CRYSTAL LAKES NON-PROFIT NEEDS OFFICER NOMINATIONS

etails for the upcoming nominations and elections for the NON-PROFIT Executive Board will be discussed at the January 6th meeting. Here are the basic details in case you miss the meeting. The qualifications to run for a Non-Profit Association Board are few but firm:

- 1. You must have lived in the park for 1 year
- 2. You must be an Active member. Membership \$12.00 a year (a buck a month) and you get a card.

At the JANUARY CLUB HOUSE SOCIAL meeting, announcements will be made concerning the elections and the qualifications will be reiterated and nominations will be opened.

At the FEBRUARY CLUB HOUSE SOCIAL meeting, nominations will be presented. All nominees must be present to accept or reject and then the nominations will be closed. Anyone accepting a nomination will have 1 month to campaign throughout the park. Nominations will be closed at the end of this meeting. Elections will be held at the March meeting

If you are a CLUBHOUSE SOCIAL member, you are qualified to vote. One ballot (one vote) per <u>household</u> will be given for you to vote your choice.

Dues will remain at \$12 for the year for each home. Dues must be paid to vote at the March 2022 meeting. Anyone wishing to renew or to become a new member may pay their dues at the monthly CLUBHOUSE SOCIAL meetings starting in January. This 2022 membership will be good through February 2023.

VALENTINE JOKES

hat did one cat say to the other cat on Valentine's Day? "You're purr-fect."

MONTHLY RECIPE

Ingredients

- 4-6 cups Rice Chex cereal
- 1 8- oz bag Strawberry Candy Melts OR
- 1 bag of white chocolate baking chips {12 oz} AND
- 1 box of Strawberry Creme Jell-O Pudding** {pudding NOT gelatin!}
- Valentines M&M's and/or Sprinkles



Instructions

- 1. Measure out Chex cereal into a large bowl. Note: if you're using the Strawberry Candy Melts, you'll use 4 cups of cereal. If you're using the white chocolate chips + pudding mix, you'll use 6 cups of cereal.
- 2. Pour chocolate into a small glass dish. Add 1/2 tsp shortening, if desired, to help the chocolate coat the cereal easier. Microwave for 1 minute 20 seconds. Let sit in the microwave for 3 minutes. Remove and gently stir. If chocolate loves its shape and looks smooth, it's done. If not, return to the microwave in 15 second increments, letting it sit for 2-3 minutes each time, until melted and smooth.
- 3. If you used White Chocolate Chips + Pudding Mix: Add 4 TBSP of the strawberry creme pudding into the white chocolate and stir gently until smooth. Add 2 drops of red food coloring, if desired.
- 4. Pour the chocolate mixture over the Chex cereal and stir gently to coat.
- 5. Transfer cereal mixture to a large piece of wax paper. Sprinkle with M&M's and Valentines sprinkles, if desired. Let cool to set. Break pieces and store in an airtight container to save. Candy can be made up to 3-4 days ahead, if desired. It saves well!





Find the sweet spot

Some people know exactly what they want to do with their lives at an early age. Not Rebecca Stephens. The first British woman to summit Mount Everest came to mountaineering in her late 20s, after graduate school and years of working as a journalist.

A magazine assigned her to cover an expedition to the Himalayas. There she realized that her true goal in life was to climb to the peak of the highest

mountain in the world. So she quit her job and spent years working to fund a climbing expedition. The fear of dedicating herself to such a goal without a job, during a recession, and with a mortgage to pay was daunting, but she didn't let it stop her from pursuing her dream.

Since reaching the peak in 1993, Stephens has gone on to summit the "Seven Sisters," the highest peaks on every continent. Her advice to people still looking for their calling? "Don't panic. It's OK to explore. It's OK to try different things," she tells the Insider website. "It's a question of finding the sweet spot. But quite often if you follow what it is that really fulfills and interests you, the rest falls into place."

Still a champion

harlie Boswell was an all-American athlete who was offered professional contracts in both football and baseball. But when WWII erupted, Charlie enlisted in the military and was assigned to a tank division.

During a battle in Europe, a shell hit Charlie's tank. As the tank burned, he made sure everyone else got out safely, but then a second shell hit, throwing him 50 feet, breaking his bones and burning his body.

After a weeklong coma, Charlie woke up in a hospital and learned that he'd be blind for the rest of his life. Refusing to be discouraged, he worked hard at his rehabilitation, learning to live in a world of darkness.

One day a friend came to visit him. "Would you like to play some golf?" he asked.

"How in the world can I hit a golf ball when I can't even see it?" Charlie asked, but the friend was persistent. He took Charlie to a golf course, showed him how to hold and swing a club, and let him hit the ball.

Charlie's first drive traveled 200 yards straight down the fairway.

Charlie began training, and slowly his abilities improved. Ultimately Charlie won a world championship, shooting a 38 on nine holes.

The moral, as the Conscious Panda website puts it: There is always an alternate route if you just have the will to find it.

Lack of knowledge fuels health care worries


