Have you tried the Hungry Crab at the Largo Mall? It is in the former Sweet Tomatoes building but looks absolutely nothing like it did. Several folks have tried it and the consensus is, "What a good mess."

It is not easy to find restaurants where they do seafood boils. Nauti Nancy's used to be the only one around. Now, we have the Hungry Crab and it features several boils. Each has a red skinned potato and corn on the cob along with various choices of scallops, yum, crayfish, yum, and shrimp, mussels, snow crab legs, yum. You can have ½ or whole pound of seafood, some offerings have two choices. Get the picture?

The guys will want a full pound which also has an extra potato and maybe the gals the ½. I had the latter of scallops and there were maybe ten which did not look like many but were filling. You can choose a boil to share, too. You just need to decide what your tummy feels like eating. By all means be certain to choose their house seasoning of Old Bay, garlic, and lemon pepper. Oh, so tasty. The boils are served in a steamable plastic bag and set upon a silver tray. The cute paper covering the tables has red crabs which makes it festive. Tableware includes a cracker and a "digger" (although I am sure it isn't called that.) There are crabs on the paper plates, too. (Next time I will share a bigger boil if we can agree on our seafood.)

So, you dig in. You get your fingers all messy, and enjoy. Don't forget the good flavors in the bottom of the bag. Forget the wet nap as you really will need to go wash your hands, maybe up to your elbows.

Our wait staff thought it funny when we decided to have soup after the boils. Forget the pie, bring soup. Marty loves gumbo and couldn't leave without trying it, so, I decided to try the chowder. The bowls were overflowing. His gumbo was chock full of all the components in a good gumbo. He rated it one of the best he has ever had. He has had quite a few in his lifetime. I only had the chowder because it was New England style, however, it was too milky and not filled with much else. I added salt and pepper, but it did not help.

I also did not care for my Hungry Hurricane. It was bland and rather watery tasting. There is a bar to the right of the dining area. There is not a long list of cocktails, they range in price from \$6-8. You can buy a draft for \$2.75.

There is very little option for fish but hey, the place is the Hungry Crab. The boils range in price from around \$10.99-\$29.99 for a sharable with two pricier options for huge appetites or sharing. When I want another boil, I'll be back.

If you are looking for a restaurant for the holidays you should try Lucky Dill for Thanksgiving. We were there in 2020 and started with Grandma's Relish Tray which we could not finish. Our dinners came piled high with delicious moist white and dark meat turkey along with mashed potatoes – my favorite, green beans, pearl onions, sweet potatoes, and delicious bread assortment. Then yummy desserts. We had several meals of left-overs for just under \$70.











- Be sure to have a smoke alarm inside bedrooms and outside of each room of your home, and test them frequently.
- Check your outlets and extension cords to make sure they are not overloaded.
- Do not smoke inside your home. Or better yet, quit smoking altogether.
- Keep flammable items in open areas and away from heat sources.

Practice Your Escape". Consider the following escape planning tips:

- Create a home fire escape plan.
- Each member of the family should know two ways out of every room.
- Don't forget to designate an outside meeting place.
- Practice a home fire drill with your family at least two times a year.

STOCKE ALARMS ARE A KEY PART of a home fire escape plan. When there is a fire, smoke spreads fast. Working smoke alarms give you early warning so you can

get outside quickly.

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom. They should also be outside each sleeping area and on every level of the bome. Install alarms in the basement.
- Large homes may need extra smoke alarms.
- It is best to use interconnected smoke alarms. When one smoke alarm sounds, they all sound.
- Test all smoke alarms at least once a month.
 Press the test button to be sure the alarm is working.
- Current alarms on the market employ different types of technology including multi-sensing, which could include smoke and carbon monoxide combined.
- Today's smoke alarms will be more technologically advanced to respond to a multitude of fire conditions, yet mitigate false alarms.
- A smoke alarm should be on the ceiling or high on a wall. Keep smoke alarms away from the kitchen to reduce false alarms. They should be at least 10 feet (3 meters) from the stove.
- People who are hard-of-hearing or deaf can use special alarms. These alarms have strobe lights and bed shakers.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old.

- A closed door may slow the spread of smoke, heat, and fire.
- Smoke alarms should be installed inside every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level. Smoke alarms should be connected so when one sounds, they all sound. Most homes do not have this level of protection.
- Roughly 3 out of 5 fire deaths happen in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.




