briskness to the mornings, it must be autumn. Welcome to December. I know that many of you are in Teakwood for the first time or the first time in a long time so let's review a few items.

When trimming your bushes, trees, etc. you must bag or bundle the trimmings before setting them out for trash pickup there is no one to pick up loose trimmings and they will simply stay there. If you have a lot of them, you may want to contact the main office and request a dumpster. Remember though, if you are requesting a dumpster, that Teakwood only has 2 and we ask for your patience on this courtesy.

Lawn watering is regulated by the county. We have a schedule of days and times you may water so feel free to contact the main office if you do not know what your watering day(s) are. The county can and has fined people for watering outside their scheduled day and time.

<u>Feeding of wildlife is prohibited in Teakwood</u>. This includes, but is not limited to, stray cats and/or dogs, squirrels, birds and rabbits. Do not put out food for any animals. The rules and regulations allow for a bird feeder, but it must be approved, in writing, by the main office before it can be installed.

Parking is another big issue. ALL vehicles, this includes cars, trucks, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters and bicycles, MUST BE PARKED IN YOUR DRIVEWAY. There is no parking in the street, on the sidewalks, on lots or even on your front walkways. Also, there is no extra parking in Teakwood Village, if you can't fit in your own driveway you will need to find a place outside of Teakwood to park.

Final notes: Teakwood offices will be closed December 17, 24 and 31. Enjoy you holidays, whichever you celebrate. Happy Saturnalia.

MERRY CHRISTMAS OR HAPPY HOLIDAYS?

That does Christmas mean? Christmas is a joyous occasion for thousands of people around the world. Each country has their own set of traditions and celebrations that they practice during the holidays. To most of us, Christmas is spending time with family, decking the halls with boughs of holly, hanging Christmas lights outside the house like the Griswolds, buying presents for the people you love and so on and so forth.

There are several similarities and differences in the way Christmas is celebrated in the U.S. and

in the old country, the Philippines. Both the U.S. and the Philippines have similar Christmas traditions such as decorating the residences and public areas with Christmas decorations, putting up Christmas trees, and passing on the belief of Santa Claus.

My ethnicity is Filipino, born, raised and grew up in the Philippines. Did you know that my old country has one of, if not, the longest Christmas season?

The Christmas season begins on September 1, which marks the start of the so called "**BER months**" and ends in January when the Feast of the Three Kings is celebrated. Christmas songs start playing on radios, Christmas trees lit up in people's houses. These all happen in September. Around late November, group of kids go in front of your house singing Christmas carols hoping that the homeowner will be in the mood for some Christmas spirit and have some lose change to spare.

A major difference of how Christmas is celebrated in the U.S. compared to the Philippines is the day of celebration and the food that is served. In the U.S., the celebration happens on Christmas Day. The typical meal served on Christmas Day consists of turkey and/or ham with all the trimmings and delicious desserts. In the old country, the actual celebration happens on Christmas Eve. The celebration is called "Noche Buena" translated in English as "Good Night". But I like to call it "The Grand Feast" that begins around 12:00 midnight. Members of the family gather around the dining table filled with scrumptious food, a prayer of thanksgiving will be said, younger members of the family press their foreheads or kiss the right hands of their older relatives and greet them "Merry Christmas". Then everyone digs in. That is at midnight. The "Noche Buena" is a big, open house, celebration with family and friends. There is a special meal served on Christmas Eve which includes "Lechon" (Roasted Pig), noodles (for long life) etc.. Basically, the main course is not only one or two, it could be up to six or seven and plenty of sweets. The "Noche Buena" is enjoyed only by the "Wealthy". Not all families are able to celebrate the occasion lavishly because of the financial hardship most of the people there go through.

Kickoff to Christmas here in the United States begins right after Thanksgiving. Black Friday is the start of the holiday shopping. Consumers very eager to take advantage of the holiday bargains. In the Philippines, Christmas shopping begins in September. The less fortunates go to the mall just to look around, check out the window displays and simply enjoy the spirit of Christmas without buying anything. Life is very difficult to a lot of people in the old country. In spite of hardship, the less fortunates still manage to enjoy Christmas with their family.

Despite the fact that Christmas is celebrated differently around the world, it still remains a time of giving and of spending time with loved ones. Even though not everyone celebrates Christmas,






Ingredients:
