vell, appears we're experiencing another COVID 'surge' as this article goes to print. Since many of us remain concerned as the corona virus mutates, consult the following websites for accurate information:

Bottom-line: Florida Executive Order 2021-19 remains in effect – "no county or municipality may renew or enact an emergency order or ordinance . . . that imposes restrictions or mandates upon businesses or individuals due to the COVID-19 emergency."

Will continue to actively review these sites to ensure the safety of our Residents and thereby assure we remain a *premier 'active' 55+ Resident owned community*.

The Ninth Covenant of the New Resident Orientation covers trash, rubbish, and garbage. This Covenant states:

All garbage, and the like must be placed at the street side of the home no earlier than 6 PM on the day prior to the scheduled pick up along with aluminum cans for recycling, that are to be placed in bags. Pickup for garbage is Tuesday and Friday and all trash must be bagged and by the street prior to 8 AM. All trimmings from shrubbery, trees and all articles more than four (4) feet in length must be securely tied in bundles. Yard or lawn debris is picked up on Monday.

This Covenant is one of the few that is simple to grasp. However, placing out prior to 7:00am is not recommended as the critters tend to violate the plastic bags. Your Maintenance Team takes pride in completing this task as soon as possible on Tuesday and Friday mornings. Usually, they complete before 9:00am. Please – cooperate with their quick completion and have your pickup ready before 8:00am.

Initiative Updates:

1-2022 Budget constraints have impacted the Floor Committee, chaired by Tom Wichmann, and this project may be delayed a year due to 2022 Budget constraints.

2 - ARO Engineering is completing the Engineer Survey for the North and South Boat Ramp Renovation Project with the final document sure to meet expectations. Mike Arkanoff continues to chair this effort.

3 - The MAROA Board received the seawall report from J. Foster Consulting in early December. The MAROA Board will review their recommendations and prepare a future strategy that accounts for our fiscal realities.

4 – The WEBSITE Committee, chaired by Phil Quince, continues to make strides in converting to a 'new' webpage that contains necessary Americana Cove information and remains user friendly.

5 - The Land Survey Committee awaits the Amendment 3 results – looking for a 99% approval – to determine whether or not to seek a suitable Survey Company that possesses the correct ST 719 legal experience.

6–The Tiki Hut Roof Committee will continue to develop options for other types of roofing through the next fiscal year.

7 – The Kitchen Committee is forecasting items to meet their \$2000 budget for this fiscal year, and await budget projections for the future.

8 – Again, as tax season is upon us: Free tax preparation provided by IRS certified tax preparers, organized by our own Cove resident, Dr. Judy Hall. Tax preparation will be provided by appointment for dates in February and March 2022.

You can save money as in many cases the Maintenance Team and our repair service associates fix these problems quickly and inexpensively. To reach the Manager during business hours – call 727-526-9141. During non-business hours – call 727-527-3329 (Gate Staff). Your repair costs will NOT be covered, if you fail to contact the Manager first.








Buddhism

Helping Hands: More Ways to Welcome 2022

Tere are even more ways to welcome the new year:

- Make simple food swaps. For healthier eating, try substituting low-fat Greek yogurt in place of sour cream on burritos; spread avocado on sandwiches instead of mayo; swap a sprinkling of nuts (such as walnuts or pistachios) instead of croutons on your salad; blend a frozen banana with ½ cup of berries as an alternative to ice cream.
- Seek out some inspiration. Watch a documentary or movie about someone who overcomes a challenge like training for a marathon or overcoming an injury. You will be inspired to get out there and deal with your challenges!
- Kick yourself out of the house. The natural light you get can help you de-stress. Take a short walk or just soak up some fresh air and sunshine. You will feel recharged and ready for the day.
- Choose an audio call. Phoning a friend may seem like a no-brainer, but new research show that phone calls create stronger bonds between people than emails or texts. Make time each week to connect with these people on the phone, Zoom or in person. Doing so will calm your nervous system.
- Make habits hold hands. If you're trying to start a new behavior, try incorporating it into something you already do to make it more automatic. If your brain is already trained for a specific habit and you add something to it, you'll be more likely to adopt that change quickly.
- Be picky. Between virtual board meetings, chauffeuring your friends and grocery shopping, it's easy to get over committed. When you say yes or no to an invitation or request, take a moment to reflect on whether it moves you closer to who and where you want to be in your life or away from what's most important to you. Remember, you're not a machine, and you may not be able to do everything you want to, and that's OK.

How many home shoppers visited in 2021?

By Barefoot Realty Group, Brokerage Agent for Americana Cove

total of 367 home shoppers visited the sales office during 2021 with 232 visitors who made appointments while 135 were walk-ins—potential buyers who stopped during posted business hours to learn more about community and tour homes for sale.



In comparison, a total of 306 people visited the sales office in 2020. In 2019, our records show 508 people visited, which was the last year before the COVID pandemic hit the U.S. Lower traffic in the past two years is also attributed to fewer homes for sale. The community is averaging five homes for sale as compared to 10 homes prior to the pandemic.

Even though there were less visitors in the past two years, the people who visited were buyers as homes sales have been higher than at any other time. Forty-seven homes were sold in 2021 as compared to 46 sales in 2020 and 41 sales in 2019.

In addition to visitors who came during posted sales hours or by appointment, the gate staff also distributed marketing information about the community after posted hours. In 2021, the gate staff distributed 212 folders or an average of 17 folders per month as compared to 178 folders in 2020.

"Distributing folders at the gate was actually an idea the staffers requested," explained Broker Marty Pozgay. "They would have a carload of visitors eager to tour the community, but they couldn't get in to drive around. Having material about the community to give to visitors so they can make an appointment is a win-win for both gate staffers and visitors as it leaves a positive impression."

The distribution of materials also assists the sales office with fine-tuning its business hours. The new hours on the weekends are 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. instead of noon to 3 p.m. as more people were visiting prior to noon than were visiting between 2 and 3 p.m. Week-day hours remain 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. in season from November to April and 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. in off season, which is May through October. The sales office is also open by appointment, which can be at any time of day, for the convenience of the visitor.
