#### **INFRASTRUCTURE, ROADS & GROUNDS**

There have been several instances in the past where owners have left for a trip and come back to find that there was a water leak in their home. The water had done extensive damage to their floors; sometimes to their walls causing thousands of dollars of damage.

Planning on going away? If so, listed below are a few things you can do to protect your home.

- Shut your water off. This will prevent major damage in the event you have a small water leak (most likely from one of your toilets). The main water shut-off valve should be at the back of your home. If you don't know where it is contact a Board Member for assistance.
- Leave your air conditioner on as this prevents mold in your home. You can set your thermostat to 82 or 84.
- Turn off your hot water heater by turning off the circuit breaker in your electrical panel.
- Make sure all outside furniture is put away. This is to prevent it from blowing around in case of a hurricane or tropical storm.
- Ensure all windows are closed.
- Cover your toilets with plastic wrap this prevents water from evaporating.
- Cover all your sink drains. This will prevent bugs from coming in while you are gone.
- If you are leaving for an **extended period** of time you may want to **empty and turn off your refrigerator**.

The month of August was not kind to our lawns due to the constant rain. While it was good for the growth of our grass it was not good for the heavy



L equipment used to mow our lawns. We attempted to mark off the areas where the ground was saturated but to get 100% coverage of all suspected areas was not possible and telltale marks from the wheels of the mowing machine were visible. While we believe most of those areas will recover in weeks if any linger on with permanent damage, we will attempt to resolve those issues.

October will see the lawns cut 3 times in that month and November will be reduce to every other week.

December, we will have a schedule; I will attempted to schedule it early in December so lawn Christmas ornamentation will not be affected. As we move into the coming months, I am working with the lawn crew to resolve issues you have reported to me. I may not have provided all of you with 100% satisfaction but we are working in that direction. Contacting me is the best solution. I understand when you call you are not frustrated with me (I hope) but the situation and together my goal is to better manage the service and get them to the Ivory Soap level of 99.44 percent good.







## White Peacock Butterfly

Jody Larson

The White Peacock is a smallish butterfly, with about a 2-inch wingspan. Its wings are white with golden or orange margins and a total of six large dark spots. These resemble the "eyespots" on peacock feathers, which is what gives them their name. Males and females look alike.

The caterpillar form is about 1-1/2 inches long, black and spiny, with tiny white freckles on the body.

This butterfly is frequently seen hovering over weedy areas because they like the nectar of common flowers such as those of the aster family. I often see them on my front lawn, on which



I use no pesticides.

The White Peacock is widely distributed in warmer climates in the East. I hadn't encountered them until we came to Florida. But during the summer months this butterfly may wander farther north. One sighting was reported in the Chicago area in 2015!
