep it out of the bloodstream. Try it with mushrooms, cheese or thyme or add it to soups.
- 2. Green tea is the healthiest because it contains catechins, a flavonoid that may help keep blood vessels open and break down body fat. But white tea contains the most catechins!



- 3. The computer brain myth. There's no conclusive proof that computer games protect memory. In addition, choose challenging, interesting activities that are new to you. This can include reading books or playing board or card games. These may also lower the risk of dementia. Hooray for the games in our atrium!
- 4. The pain reliever myth. You can take ibuprofen (Advil) or naproxen (Aleve) for joint pain. But walking can also reduce pain as can yoga, tai chi and swimming. Right on for our pool aerobics and clubhouse workouts!
- 5. The aging myth. While many folks think that aging means getting weak, forgetful and sick, they are wrong. An ingenious easy exercise program brings anti-aging benefits: better balance, chronic pain relief, lower blood pressure and sharper thinking.
- 6. Lowering blood pressure can only be done with medication myth. For example, strawberries and blueberries can have a positive impact on your blood pressure. They contain anthocyanin, a substance in foods shown to reduce blood pressure risk by 8-12 percent.
- 7. The "You can't fight gravity" myth. Sure, gravity can make your posture worse as you age. But you can help to keep your posture straight by regular exercise and even just sitting up straight in your chair while watching tv!
- 8. An apple a day is really not a myth! Apples have heart healthy benefits, especially the skin of red apples. People who ate apples daily, in one study, reduced their bad cholesterol by 24 per-cent.



New height regulations for new homes

The city of St. Petersburg permitting department has issued new guidelines for the elevation of new homes within an AE-9 flood zone, which is the flood zone that Americana Cove is located.

As of June 22, 2021, new homes placed in Americana Cove must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be elevated to a Base Flood Elevation + 2 feet, which equates to approximately 10 stairs high.
- 2. All HVAC equipment and electrical services must be elevated to Base Flood Elevation.
- 3. Homes must now have a permanent foundation cast in reinforced concrete footings and reinforced masonry piers. Additional anchors and wind tie-down straps are required. According to Broker/Dealer Marty Pozgay, the new height requirements will add

approximately \$20,000 to the price of a new home.

What is a flood elevation certificate? To obtain flood insurance, an insurer will need a flood elevation certificate, which is an official FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Association) approved document that identifies the elevation (height above sea level), the special flood hazard area, and required base flood elevation (BFE) based on the communities Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM's) in effect at the time of certification. By having this document, an insurer knows what rate to charge based on the height of the home if an owner wants flood insurance. A surveying company completes flood elevation certificates.
