after graduating from Berea College of Nursing. While both working in internships, they met in Cincinnati, Ohio and married on April 14, 1956. Today they have three sons: Dan (and wife Michel), a retired horticulture teacher, Bill, a veterinarian, and Mathew (and wife Lynn), an engineer for Boeing Aircraft. Living in Dublin, Ohio, Bill and Barbara reside on what used to be a farm as the city continues to be built all around them. They still have fruit and nut trees that they harvest in the fall.

Richard (Bud) had served in the U.S. Army during the Korean Conflict, including 3 months of combat duty. Returning home, he attended some college and started working for NCR Corporation, helping to develop carbonless paper. After eighteen years, NCR closed their facilities in Dayton, after which time Bud worked for Delco Products Division of General Motors Corporation, building prototypes of new shock absorbers. JoAnn, his wife, was an accountant for Delco Products Division of General Motors. In addition to accounting, she also worked on special budget typing for the comptroller and supervised the mail room and supplies for the entire office building.

Bud and JoAnn first met at church youth group, thirteen years prior to getting married on December 13, 1969. Bud could no longer date JoAnn's girlfriends! They have one daughter, LeeAnn (and husband Todd), who works as a Nurse/Manager for Fidelity Health Care, a division of Miami Valley Hospital, and one granddaughter, Shelby. Shelby, age 20, is a sweet sailor girl currently serving on the H.S. Truman Aircraft carrier as a Certified Nuclear Power Engineer.

Twenty-one years ago, Bud and JoAnn moved to Washington Township, Ohio --at the time full of open fields and farmland - in pursuit of living out in the country. As with Dublin though, the city (Centerville) continues to be built around them and is quickly taking over!

Coincidently, three of the four Ruegers graduated from the oldest surviving high school in Dayton, Ohio (Stivers High School). Bill graduated in 1945, Bud in 1950, and JoAnn in 1954. The school is still going strong today!

The story of how the Ruegers came to end up in Westwind II is an interesting one! In 1975, JoAnn's parents (Shelby and Ada Wilcox) started coming to Florida for the winters. Not long after, a friend from Dayton (Gladys Dixon) also bought a place on Third Street. Gladys convinced them to come to Westwind II for the winter of 1981. LeeAnn was in first grade at the time, and Bud and JoAnn took her out of school for one week to stay in #174, a beautifully decorated coach. Unfortunately, that was the only year that JoAnn's parents stayed there as her mother became ill, was not able to return and ultimately passed in the spring of 1984.

Shelby still wanted to have a place in Florida, so in the summer of 1984, Bud and JoAnn came down to help find a place for him. He didn't want a big place like Westwind II, so they bought

a one bedroom in Grand Bay just across Alt 19. After Shelby passed in 1988, Bud and JoAnn kept the place, as they were now at an age to enjoy it themselves! Bill and Barbara suggested also buying into it and, as Bud and JoAnn were still working and could coordinate vacation time, the agreement was made.







Let's talk about weeds. THANKS TO JACQUELYN FLOOD FOR THE FOLLOWING:

et's talk about weeds. They are getting out of control and I'm having to send letters almost every day. Some of them are 2nd letters and I do not want to send them at all. However, I'm getting lists daily of lots who need to take care of this. I also get complaint forms dropped off, calls, emails and walk-ins of neighbors who are living next door or across the street from these lots. Plus, I see them while inspecting

the community. If you read the Occupancy Agreement you will notice that it states the Board of Directors can hire someone to maintain lots and charge the homeowner if it's not taken care of and that seems even worse than a letter. So, instead of simply sending letters, (which I still have to do), or taking a chance on letting anyone get charged, I've decided to give a couple suggestions too. I've been adding the contact info of a neighbor in Westwind I who came down to tell me he is looking for new clients to pull/spray weeds..PLEASE CONTACT ME AND I WILL BE HAPPY TO GIVE YOU CONTACT INFORMATION."

I really appreciate everyone for taking some time to get the weed issue in Westwind II under control. I understand that not everyone lives here full time and others just can't do the weeds themselves.

Also, an important reminder that if you've not gotten your updated insurance info to me, please do so ASAP. Keep in mind that it's the Declarations page that's required and not the invoice. The Declarations page will say that's what it is right at the top. If you aren't sure which page to send, just let me know and I can show you. If you need to make a copy to give the office, there is a copy machine in the library and, if necessary, I'm more than happy to make a copy for you. I can't stress how important it is to keep your insurance updated and to make sure the office has a copy.

We need to do this with any ESA's in the park as well so, if it's time to obtain updated vaccination records, make that veterinarian appointment and get that updated and dropped off at the office too.

Lastly, if anyone has any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to let me know. The Complaint/Suggestion forms and the ARC Request forms are in the plastic bins right outside the office door and there is a mail slot right on the door you can drop the completed forms in. I also want to thank all of the residents who have offered to help as it's a generous offer and very much appreciated. Thank you.
