NOTES FROM THE BAY RANCH OFFICE

Announcement from Carol Alvey, Manager

Parking a boat, rv, and trailer, etc., in the utility right of way just north of the clubhouse comes with rules: all vehicles must be registered with the office, and only one vehicle per coach is allowed. Some vehicles which were parked there years ago have never moved. More concerning are vehicles that have never been registered in the office, including multiple vehicles parked by a single resident. If you are an offender, remove all extra vehicles and get your allowable one vehicle registered. Also, please note: no storage sheds. IF RULES ARE NOT FOLLOWED, USE OF LOT WILL BE DISCONTINUED.

Overflowing garbage containers are also a problem. The Largo Sanitation Department is very strict about too full garbage containers. They use automatic picker-upper-and-dumpers (or whatever they're called) that will not work when the garbage containers are too full, so the workers will do one of 2 things: they may just not empty the over-full container, or they will push the extra garbage off the top and charge the park double. Just a reminder: Extra charges

lead to increasing rents.

All garbage must be put in the bins behind the clubhouse. Do not put it on the ground. The garbage trucks empty the bins on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, but there are no set times.

Rent for 2022 is a \$25 increase. Tenants who have dogs in a non-pet section must have a doctor's prescription for a service dog, papers on service dog AND must pay the same rent amount as people who live in the pet section, \$650 on beginning January 1, 2022.

NO TV's or other electronics in the dumpsters, please. Pinellas County has a program for disposing of these items.

PLEASE follow all rules and regulations. Violators will receive a written notice of violation. Three violations of the same rule is grounds for eviction.

THE POOL: No floats are allowed in the pool. Noodles are allowed.

If you use an umbrella, fold it up when you leave the pool. Do not use when it is windy.

• Pool will be renovated/repaired and will be closed during renovation, scheduled for March 2020.

BE SAFE! Break ins and theft have been occurring in the park recently. Keep your stuff put away, your doors locked, and don't answer your door to strangers. Report any suspicious activity the police and to management.

TO REDUCE SPEEDING through the park, the back gate will be closed 24/7. If you need

TO REDUCE SPEEDING through the park, the back gate will be closed 24/7. If you need an opener, contact Carol in the office. The speed limit is 15 mph.

THE PINELLAS COUNTY Humane Society is AGAIN investigating numerous cat poisonings in our park. Poisoning any animal is a federal felony punishable by up to 1 year in jail. It is also inhumane and causes the animal to suffer. Don't do it.

PLEASE DON'T FEED STRAYCATS.

PROTECT YOUR BELONGINGS. Residents have reported stolen landscape decorations, tricycles, etc. Lock up tempting items or install a motion detector light to deter thieving thugs. Also, consider reporting late night walkers.

COMPLAINTS AGAINST YOUR NEIGHBOR MUST BE IN WRITING AND SIGNED.

Give the written complaint to the office or drop it in the mail slot in the office door. Verbal and unsigned complaints cannot be addressed.

MANAGEMENT WILL ALSO ADDRESS COMPLAINTS ONLY IN WRITING.

Rules: The Park has rules that everyone received and reviewed when they bought or rented their coach. They are also printed annually in the Directory (September issue of Bay Ranch Review). Please read and follow them. Failure to follow rules is grounds for eviction, and management has shown that it is willing to evict.

Rules commonly broken:

- 1. Parking on grass or sidewalk, overnight on street, and/or every day.
- 2. Parking overnight at the Clubhouse without Office authorization.
 - 3. Failing to register at the office all persons living with you.

4. Piling garbage in front of garbage bins. When you throw garbage, throw it to the back so when you open the door, it doesn't fall out and there is space.

5. Failure to maintain, paint and/or clean mobile home, trim, awnings, planter and driveway.



Sewage remains an intractable problem. Drains continue to back up because grease, vinyl/rubber gloves, paper towels and other inappropriate items are flushed. Bay Ranch will not pay to unclog sewers when the clog is caused by inappropriate items put down the sewer. The tenant will have to pay for this problem.

Eds. Note: It is inappropriate to flush anything other than toilet paper, and doing so causes costly sewer clogs. If the park pays, we all will ultimately, through rent increases.

Also, those so-called flushable personal cleansing cloths are really **NOT FLUSHABLE**. They do not disintegrate in the sewer system, and they WILL clog the sewer someplace in the system. Lots of people like to use these cloths in the bathroom, but PLEASE do not put them in the toilet. Limit what goes into the toilet to toilet paper. Eds. Note: My housemates and I had to hire a plumber when our own drain system clogged due to dishwasher detergent that was not well dissolved. We had virtual rocks of detergent blocking the drain. Our solution (after paying the plumber): liquid detergent.

Those metal electric service boxes behind each mobile home belong to Duke Energy. Please do not service or pay to service them yourself.

Call Duke Energy or Carol Alvey (see her cell phone number at the front of the Review) if your electric needs service. Why? Well, in a couple of instances, residents have submitted bills for about \$4,500 for service. If the repair is the park's responsibility, we have an electrician who will do the work for \$1,500. It just makes economic sense.

From the box to the mobile home is the resident's responsibility. Please make your own arrangements with an electrician if that area needs repair. The office can tell you if the repair is your responsibility.



Homeless people are moving into the park. In one instance, an empty coach was left unlocked and homeless people had moved in. In several instances, people have been sleeping in the driveways/patios of empty

homes. And others have been sleeping on the shuffleboard courts, sometimes using cushions from outside the clubhouse for mattresses.

Please watch out for your neighbor and neighborhood. If you see someone entering a home you know to be empty, or someone sitting or sleeping in that home's driveway/patio, or any other inappropriate behavior of this type, please call the Largo police. It is ok in this case to use 911 because you don't know what the danger is.



Cars left parked on the street after midnight will be towed. This is expensive and inconvenient. This is another opportunity to be a good neighbor:by reminding someone whose car is in the street after 10 pm. \

Cars parked on the street during the day should be staggered so emergency vehicles can pass by. Do not park on the grass or sidewalk.

You must register at the office and give a copy of the title to the manager if you have something parked in the field north of the clubhouse. Wayne will show you where to park after you register.

- * Please, put ALL garbage in the dumpsters, even big and heavy items like furniture.
- * DO NOT dump behind, beside or anywhere near the trash bins. Put the garbage in the bins.
- *Put household trash in the smaller trash bins.
- * Do not bring garbage to the bins on Monday morning. By that time, the bins are overflowing. Wait until Monday afternoon or later, when the bins are empty.
- * Pick up for furniture, tree brush/limbs and other debris will be on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday only. Put out trash after 5:00 p.m, the day before.

*DO NOT DISPOSE OF TVS OR ELECTRONICS IN THE PARK. DO NOT PUT THEM IN OR BESIDE THE DUMPSTER. We get fined. Call pinellascounty.org/recycle to dispose of them.

*If you need help disposing of something, someone in the park may help you for a fee **Larger families and visitors:** Reminder: that rent is based on one or two household. Each person above the two must pay an additional \$30 a month, including visitors who stay over 30 days. Please be proactive about this and pay the money without first being reminded.

The following information remains in force:



Fires: Test your smoke detectors to make sure they work. Recommended action: purchase a fire extinguisher if you don't have one and know how to work it. If a fire starts, spray it with the fire extinguisher immediately and GET OUT OF THE HOUSE. Fire destroys mobile homes very quickly..



Management requests that you turn off your water heater when the water is off, to prevent the element from burning out. Eds. Note: According to diy.stackexchange. com/questions/3766, this needs to be empty. Tankless heaters don't need this.

Other announcements:

The stoves in the kitchen both work.

The purified water dispenser at the clubhouse operates on its own schedule. After someone has filled containers, it may take the dispenser some time to regenerate enough water for more containers. There is a light on the dispenser that tells whether it is ready.

Some have questioned why the application fee is "so high." One reason is to help cover garbage fees, since new owners usually throw away most of the furniture and electronics.

Mr. Larson (the owner) calls the lawn service for lawn care on an as-needed basis. The

park pays for lawn mowing, etc., once a month but the need sometimes goes unnoticed. If you notice the lawn needs trimming, please let the office know so they can call Mr. Larson.

Sometimes an automobile will leak oil onto our new, nice looking pavement, creating an eyesore. If you notice a leak by your house, call the office to have it cleaned up. Let's keep these streets looking nice!

Lost and Found Dog/Cat: If you have found a dog or cat, you can post on a site called <u>pawboost.com</u> or call Animal Service on Walsingham. If you call, Animal Services will come out, free of charge, to pick up an animal.

While I'm complaining, let me say this:




As usual, some of this column is my opinion and my stories, some is found and copied from internet articles. Hope you enjoy it.



ODDS AND ENDS

ntonio Brown's bizarre exit from an NFL game between the Tampa Bay Buccaneers-New York Jets at MetLife Stadium in East Rutherford, N.J. January 2nd while the contest was still in progress in the third quarter reminded me of a scene from the movie "Slap Shot."

That movie starring Paul Newman came out in the 1970s. Newman played Reggie Dunlop as the playing coach of the Charlestown Chiefs and he instructed his players to play "goon hockey." One member, Ned Braden, played by Micheal Ontkean, refused and after sulking on the bench for a few shifts skated out on the ice and to music started striping down his gear piece by piece and tossed it one by one into the crowd.

Brown's meltdown showed him taking off his sweater and shoulder pads and leaving them on the ground near the Tampa Bay bench along the sidelines. As he strolled through the end zone towards the exit he took off his gloves tossing them into the stands. Then he ripped off his sweatshirt, rolled up in a ball and heaved it to the fans. After a few waves to the crowd Brown disappeared down the tunnel.

Unfortunately, the Brown exit was no scene from a movie or for a future movie. And there was no music when he peeled off his gear. It was real, and that's the sad part. It was embarrassing not only to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers but to the National Football League in general. After all, the incident was not only shown live on television at the time but has been has replayed over and over on national TV networks and has been a hot topic on social media around the world for days.

The outbreak was just another chapter in the Antonia Brown saga as a professional football player. Despite the fact that he is a talented player when he wants to be, he has also been a problem with his antics both on and off the field. He was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 2010 and wore out his welcome by 2019 so that they traded him to the Oakland Raiders. However, he never played a game for the Raiders as he was cut before the season opener.

Brown quickly landed with the New England Patriots, but after one game he was gone due some activity he had encountered off the field.

In 2020 Brown signed on with Tampa Bay. But before he could play for the Bucs, he had to serve an eight-game suspension stemming from multiple violations of the NFL's personal conduct policy which included sexual misconduct and burglary along with battery. He eventually joined the Buccaneers after the suspension. and would earn a NFL Championship ring as Tampa Bay dethroned the defending champion Kansas City Chiefs.

This season, Brown had to sit out a three-game suspension for misrepresenting his Covid-19 vaccination status. Then there was his latest meltdown witnessed over and over by millions.

He is no longer a member of the Buccaneers, as the club terminated his contract with one regular season game remaining plus the playoffs. He's free to go anywhere, so it will be interesting to see if there are any more clubs willing to take a chance. Brown has had four chances now and he's blown every one.

Does he deserve a fifth chance? In my opinion, no. However, don't be surprised if he lands with some club next season or during the off-season. There are 28 other NFL clubs out there he hasn't played for. Maybe one more team will give him the opportunity.

At 33 years old and with a haunting track record, especially off the field, time is running out on the wide receiver. I would like to see the NFL or the Player's Association step in and give him the help he needs, as he definitely has a problem, a big problem. Hopefully, Antonio Brown will get that help and soon. Going to another club is not answer.
