





Scoring on Ladies Day – As I am writing this article, we just finished our first day of league play, and had to throw out many of the scorecards for the Funday and Prize Money games. *Remember ladies, all score cards must be signed and attested!* If a card is not, all players on that card are disqualified from receiving prize money. Even if the above is done, a player whose score is not recorded correctly is not entitled to prize money. This includes subtracting the handicap number from the gross score to give the net score. Ensure your numbers are legible. We are only human and it is often hard to decipher some of the scores.

Golf/Tip Rule of the month – Did you know that you can incur a two-stroke penalty if you place your ball in the wrong place when teeing off. Many players, both new and old, make a mistake and place their ball in front of the tee blocks. There is a specific place that you can place your ball within the teeing area, although the player herself may stand outside the teeing area. Please see the diagram below (obtained from the USGA Rules of golf) for the correct ball placement and what constitutes the teeing area.



A ball is in the teeing area when any part of the ball touches or is above part of the teeing area.


