



SOUTHWIND'S PET BED PROJECT WAS A HUGE SUCCESS!

n Saturday, February 12th, the Clubhouse quickly filled up with generous donations. The volume of your donations was overwhelming! We had tables full of sheets, towels, blankets, foam pads, quilts, bedspreads, and pet beds (too much to even keep count) – it was unbelievable! Volunteers worked hard to list, sort, stack, sew, cut and fabricate usable beds for this project. Our goal was to make 20 beds. We distributed over 60 beds to our local shelters and rescue groups.



SPCA Tampa Bay – Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals located at 9099 130th Ave. N, Largo, FL was one of the recipients of our Pet Bed Project. This organization rescues, shelters and adopts out hundreds of animals ranging from Iguanas, to guinea pigs and hamsters, cats, dogs, goats and they even have a shelter stall for horses! Southwind's Donation Form receipt lists a brief description of: "truckload of dog beds, blankets and towels".

Maggie Griscavage, HOA Board member, took her truck loaded with bags and boxes, filled with our donations. It filled their cart/ wagon to barely have room for the driver. The SPCA gave Southwind HOA a Certificate of Appreciation. Maggie said there were enough pet beds/ pads to fill an entire row of kennels in the shelter! There were huge bags and boxes of sheets and towels, and at least 40 beds/ crate pads. There were blankets, some large enough to cover a horse! The attached photo of the cart/ wagon says it all.

Suncoast Animal League, located at 1030 Pennsylvania Ave. in Palm Harbor, has a Thrift Store. The income from items sold is used to pay for food and medicines for the animals they rescue that are placed in foster homes. They have a small shelter for intake, until the animal is placed. Their shelter can always use towels, and has a wish list on their website.

Southwind's Pet Bed Project donated over 25 beds/ pads to be sold at the Thrift Store. One donation was a large elevated bed, which sells for \$60 - \$100 at pet stores. Another large bed was new (barely used) and it sells for about the same. Anything that doesn't sell can be used in their shelter, or given to foster homes. Website: <u>www.suncoastanimalleague.org</u> Karen Ragsdale, HOA Board Member, filled her car with beds/pads and towels that stacked about 4 feet high. It filled her car.

This event was supported by our HOA Board and was not a fundraiser, but rather a pet loving Community effort to help local animal shelters. This Project was created in loving memory of and to honor our beloved pets that have passed away.

A letter from our HOA went with the donations. It read: "Our Southwind MHP Community values and appreciates your work and dedication to the rescue and caring for animals that would most likely perish from hunger, illness, or neglect without your help and support. We are a pet loving community located in Palm Harbor, FL. Please accept our donations of pet bedding and towels to help you in your mission of caring for these animals"


