Traveling Safely Within The Park

My wife Kathy and I have lived at our home on 1st Street since January of 2006 and when we first arrived neither of us are certain as to just how few 'golf carts' there were. Our recollection is ONE. At the same time our Thursday morning Bike Parades regularly exceeded 70 people at the clubhouse with three to four dozen riders. In addition, each evening (weather permitting), there were a dozen or so of us who together would tour the streets of Gateway chatting among ourselves and waving our greetings to others. There were also singles but mostly couples enjoying an evening ride. There were seldom concerns for safety on these occasions, even in the dark, due to the size of the group and the fact that several had lights, front and rear, to alert car drivers to our presence.

There is no question that Gateway is well lit but from my personal experience and that of others I have spoken with there are occasions where dark clothed people and unlit bikes and golf carts appear to be nothing more than 'shadows in moonlight.' As the daytime temperatures begin to climb, people will be inclined to walk and ride after sunset and with the very limited twilight the full darkness of 'night' comes on quickly. For walkers and bikers who have discovered that the cheap, often defective battery lights are simply junk, you should consider that Home Depot has a selection of 'reflective' safety vests available for less than \$5.00. Quality bike lights are \$15 - \$20 a set, but will continue well beyond the few months of high humidity and the single battery exchange typical for those available at the 'flea markets.'

There has been the addition of numbers of various motorized chairs and motor scooters. Those residents using these at any time to move about on the streets are encouraged to have bright reflective vests and their chair/scooter should be illuminated or at the very least contain continued on page 8

reflectors or bright red, orange or yellow reflective tape so as to alert auto/truck/SUV drivers to your presence. And because Gateway does not have sidewalks your motorized chair or personal travel scooter should be operated as a 'motor vehicle', on the right side of the streets.

Remember that single golf cart in 2006. I counted 30 scattered around and throughout our Gateway community. They can be observed at all hours day and night traveling about the streets (where else can they go) on various Gateway errands, chores and visits or simply to 'take a ride.' My main concern is that their presence on the street is not always apparent and the fact that they are 'electric silent', 'speedy' and not always well lit can present a hazard, especially to those on foot or biking when approached from behind. Golf cart operators are therefore requested to take special care when approaching walkers and bikers from behind and please have lights illuminated when traveling about the park after dark.

Dog owners should also consider placing reflective tape on their animal's collar. Should they escape your home, especially at night, it could save their life from the wheels of a vehicle and would also make them easier to identify and recover.

At the same time, exercise walkers and dog walkers should wear light colored clothing after dark and consider purchasing and wearing reflective safety vests. Remember to walk on the side of the street facing oncoming traffic, that golf cart, quiet car or even a bike approaching you from behind doesn't stand a chance to avoid you or stop as you or your pet suddenly move further into the street.

Bike riders, my wife and I are among them, should ride the right side of the street and have lights ON front and rear after dark.

Please stay observant and aware of what is in front and behind you as you move about our Gateway Streets this summer. Night time especially, but being aware that during the day is when visitors to the park are most likely to be on our streets walking to and from the pool area.

I wish to thank the late Virginia Ehrman of 1st Street for suggesting this Gateway safety issue related column be written.



It is important to understand you should not rely on the thought that someone else may report that someone you are aware of has died. We would much rather be told several times than neglect to have them mentioned.


During the service a eulogy will be given, and an opportunity will be provided for relatives and friends to speak.


