There have been some concerns about property drainage. I spoke to Troy Wilcox, Safety Harbor Civil Engineer. French drains are allowed provided they are maintained to do what they are designed to do. There should be swales between the properties to provide proper drainage away from the home. Any further questions he said to refer to website:

https://library.municode.com/fl/safety\_harbor/codes/code\_of\_ordinances

Also, downspouts are to run into the grass before entering the streets; this will collect debris and any fertilizers that may be on the grass.

Remember to submit an Architectural Request form prior to digging or making any changes in your yard. Forms are available in the rack outside of the office door in the clubhouse.

#### Water & Sewer Pipes

riar Creek owns all our water and sewer pipes and we are responsible for repairing any water leaks. Since these pipes are only a few feet below ground and generally run across the front of your home it is important that no vehicle be parked on the grass. This is to prevent damage to the water and sewer pipes resulting in damage and leaks. Additionally, if you are planning any alteration/addition outside of your home you need to complete an Architectural Request to ensure what you are planning will not affect the water or sewer pipes. Over the past three years we have spent approximately \$6,000.00 to repair water leaks.

You pay for water and sewer as part of your Monthly Maintenance Fee. Listed below is the last three years cost for water and sewer.

As you can see from the above figures our cost for water and sewer has increased each of the past three years. While some of that is due to increased rates from Pinellas County for Water and the City of Safety Harbor for Sewer the other element of the cost is consumption which is something we can control. Just so you know our sewage use is based on how much water we consume.

• Check your toilet for "silent leaks". Add a few drops of food coloring to the tank, and wait

10 to 15 minutes. If you have a slow leak, the color will appear in the bowel. Fixing this can be as simple as changing the flapper.

- Consider replacing one or both your toilets with new low-flush models. Not only will you save water but in addition the new toilets are usually higher and therefore more comfortable.
- Fix leaking faucets, and consider using low-flow aerators to save water.
- Don't let water run while washing dishes, shaving, or brushing teeth.
- If you have a dishwasher, run it only for full loads.
- When watering outside plants using a sprinkler remember to be aware when you turned it on and only water as long as needed. Do not turn on your sprinkler and then leave to run errands. Remember if water is running down your driveway or in the street you have overwatered as the ground is saturated!

As we move into the coming months, I am working with the lawn crew to resolve issues you have reported to me. I may not have provided all of you with 100% satisfaction but we are working in that direction.



Use crosswalks and obey crossing signals.

<u>Bicycles must bike with traffic</u>. One of the most commonly asked questions pertaining to Florida's bicycle law is whether bikes are considered vehicles under Florida law. The answer is an absolute yes.

As a bicyclist, you have precisely the same right to use the roadway as any motorist, and that includes the right to expect safety and care from others as you bike in traffic lanes.

Of course, this also means that you have a duty to obey all of the same traffic rules and regulations too.

These laws include stopping for stop signs and red lights, riding with the flow of traffic, using lights at night, and yielding the right-of-way when entering any road.

There is only one road, and it is up to bicyclists and motorists to treat each other with care and respect while sharing it. Strict adherence to the law is the foundation for this respect.

**Pink Flamingo** wants to remind residents that overnight parking on the street is not permitted. If you have overnight visitors, obtain a guest parking pass so they can park in the shuffle board lot, BC Mart or designated spaces in front of the laundry. The Guest pass needs to be visible on the dashboard or rear window of the vehicle.

Please monitor your speed as you drive through Briar Creek. Speed limits are posted in both Phase 1 and 2. Rest assure the limit is NOT over 20mph. We have no sidewalks in the park but folks do walk the streets. Some may be more limber than others, but none of us are spry enough to jump out of the path of speeding cars. There is enough anxiety on the corner of McMullen Booth and Briar Creek Blvd; we don't need to have any pedestrians injured by drivers speeding along our quiet streets. Most of us are retired – what's your rush? Even if Ronnie Goudie challenges you to a drag race – DON'T do it. **Slow your roll.**

#### How well do you know your clubhouse library?

The BCII library is a completely free, informal lending library stocked with books, puzzles and DVDs donated by residents, and maintained by a small


group of residents. There is no checkout system, and no fines if it takes you a long time to finish a book or a puzzle. So what do we, your clubhouse librarians, do?

Well, books do age and eventually fall apart, maybe a cup of coffee is spilt on them or your dog chews a few pages, puzzle pieces go missing and DVDs may no longer play properly. We don't reshelve these items and only keep the copy in the best condition when we find duplicates.

Where do new items come from? The majority of the new items in the library come from residents, perhaps when a house is sold and either the seller no longer wants or needs all the books they have or the buyer of a fully furnished house has different tastes. Phase I has a different policy

and generally only stocks books that have been published in the last couple of years, so they offer the books being cleared from their shelves to us.

Since the library has a fixed amount of shelf space, we do keep track of the amount of space on each shelf (there needs to be enough room to remove a book easily). Because we shelve the book by the author's name, the arrival of new books by one author or the removal of old, torn books may mean that some books need to be moved to a different shelf.

As our shelves become too crowded, we may have to remove books that have not been borrowed during the last few years and we take them to the East Lake Library which has a great program for sorting and providing new homes for old books.

Our books are date stamped and we checkmark all the returns, so we have a way to identify books that have not been borrowed during the last few years. This is the reason why we ask you to put all the returns in the basket rather than reshelving them yourself. Any book that missed being date stamped when this system was introduced is stamped the first time we find it in the basket.

During the covid pandemic, we quarantined and disinfected all items being returned to the library before reshelving them. Thank you to all the readers and puzzle people who helped us by following our 'covid return' policies for several months.




