I want to make sure that everyone is on the same page. And of course if you have any questions you may contact the main office for clarification.

*Household trash is picked up Mondays and Thursdays. You are limited to no more than 5 bags and will be picked up between 7AM and 7PM.

*Yard trimming must be bagged or bundled to be taken with the household trash on Thursdays.

*Furniture is picked up on Thursdays with the regular household trash.

*Construction material is not picked up by trash company. You will need to contact the main office at 727-584-8684 and request a dumpster. We have 2 small dumpsters. Upon request, the dumpster will be brought out (most likely you will be told if one is available) the next morning between 9AM and 10AM and will be picked up the day after at the same time. Teakwood Village is only allowing 24 hours for the dumpster so that everyone has the same opportunity to use it for lawn clean up or renovations on homes.

* Electronics, paint, chemicals, etc. are no longer picked up by Teakwood Village. You will need to take them to the Chemical Collection Center yourself. You can find the location at http:// www.pinellascounty.org/solidwate/hec3 or call 727-464-7500 for the collection center and they will be able to answer your questions about chemical and electronics disposal.







Recipes of the Month by Dee Potenti

Oven Roast with Leeks and Red Potatoes

2-3 lbs beef oven roast1 tab. Montreal steak seasoning2 large leeks, sliced2 lbs. baby red potatoes, halved2 tsp. fresh thyme leaves, chopped2 cups reduced- sodium beef broth



Preheat oven 350 degrees

Season roast with Montreal seasoning. Place roast on roasting rack with leeks, potatoes, thyme and beef broth.

Bake 2 hours till meat is tender

Slow cooker Chicken Thighs

- 8 boneless skinless thighs1/3 cup honey6 garlic cloves1 inch piece of ginger peeled and minced
- 1/3 cup ketchup 2 tab cornstarch
- 1/3 cup of soy sauce 1 teas. toasted sesame seeds
- chopped scallions and cooked white rice for serving

Spray with pam your crock pot

In glass mixing bowl whisk honey, ketchup, soy sauce, garlic and ginger pour over chicken.

Cover and cook 5 to 6 hours. Turn off the heat uncover, let rest for 10 minutes. For thicker sauce, take chicken out set aside covered to



keep warm. Then turn the slow cooker to high stir in the cornstarch, and 2 tab. of cold water stir until it resembles heavy cream. Put chicken back in the crock pot and cook until thicker and bubbling about 20-25 minutes.

Once done pour over white rice and add your sesame seeds and scallions sprinkled on top and enjoy.


