significant difference – it is the smallest maintenance group we have ever had, and yet they continue to get the job done; they work very well together and <u>Ron Saves Us Money</u>!

C is the season to be Jolly – and it's beginning to look a lot like Christmas. While some stores had Christmas decorations up as early as August, it's not really the Holiday Season until the Norelco Santa Claus sleds across the snowy countryside. So, here he is and Merry Christmas to all of you living or vis-iting our premier 'active' 55+ Resident owned community.



For the Seventh Covenant of the New Resident Orientation, the subject is watering your grass. In Florida, irrigation is a big deal, especially during those hot summer months. Remember there are designated water days based on your address. Even number addresses water on Wednesday and Saturday, while odd ones are on Thursday and Sunday. Most of you have no idea of the number of calls the Office Team receives because of Residents watering on the wrong day or – in the worst case – watering every day. The other irrigation concern is using potable water for your grass. The smell gives away this mistake, and our Maintenance Team continually checks throughout the Cove for this potable water error. Any Resident routinely using potable water for their lawn costs money our budget doesn't forecast. So, Please:

Water on your designated day and time. City water is not to be used for irrigation purposes!

Initiative Updates:

- 1. The Floor Committee, chaired by Tom Wichmann, continues to acquire proposals for the floors in the Fitness, Billiard, Game Rooms, and Main Clubhouse. Please, volunteer for this committee as your effort will determine the type of floor covering and the cost.
- 2. ARO Engineering is completing the Engineer Survey for the North and South Boat Ramp Renovation Project with the final document sure to meet expectations. Mike Arkanoff continues to chair this effort.

- 3. The MAROA Board of Directors disbanded the Audio-Visual Committee at the October meeting, but not before one last modification was completed for changing out the old stage lighting for more up-to-date illumination.
- 4. The Landscaping Committee continues to improve the quality of our gardens. The garden on southwest corner, outside the Cove looks remarkable. And the addition of the red cedar colored rubber mulch presents a fresh appearance at the entrance.
- 5. As of this date, the Cove is still awaiting the seawall report from J. Foster Consulting. We should have the document before Thanksgiving. For your awareness, the Cove has become the second party to a warranty claim against the seawall fabric. MAROA assumes no cost for pursuing the claim at this time. However, our attorney believes at some point it may be necessary to bring in a construction litigation counsel, if the contractor disputes the warranty claim.
- 6. The WEBSITE, Land Survey, and North Canal Committees had their initial meetings. The WEB-SITE Committee is interested in volunteers who possess web skills as they are past the 'good idea' phase. Residents should start seeing Forecaster articles from the Land Survey Committee and North Canal Committees describing their efforts, future activities, and achievements.
- 7. The Tiki Hut Roof Committee has the ball rolling for re-thatching the roof. At last, and hopefully, those pesky flies will disappear. Over the next year, the committee will develop roofing options for MAROA Board approval.
- 8. Free tax preparation provided by IRS certified tax preparers, organized by our own Cove resident, Dr. Judy Hall. Tax preparation will be provided by appointment for dates in February and March 2022. Watch the Forecaster for specifics. A short note of Appreciation:

First, applause for the volunteers delivering our Forecasters. The magazine is always on time and every Resident gets a copy. To borrow a phrase . . . Neither Rain nor Heat nor Gloom of night stays these Couriers from the swift completion of their appointed rounds. Obviously, can't include the 'snow' part. You all are the Best!

Next, and not least, Ron Miller has become THE catalyst for ACA activities. And more importantly, Ron senses the pulse of the Cove and the attitude of our Residents. His support has been vital over the past months. Can't thank him enough for his assistance on numerous projects.






