

.... A timely reminder

Please keep in mind, any time that you are making modifications or changes to **anything outside of your home**, an Architectural Request form is highly recommended. Especially before any digging is performed. We want to avoid hitting any water or utility lines. Here, in Florida, many of the lines are just below the surface. There are detailed plans available. We can quickly identify where the utility and water lines are thereby eliminating the possibility of a real mess!!\

Submitting the appropriate request/form protects the homeowner as well as the community. The request asks for a description of planned work; identification of who will be doing the work; verification of license and insurance of the person performing the job/work.

Lawn Care Service

Gene Areno

The continue to strive to provide excellent lawn care service. Two areas we have continued to deal with are,

- 1. Vinyl skirting that extends to the ground. There must be a barrier between the skirting and the vegetation. This can be a layer of stones 4 inches wide, bricks or concrete edging. This will protect the skirting from the grass trimmer. If vegetation grows up in the barrier or between the barrier and the skirting, you will need to use a weed killer to remove the vegetation. We are instructing the Lawn Service to not trim grass or any vegetation that grows up against the skirting as this could lead to damage to the skirting.
- 2. Please be mindful not to plant trees, shrubs or place other items on the grass area that may result in the lawn mowers to have to pivot sharply or make a 360 degree turn. This can cause the wheels to dig into the grass and damage your lawn.

<u>UPDATE: Clubhouse & Pool Key FOB</u>

he Clubhouse & Pool area will have Key FOB security to replace the key entry system. All registered owners will be issued a key FOB. All tenants or guest will receive the Key FOB from the property owner. A plan will be in place to obtain the key FOB. The key entry will remain in place for 30 days or more during the transition to the new entry system. The key FOB is required to enter the clubhouse or pool. A FOB is not required to exit the clubhouse or pool area. A post with an exit button will be by each pool gate and the emergency crash bars will provide exiting from the clubhouse. 

True. As usual, June 1 – Nov 30 is when Floridians need to prepare. You can check with various sources regarding the predications for the season. www.npr.org www.reuters.com www,cnn.com www.accuweather.com www.nhc.noaa.gov All of the experts agree upon a few things:

Prepare an evacuation plan. The county opens shelters in numerous locations. Or you may decide to drive to a distant safe area. Because we live in manufactured homes, we are encouraged to evacuate. If you decide to ride out the storm, you are on your own if emergency services are needed. You may call – but they may not be able to respond.

Have a go-kit ready. Suggestions include spare keys, cash (ATM may not work), two weeks supply of medications, phone chargers, hygiene items, insurance papers/info, batteries and flashlight, radio and rain gear. Any thing else of importance that you do not want to lose.

Check your checklist. Pinellas County, the American Red Cross, Ready.gov are great sources

Special needs? Emergency management provides a special needs registry. Contact them at the beginning of hurricane season at specialneeds.pinellascounty.org or call 727-464-3800 to receive a form in the mail. If you have a service animal, be certain to share that info. Not all of

the shelters are prepared to accept animals.

When you grocery shop, look for the Pinellas County complete hurricane preparedness bulletin, many stores have them available. All of the shelters are listed. Some do take animals. Consider picking up a couple extra non-perishable items, water, hand sanitizer, meal bars, canned meat and vegetables, etc. You may need to bring your own food to a shelter.

Keep in mind that it may take days or weeks to restore power to the area. Consider keeping the gas tank in your car full during hurricane season. If you evacuate the area, always good to start out with a full tank. If you stay, always good to have a full tank incase the pumps run out or have no power.

On a personal note; I have been a Florida resident since 1979 (Miami until 2016). During that time, we have always prepared for the season. Hurricane Andrew was a once-in-a-lifetime experience. Beyond anything I could have anticipated or imagined – but we survived.

Since moving to Briar Creek, I evacuated to Kentucky for Irma in 2017. In retrospect, it would have been fine to stay put. Usually, I do not consider myself superstitious. I am spiritual. Given that, I take comfort in believing that the Tocobaga tribe blessed the area many moons ago; the blessings still keeps us safe – in Safety Harbor.

But be prepared. Just in case.

Clubhouse as shelter

ecently, an alert from Pinellas County was issued advising residents to seek immediate shelter due to intense storms that would soon be passing through our area. Some individuals wanted to leave their homes and go to the clubhouse. In their mind, they thought the clubhouse would be safer than staying in their personal manufactured homes and questioned why the clubhouse could not be used. We have all asked the same question over the years and thought it deserved an explanation. Most clubhouses constructed during the same time period as ours were not constructed to withstand a windspeed of greater than 75 miles per hour (mph). A category 1 hurricane has a windspeed of 74 mph. It may not seem true but our personal manufactured homes built after 1976 are rated for 70 plus mph as well. For those constructed after 1994, the rating is to a category 3 hurricane standard. Somehow the idea of being in a concrete building just makes us feel safer. The bottom line is that our BC II clubhouse is not certified as an "evacuation center". The reason why it is not certified is that it does not meet current hurricane design and construction requirements. More specifically, the clubhouse does not meet Windborne Debris Impact" requirements which are defined as "all exterior service components and cladding materials in their supporting assemblies are required to resist debris impact". Those components and materials include reinforced concrete walls, strapped roof to walls, hurricane/shuttered windows, tendency of flat roofs to lift off in high winds, etc. We could hire a structural engineer to assess our clubhouse to the determine level of compliance and corrective measures needed to come into compliance. Contractors would need to be hired to get pricing. Most likely, to achieve certification would cost our community tens of thousands of dollars, if not more, to bring our clubhouse up to standard. Even if our clubhouse did meet certification requirements, our liability insurance still might not cover us in the event of a claim. Even if our BC II clubhouse did meet certification requirements, if a "mandatory evacuation order" is issued by state or local authorities, the clubhouse could not be opened. The mandatory order means that refusal of residents to leave the community in spite of being ordered is a second degree misdemeanor crime under Florida law. No Board can allow a clubhouse to open under this order and permit an illegal action by residents who remain who would be breaking the law. It would simply leave the Board and community open to serious potential lawsuits and liability. Our association's liability would be substantial and it's entirely possible that the association's insurance company will-with good reason-say that its coverage does not protect the association from claims filed because of an injury or death that occurred ...continued on page 33





know that when we see cute animals and birds, we want to feed them. I admit, I have been tempted. But these are wild animals, and they need to find their own food. Human food is never as good for them as what they find on their own.

Plus, feeding tends to create problems. Florida has a native rat, called a fruit rat or roof rat, that is happy to eat whatever you leave out. These rats also like to find ways into our homes. This is one reason why bird feeders are discouraged. Also, squirrels are quite happy to raid birdfeeders.

Tossing human food to birds is also not good for them. Ducks were not meant to eat bread, and egrets aren't supposed to be having hot dogs—even gourmet versions! These birds can become ill from eating human food, and they may "forget" how to forage for themselves. Plus, if you want to feed one bird, you may find that others come along. Everyone wants to eat! It's unfair to try to feed one kind and chase away the others.

The best solution is not to feed wild animals and birds at all. It's better for them.


