pril is here. The sunny days are getting longer and hotter!

There are many activities this month: Some Residents will be traveling back north; we begin preparing for Hurricane Season; and the manager reviews each Home for Spring Cleaning. While the Spring Cleanings kept the Cove appealing through the Summer – it also prepares the Cove for Hurricane Season – and allows us to continue as a *premier* 'active'55+ Resident owned community.

Last month, we completed our review of the **Ten Covenants** of the New Resident Orientation. Please, remember the *Golden Rule* and "*treat others as you want to be treated.*"continued on page 6

Nowhere is this maxim more evident than in the pet situation. Walk your dog within five feet of the street and pick up after them. Remember that Emotional Support Animals are designated for a single individual, who should be the 'walker' and always with the animal. Next month, will again cover each of these **Ten Covenants.**

Initiative Updates:

- 1. ARO Engineering is completing the Engineer Survey for the North and South Boat Ramp Renovation Project with the final document. In the meantime, placing signs marking the end of the ramp, marking high tide, and noting that the safest time to launch/load is during high tides. Additionally, have requested a permit to dump riprap to fill the hole at the end of the north ramp. For the south ramp, coordinating for a concrete contractor to ease the steep angle of the ramp.
- 2. The MAROA Board tasked J. Foster Consulting for contractors to implement their recommendations on six seawall panels as a first trial.
- 3. The WEBSITE Committee, chaired by Phil Quince, continues to make strides in converting to a 'new' webpage that contains necessary Americana Cove information and remains user friendly.
- 4. This month, the survey for the Land Survey Committee will begin. This company possesses the correct ST 719 legal experience to survey to lower the share total and reduce our tax burden.
- 5. The Dog Park renovation is nearing completion now that irrigation is present, the pavers are laid, the topsoil has been spread, and the sod is placed. Finishing touches are in the works in early April for a pet memorial display. Our appreciation goes out to Mary & Sparty for leading this effort along with Camille & Bilbo, Janis & Cooper, Diane & Sheba, and Shelley & Teddy.
- 6. The motors for the automatic Clubhouse double doors and the Atrium single door should be replaced early this month. Additionally, the doors and frames plus the remote access panels will be serviced.

<u>Weather Emergency Preparation.</u> The Tornado Exercise taught us the lesson that we cannot rely on VOLO to get emergency notifications sent and received in a timely manner. Please, all Residents should sign up at <u>http://pinellascounty.org/alertpinellas/</u> to receive alerts about weather emergencies and other important community news. When you sign up, you choose how to receive alerts. This could be a cell phone, landline, text, email – you can enter multiple methods. Additionally, a Hurricane Preparation Discussion will be held in the Clubhouse on Wednesday evening, 6 April; and again, on Thursday morning, 7 April to provide guidance, field questions, and relay information for the upcoming Hurricane Season. Please, attend.

For your awareness, there are two initiatives that concern future budgets. Your leaders are collaborating with St Petersburg Council Member, Brandi Gabbard, to figure out why Americana Cove is charged for storm drains. Additionally, as a related effort, coordinating with the city water department to lower our cost for the south side.

Please – feel free to contact the Manager with any improvement ideas. Your comments ensure we . . . build Americana Cove into a premier 'active' 55+ Resident owned community.

Emergency Medical Call System

Recently, I had the opportunity to install a system upgrade to our call buttons. As I was doing this, it dawned on me that we probably have many residents that don't really know about this.

Back in 2017, our community secured 2 AED Defibrillator units which are located in the Atrium and the Club House.

At that time, in 2017, cell/mobile phones were not as common here in our community as they are now. We wanted a secure system in place whereby residents could request EMS Paramedics in case of a health emergency.

We installed 3 wall mounted buttons. They are located near the Pool, near the Gym in the Atrium and in the Club House near the doors to the storage area. These are "Non-Verbal" meaning that when the button is pressed, no one will speak to you and you will also not be able to speak to the unit.

What they do is send a message to the central dispatch unit which is located in Ogden, Utah. That center notifies St. Petersburg 911 dispatch that there is a medical emergency in the public area of The Cove. The Gate is also notified.

Needless to say, PLEASE DO NOT USE unless this is an actual life threatening emergency. If you have your mobile phone with you, it is best to call 911 from your phone and speak with the 911 Operator.


