OUR GATEWAY COMMUNITY

The Editor

E ach year our Gateway Community experiences comings and goings by 10% to 15% of our residents. So, during the past 6 years that could mean that as many as 150 - 200 of us have never seen the time that Gateway had only the single entrance onto Gandy Blvd at the corner of 1st Lane and 102nd Terrace. My wife and I came to Gateway in January of 2006 and part of our introduction from Management was a 'key' to the 'lock' for the closed and locked (24/7) 106th Avenue gate.

When construction of the Gandy Blvd flyover began, the gated 106th Avenue entrance quickly became an option to enter and leave the Park especially during morning and evening rush hours that often backed traffic on Gandy past the entrance. That one might exit the park onto Gandy and cross the five lanes to go south on 4th Street was out of the question most mornings and evenings. The 106th Avenue entrance became an option and for a short time there were attempts to enforce what a number of residents preferred - stop, unlock gate, open, exit, stop, close gate, lock - proceed to or return from 4th Street. Needless to say as 106th became a more popular access to 4th Street, the gate was opened and remained open throughout the day then to be closed and locked at sundown/end of day. As construction created further traffic disruptions on Gandy and then following some heated discussions at homeowners meetings, the decision was made that the entrance would remain open until the completion of the Gandy Blvd flyover. The flyover was completed in 2018, the 106th Ave side gate has remained open. END OF THIS PORTION OF THE STORY.

And so, for nearly 4 years residents of Gateway have enjoyed the option of two entrances, but as any who used 106th Avenue came to realize that due to Siena Bay parked vehicles this St. Petersburg city street was little more than a one-way ally between 4th Street and 1st Lane. Still it remained a preferred entrance for many.

Well now ... thanks to Bob Waldorf of Bay Street, the parking on 106th Avenue will soon be at an end. Bob took it upon himself to circulate petitions among Gateway residents and then contact Siena Bay and appropriate Saint Petersburg city officials. The process took a few months and some exchanges of information, and; on April 14th there were new signs placed by Saint Petersburg Traffic Division notifying those in Siena Bay that parking on the 106th Avenue is no longer available. It may take a short period and perhaps even a parking ticket or two but eventually the street will be a less hazardous two lanes from 4th Street to the Gateway entrance.



Well looks like rainy season is on its way. Please remember to keep lawn mowed, weeds trimmed every 7-10 days.


Plants are getting out of hand in some areas. Plants should not cover MANAGER the front or sides of your home. They should never ever be taller than




