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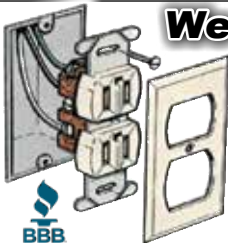

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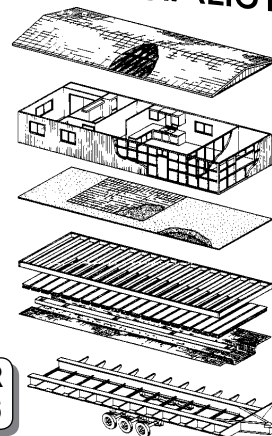
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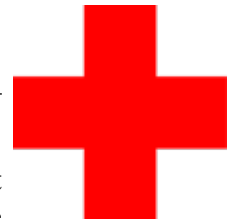

### DEFIBRILLATOR AND CPR CLASS

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**MARCH 2, 2022, AT 10 am IN THE CLUBHOUSE**

**E**very even-numbered year we offer the American Red Cross Heart Saver program. Our instructor is Dale Cheatham, retired chief of the Largo Emergency Service.

Come learn how to save a life. When someone has a heart stoppage, every minute is vitally important. The EMTs from Largo Rescue have a response time from a 911 call of about 5 minutes. Our ability to reduce this by even a couple of minutes could be the difference between life and death. That's the purpose of the Automatic External Defibrillator (AED).

The class will provide instruction on using the AED, doing CPR and general first aid.

There is a sign-up sheet on the clubhouse bulletin board. Sign-ups are necessary because we need to register everyone as an in-house first responder to maintain our license. Please contact me with any questions.

Thus, the mixed league was formed, and we all played at Pinecrest. Paul also played with a group of men from the campground. He also had the computer club with Bob and Bernie, instructing people in computer skills. The age of technology was coming into the park. Besides the Tuesday morning lessons, Paul was often called to help individuals in their homes. The club lasted until a trickle of the new generation came into the park and were computer savvy. The demand became almost nil, closing them down permanently.

The ladies' golf league from Pinecrest decided to move to greener pastures, and Mainlands Golf Club accepted them in their own ladies' league. Sharon, Elaine, Jeannie and I followed suit, then we, as a group, moved to the Tides. Meanwhile, the mixed league with some disgruntled men also moved to the Tides. We all played on this long, beautiful course until it was sold for condos. Mainlands golf again came to our rescue, but only had room for us as a mixed league. Also, in the park, a group of men had a league of their own playing at different courses around the Tampa Bay area. A newly formed once a year mixed league tournament called the "Canuck Open" was created with Donna and John F. as leaders. The response was stupendous. They played at Mainlands, and it was remarkably well organized. We had two years of this tournament, the response and anticipation for a third year was even greater, when the Covid-19 pandemic made its nasty appearance. All was cancelled and everyone rushed back home, especially the Canadians before the closing of the border. We made it just in time and waited twenty months before returning to Four Seasons Estates, our winter home.

The park has been good to us, and it is our home away from home for the past twenty years. We participated in many of its activities, the flea market being the most enjoyable one. Paul was at the electronic tables while I was with Rosie and her crew selling tickets at the raffle table. To attract as many people as we could, we wore purple fuzzy boas around our necks and called out our sales pitch. It worked for we sold more tickets than in previous years. After doing this for a few years, we disbanded as a group and went to work at other tables. I volunteered at the bank as a runner and ambled quietly amongst my assigned tables collecting their bounty. This

We have enjoyed sharing birthday and Christmas celebrations, cocktails and dinners. However, gathering for the yearly picnic in the grassy part of the circle, was the apogee of our fiestas. BBQs were brought out and food spread on tables as neighbors reacquainted themselves with each other. In 2001 we were the "newcomers" in the circle. Now we're the elders and leave without regrets for becoming the older generation. We have sold our house and will be leaving soon.

At the very beginning of our twenty years, I started golf at Pinecrest, and now I end it there, playing this winter with the "youngsters" who are establishing themselves in this park. It has been a great stretch, and we shall miss it. To all---Adieu, au revoir! Paul and Cecile Fortier

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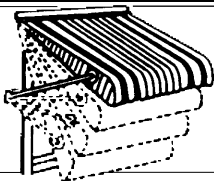
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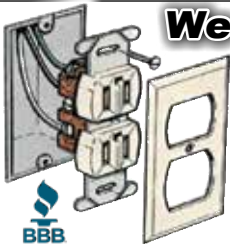

## BEST DEFENSE FOUNDATION TAKING CARE OF THE ONES WHO TOOK CARE OF US

Our own Dr. Kenneth D. Wells (Doc) and his wife Natalie traveled to Hawaii in December 2021 for the 80th Anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941, which launched the United States into a war with Japan.

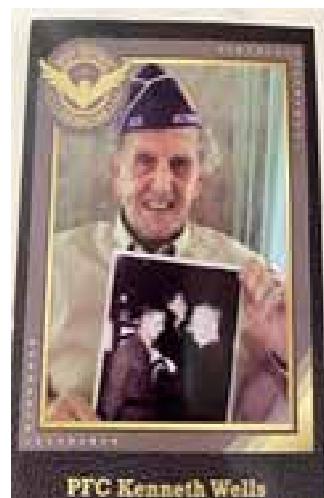
PFC Kenneth D. Wells, F Co., 29th Marine Regiment, 6th Marine Division was among more than 60 WWII Veterans, caretakers / spouses, volunteers, video crew, and medics that went on this trip sponsored by the Best Defense Foundation. This is a non-profit organization whose purpose is to celebrate and honor Veterans, especially WWII Veterans, and return them to foreign battlefields across the world at \$0 (zero) cost.

The Foundation partnered with American Airlines, Born Primitive, Gary Sinise Foundation and many others. American Airlines provided flights for everyone from all over the US to Texas and then from the mainland to Honolulu, Hawaii.

Doc, born in 1925, was from a farm in Continental, Ohio and enjoyed playing sports in high school. After a farm deferment to finish school and help on the farm he was drafted in 1944. His plan was to go into the Navy, but Marines needed volunteers and he was one of them.

He went to Paris Island, SC for boot camp and was supposed to go to Iwo Jima but because of a fluke was sent to Camp Lejeune, NC for advanced training. He was assigned to the 29th Marine Regiment, 6th Marine Division, and continued training on Guadalcanal before going to Okinawa April 1, 1945. Wounded on June 12, 1945, Doc received his Purple Heart before being medically discharged October 1945.

We left Tampa on December 2nd with another 6th Marine from the area. Flying to Dallas, TX where everyone converged from throughout the US, we were met by hundreds of well-wishers lining the airport to thank these WWII Veterans for their service. Several dignitaries



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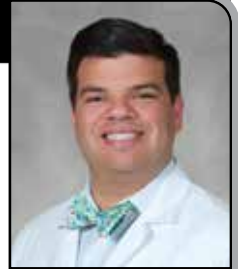
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from Dallas, American Airlines, and Best Defense Foundation spoke before we were transported to the Westin Hotel. That evening we all enjoyed a gala and a fantastic dinner prepared by TV personality Chef Robert Irvine. The entertainment was fabulous, American Airlines 40's dancers dressed in period clothes and music from the big band era. More dignitaries and speeches, pictures of the veterans and lots of videos.

The next day our chartered flight to Honolulu arrived at 2pm and we were once again greeted by hundreds of well-wishers before going to our hotel. After getting checked in, being greeted by many volunteers of BDF, getting our welcome bags, shirts, etc., we were off to Ford Island where we were provided a Liberty Luau at the Pearl Harbor Aviation Museum. Because of rainy weather it was inside. There were amazing singers, music, luau dancers and even fire dancers.

We had veterans whose ages ranged from 92-104 and for safety all were required to have a wheelchair. Of course, it took extra time getting them in and out of the storage bins of the buses plus getting everyone on and off the buses. Usually, the volunteers got off first to get the wheelchairs ready, then caretakers and spouses got off before the veterans.

Our daily schedule was hectic and on Saturday it started raining and everyone got wet going to and from the buses. We went to Scofield Barracks and Wheeler Airfield. (Wheeler was the primary target of the first attack on Pearl Harbor. The intent to prevent the planes from getting airborne and engage warfare with the Japanese.)

We had lunch with active-duty US Army Soldiers at the DFAC and then a Harbor Tour to see the USS Bowfin and the USS Missouri. After getting back to our hotel, a quick rest and then dinner and a Block Party sponsored by the Chula Vista Brewery and the Maui Brewing Company.

Our lunch the next day was on the USS Missouri, site of the official Japanese surrender of World War II. Followed by a great concert provided by the Navy.

On Monday a trip to various Kaneohe schools was planned. Our group went to an elementary school and each veteran visited a classroom to talk about his service time and answer questions. The students were very interested and asked lots of questions. We then had a tour of the Kaneohe Marine Base where the veterans met the 3rd Battalion 3rd Marines.

Tuesday, December 7, we departed the hotel at 5:30 am, loaded the buses in the rain and headed to Pearl Harbor for the 80th Commemoration Ceremony. This was attended by hundreds of people and included many dignitaries. There were television stations and other news sources to record all the activities. The veterans were again presented to the local people and would later participate in the Pearl Harbor Memorial Parade.

On our last day we went to the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific known as the Punchbowl for a memorial ceremony, laying of wreaths for all the branches of the military and a chance for the veterans to say goodbye. We returned to the hotel, finished packing and got to the airport for our return flight to Texas and home with many wonderful memories.

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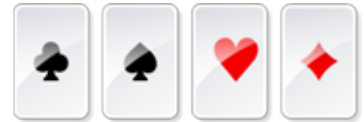

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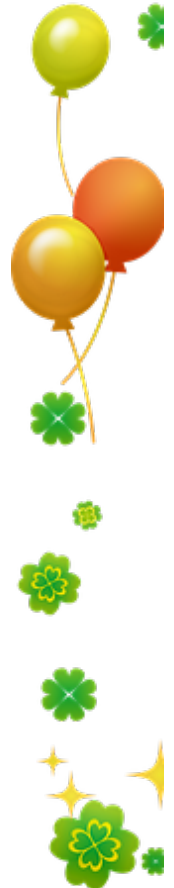

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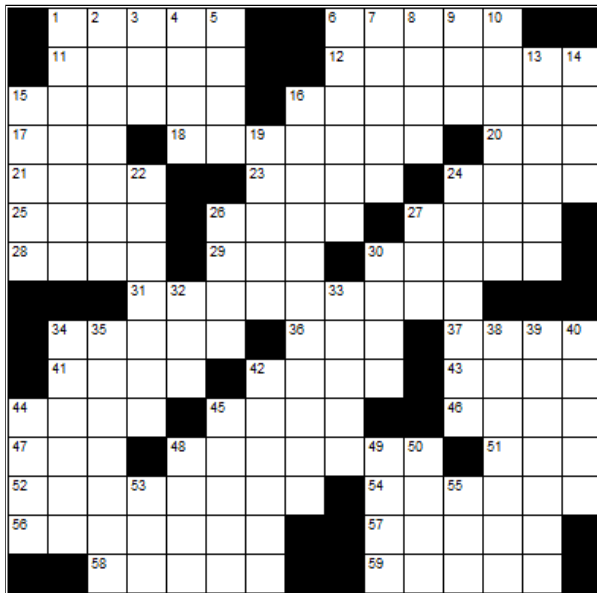
