



Golf Tip of the Month – How to Mark your ball on the Green: Ref: Golf-info-guide. com/golf tips/beginners It is necessary every time your ball is on or near the line of another player's putt to mark your ball, but some players do it all the time. Here are the rules to do it correctly.

When you reach the green, walk to your ball and facing the cup, bend down behind your ball, place the marker just under the back edge. You may put your marker on any side of the ball but most use the back as it does not interfere with the green surface. Important: Make sure your ball marker is on the ground before lifting the ball. Never lift the ball and then place a marker where the ball was. Place marker first, lift ball second.

Occasionally your ball is in the line of another player and you will have to move the marker. To do this correctly:

- 1. Ask the player which side he/she prefers you to spot the marker (left or right) based on the break of the putt.
- 2. Stand beside your marker and find a landmark, such as a tree, on a line perpendicular to the line of your putt.
- 3. Place the heel of your putter on the side of the marker (left or right) with the toe pointing to the landmark.

- 4. Move the mark to the toe of your putter.
- 5. Once the other player has putted, align your putter with the landmark and move the mark back to the original spot. Failure to move the marker back will result in a one stroke penalty.


