# Manager's Message

Spring will be upon us on the 21st and that means 'Spring Cleanin' as Granny on the Beverly Hillbillies used to say. Now, we shouldn't go as far as Granny cleaned – haul everything inside to the outside. So, please, check your roof, awnings, and siding for stains and mildew; cut and weed the flower beds; trim hedges; and tidy up carports. Many Residents understand this routine as they prepare to depart for colder climes in April and May. Your Street Captain has a checklist and will provide a courtesy review of your Home prior to the Community Manager inspecting in April. Last year, these Spring Cleanings kept the Cove appealing through the Summer and allow us to maintain our status as a *premier 'active' 55+ Resident owned community*.

The **Tenth Covenant** of the New Resident Orientation concerns parking. This Covenant states:

No vehicles are allowed to park on the streets at any time (Fire Dept. Regulations). Guests may park in the carport of resident they are visiting or in designated areas. Emergency vehicles must be able to get through.

Sounds pretty straight forward, but we still see Residents and guests parking on streets, on grass, and in open areas. Please – remember the *Golden Rule* and follow this Parking Covenant. The Community Manager can allow parking on open lots and grass, when required under special circumstances. From experience, 99% of the time it's not a special circumstance . . . and that concludes reviewing all Ten Covenants.

Renovation Project with the final document sure to meet expectations. In the meantime, placing signs marking the end of the ramp, marking high tide, and noting that the safest time to launch/load is during high tides.

- 2. The MAROA Board received the seawall report from J. Foster Consulting in early December. The MAROA Board has reviewed their recommendations and is preparing a future strategy that accounts for our fiscal realities.
- 3. The WEBSITE Committee, chaired by Phil Quince, continues to make strides in converting to a 'new' web page that contains necessary Americana Cove information and remains user friendly.
- 4. The Land Survey Committee will be seeking a company that possesses the correct ST 719 legal
- 5. experience to survey the Cove now that Amendment 3 failed to secure the necessary Resident agreement to lower the share total to 720.
- 6. The Tiki Hut Roof Committee will continue to develop options for other types of roofing through the next fiscal year. This committee developed a plan and is delivering refurbished chairs at considerable savings \$85 versus \$375 per chair.
- 7. The Dog Park will be receiving a renovation as Residents stepped up to conduct fundraising for sod, irrigation, and beautification. Thanks to Mary & Sparty for leading this effort along with Camille & Bilbo, Janis & Cooper, Diane & Sheba, and Shelley & Teddy.
- 8. Again, as tax season is upon us: Free tax preparation provided by IRS certified tax preparers, organized by our own Cove resident, Dr. Judy Hall. Tax preparation will be provided by appointment for dates in March 2022.

Continue to experience dog issues throughout the Cove. Please, clean up after them. And, most importantly, walk your dog within five feet of the street. If dog owners followed these two procedures, then we can solve 95% of the dog related issues.

Please – feel free to contact the Manager with any improvement ideas. Your comments ensure we . . . build Americana Cove into a premier 'active' 55+ Resident owned community.



On March 10, we will be discussing <u>THE MIDNIGHT LIBRARY</u> by Matt Haig, hosted by Nanette Kruger

Nora Seed decides she isn't cut out for life. She just lost her job and cat, had fallen out with her brother and best friend and generally assumes she's a giant disappointment. So she decides to die.

Nora wakes up in the Midnight Library. She is greeted by Mrs. Elm who explains she has been given the opportunity to decide how she wants to live. In the Library there are endless shelves of books, each offering her a reality option of her choice for the outcome.

Nora finds herself faced with the possibility of changing her life for a new one, following a different career, undoing old breakups, realizing her dreams of becoming a glaciologist. She must search within herself as she travels through the Midnight Library to decide what is truly fulfilling in life, and what makes it worth living in the first place.

The first few lives Nora tries are those that free her from her biggest regrets. What if she had never given up swimming - turns out she would have made it to the Olympics, and her dad would have been married to a woman he met at a swim meet, not Nora's mother. What if she had married her fiance, Dan, instead of calling off the wedding two days beforehand - turns out she'd be living with a mean alcoholic who couldn't stand that she knew more than him, and was also cheating on her. What if she had moved to Australia with her best friend instead of bailing to stay behind in England - she'd still be there, but her friend would have died in a car accident. What if she had become a glaciologist – she'd be very cold and almost eaten for lunch by a giant, menacing polar bear. What if her band had signed with a recording label - she would have made it really big but her brother would no longer be part of that band because he died of an overdose.

Not all of the lives Nora tries on are so meaningful: In one, she argues with people on Twitter all day. In others, she's a travel vlogger, a chess champion, a vegan powerlifter; she's a cat-sitter; she's on her third husband and already bored. She drops into new lives, again and again, awaiting for the one that makes her want to stay. She realizes that it is not the lives we regret not living that are the real problem. It is the regret itself. It is the regret that makes us shrivel and wither and feel like our own and other people's worst enemy.

Nora visits what is clearly the best alternative in her life: the one in which she marries a cute surgeon with whom she has a daughter, she writes a book, and is as content as she could hope.

As Mrs. Elm reminds her: "Never underestimate the big importance of small things."

Nora muses: "It is quite a revelation to discover that the place you wanted to escape to is the exact same place you escaped from. That the prison wasn't the place, but the perspective."

We hope to see you at our next luncheon, March 16th Bring your neighbor, friend or "other half". We would like to grow our membership.



Our next meeting is March 2nd at 9:30 AM in the Atrium.






