Just a few reminders about the clubhouse. As you enter the clubhouse in the coming months with the highly contagious variant of COVID it is recommended for your safety to wear a mask until you are seated. Hopefully this alert will soon become a thing of the past. For now, in my opinion, it is the best safety measure to protect us all as anyone of us could be asymptomatic.

The clubhouse is available for private parties. However please contact me with your date of preference; remember until I receive the Clubhouse Agreement Request form the date is not confirmed. This form is necessary to manage the use of the clubhouse. If another event is schedule on your requested date, I will contact all parties and see if an amicable solution can be arranged. The form is available in the bin by the Directors Office or on the mybriarcreek. com website. Because it is available only to registered residents of Briar Creek I you will need to access the "Access your Community" section of the website. Click on the Documents page and select Forms & Application page. The form can be returned to me directly or placed into the mail slot of the director's office. You will receive confirmation from me as soon as possible. To gain access to the "Access your Community" section of the website click forgot password and the website manager will confirm your identify and provide you with access as soon as possible.

When you use the clubhouse and its amenities, please use them as you would in your own home and leave things as you find them. Supplies are available to all of our community residents. If you see the supplies are low, please contact me so I can arrange to have the supplies are replenished. Supplies are located in the Storage room next to the kitchen or in the Janitorial closet adjacent to the kitchen. Please be aware our clubhouse and the surrounding recreation area is under camera surveillance.

T motional Support Animals

Pets can be a great comfort to us as we get older. For that reason Briar Creek II has a pet section which allows pets with certain restrictions. However there are times where someone may need the emotional support a pet can bring. The support animal must conform to the same restrictions as the Pet Section of the community. Briar Creek II has a process where emotional support animals are allowed, only after approval by the Board.

We will need paperwork from a medical professional that states the following:

- Verifies that you have a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities
- Describes your need for a reasonable accommodation to keep an assistance/support animal in your home
- Shows the relationship between your disability and the need for the assistance/support animal

After the accommodation is approved, the resident must provide a photo of the animal, proof of current immunizations and proper licensing by Pinellas County and again at each renewal/revaccination.

Please remember, the animal should be leashed, under your control and not be allowed on private property of your neighbors. If feasible the animal should be walked in the Pet Section of Briar Creek II. Remember to clean up after your pet and dispose of it properly. The animal should not create a nuisance or unreasonably disturb the peaceful enjoyment of the community.

If for some reason, you no longer have your support animal and wish to have another one, you must repeat the approval process from the Condo Board.

We are doing an audit of the emotional support animals in Briar Creek II. If you have an emotional support animal, please contact Bonnie Briggs, so we can make sure all your documents are up to date. If you have not submitted the appropriate documentation, we will ask you to submit them so we have a record of your support animal.

The extra room on the shelves will give us space for new donations and give BC2 regular readers and library users new books to check out.


We think the library would benefit from the donation of more large print books, but please remember that we don't accept cookbooks or textbooks.

Tpdate in your BC Resident and Phone Directory for March 2022

House sales continue to be strong and that means changes for the Directory. Right now, the draft text for next year's edition is with the printer and I will still be able to make any changes that I receive before the printer sends me the final draft of the text to review. By the time you are reading this copy of the Media however, the text of the 2022-2023 edition will be set in stone.

After I received advance notice a few months ago that certain areas of Florida with high populations are now required to use area codes even for local calls, I've been trying hard to include the area code in all the BC2 listings in light of the fast increase in the population in the Tampa Bay area. Including the area code has proved to be difficult. Using the current format and print size this would mean an unacceptable increase in the number of pages the BC2 listing requires. The alternative of reducing the size of the print suggests that reading the Directory could be a problem for some of us. For this year therefore we are printing the Directory in the usual format. With any luck we will resolve this problem before the population growth in Tampa Bay and the surrounding area means that we will have to start dialing 10 digits for local calls.

Meanwhile here are the most recent changes you will see in the 2022-2023 edition of the Directory.

Some Random Thoughts on Trees

Jody Larson

• People love Briar Creek because of the trees. Most big trees, especially oaks, have been here for over 40 years and have done just fine in many big storms.



- Florida does not license tree cutters. Just because a guy has a truck with a sign on it and some equipment does not mean he knows how to cut trees—or that he has liability or injury insurance. Use only ISA Certified Arborists. They are trained and insured.
- You can find Certified Arborists by Zip code at www.treesaregood.org. Most Certified Arborists also advertise their certification.
- Never use a tree cutter who offers or recommends "topping" or "rounding." This practice damages and kills trees.
- Leaves are part of living with trees. You can get leaves from a tree 100 feet away, so don't think cutting down that one next to your home will eliminate leaves in your rain gutters.
- You can trim branches of a neighbor's tree that cross your property line, but only up to the property line, and you cannot go onto their property for this purpose. All lots here are surveyed, so the property line is not halfway in between the homes. If you damage the tree, you could be legally liable for up to three times the replacement cost.
- If you have a problem with a neighbor's tree, talk to your neighbor. This can lead to a friendly solution rather than a fistfight.


The humane society and the Haven also don't accept sheets. Remember that if your linens are in good condition, we sell them at our bazaar.


