President's Message

once had a friend named Don. We were the absolute best of friends for a very long time. We talked on the phone every single Saturday from 4:00 - 5:00 PM. For 23 years. But that is a story for another time, a



heartbreaking tragedy of a story. However, it was only natural that as my very good friend, I would talk to him about the box I found that belonged to my Finnish father-in-law.

It was May 25th, 2012. My husband was back in Massachusetts tending to projects at the house. And – I just found this box, in the guest room closet and opened it. I had never seen it before. I have no idea how it got there. I read page after page of letters my father-in-law wrote about his military service during World War II to Don over the phone, and he interrupted and said, with his irascible Yankee growl, "Lissen, kid! You've gotta call your TV station and tell 'em about this! Its Memorial Day weekend, and they will be lookin' for a good story. You gotta! Call 'em up and then call me back!"

And so, I did.

This box was a treasure trove of pictures, personal letters, patches, and foreign money that told a fascinating tale of wartime, one my husband and his sisters certainly never knew about. The letters were spellbinding.

Every letter that Papa wrote to my mother-in-law started with, "Dearest Chickie." He wrote about the Eleventh Armored Division (133rd Armored Ordnance Battalion) taking the southern route from Camp Cooke in California (now Vandenberg Space Force Base), through Arizona to Camp Kilmer in New Jersey.

"Seems that people around there know what it means for a troop train to pass through in New Jersey. Passing through towns and by factories the people would crowd the windows with "Good luck" signs, and waving,"

"They made the crossing to England with several real scares about enemy submarines along the way, eventually travelling through France, into the Ardennes Forest and Von Runsted's "Battle of the Bulge."

"A way had to be cleared to Bastogne. At the time we were on the secret list, but you can bet your bottom dollar that the Eleventh was pitching in there right along with the others.

"The winter was bitterly cold. It was torture to do any work on the vehicles. You asked me if we worked in shops? The answer is "yes"! The sky was the roof, and the snow and frozen ground was the floor."

And in another letter, "It is hard for any person to imagine, and I suppose that most people back in the States take the atrocities done by the Nazi's as propaganda. I have seen some of it with my own eyes. I have seen the pitiful bodies of men and women that have been starved to death in their concentration camps (There is one near here). I do not exaggerate the slightest bit when I say that flesh has disappeared from their bodies, and they are nothing but skeletons with a very tightly stretched skin covering their bones. It is a sight that will make even the most hard-hearted soldier turn his head away. I saw them being buried and the "Herrenvolk," that super-race of Hitler's had to do it."

Page after page he wrote to his "Chickie,"eloquent in its simplicity, talking privately as a man talks alone with his wife about the horrors and casualties of war.

Ours is a military family. Three generations have served this country. My husband went tocontinued on page 6

Vietnam. My son, Simon, was in Saudi Arabia for both Desert Shield and Desert Storm. My brother, my son-in-law, all served this United States bravely. We are prideful, but the costs have been heavy.

So many families have these stories, and this has just been one. In World War II alone there were 405,399 American deaths; the Korean War claimed just under 37,000 lives. Viet Nam saw the loss of 58,220 of our men and women. Agent Orange, the horrific defoliant the U.S. military used as part of their herbicidal warfare program, has affected over a million Vietnam veterans (and now their children and their children's children). It has taken an extreme toll in health issues by being responsible for such things as Diabetes, Hodgkin's Lymphoma and Leukemia. Yes, the price of our freedom has been dear, paid in blood, bones, loneliness, and fear. And great bravery and un-daunting pride.

On this Memorial Day, my fervent wish is that every person will take a moment to remember what was given for us by our men and women in uniform. It is sometimes easy to forget that lives were altered and then re-shaped forever, because of the sacrifices made by our armed forces – the greatest military in the world!

Postscript: My friend Don was right: Bay News 9 came and interviewed me and showed clips of it on TV throughout the Memorial Day weekend. Thanks, Don, you were right! And of course he signed off with, "Gotta go. Talk Saturday. Love ya, kid!"

Over the past year, we reviewed the Ten Tenets of Americana Cove. Most of these tenets have a foundation in the Golden Rule i.e., "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you." Excellent words to live by in our somewhat crowded together life. This particular tenet involves appearance of your home and the manner in which other Residents view your home:

Think of your neighbors! Many Residents live here year-round. Keep bushes, weeds, and lawns taken care of so that it enhances the beauty of our Community. While you are away, please, make arrangements to have these things done.

Initiative Updates:

1– As we wait for ARO Engineering to complete the Engineer Survey for the North and South Boat Ramps, a mid-term less expensive solution is nearing completion. Signs have been placed to mark the end of the North Boat Ramp and the height of high tide which is the safest time to launch/load your boat, while discouraging 'power' loading. The permit to dump riprap to fill the hole at the end of the north ramp is much more intricate than on first impression. Therefore, have contacted J Foster Consulting to assist with the permit form. Already coordinated with JAG to deliver, dump, and spread the riprap. For the south ramp, continuing to coordinate for a concrete contractor to ease the steep angle of the ramp.

2–J. Foster Consulting continues searching for contractors to implement their recommended renovations on six seawall panels as a first trial. Additionally, we are closely observing the capability, proficiency, and timely progress of the drainage repairs between 312 & 314 Mt Oak. That contractor may become the go-to service for re-attaching gutters to flow pipelines that were disconnected in 2018.

3 – TheWEBSITE Committee, chaired by Phil Quince, continues to make strides in converting to a 'new' webpage that contains necessary Americana Cove information and remains user friendly. The MAROA Directors are playing a much more active role in the webpage's appearance and functionality.

4 –The Dog Park renovation is complete with much appreciation to Mary & Sparty for leading this effort along with Camille & Bilbo, Janis & Cooper, Diane & Sheba, Mike-Janis & Cooper, and Shelley & Teddy.

5 – The much-needed regrouting of the pool tiles along the edge will begin on Monday, 9 May. The contractor, Mark Pinson, will also pressure clean plus urethane seal all the surface tiles to prevent mold and mildew. His work comes with a 2-year warranty.

One of the two budget easing initiatives mentioned last month culminated in the status quo. Your MAROA President & Treasurer collaborated with the Wastewater Collection Division of the St Pete Water Resources Department in an attempt to relieve the cost for the upkeep of the city's storm sewer system. Since our storm sewer system is entirely maintained and financed by MAROA, these MAROA Directors negotiated to remove the cost for city's storm sewer repairs from our St Pete billing. Ultimately, the Cove may bear more expense if the sewer arrangement was modified according to the Wastewater Collection Division. In their view, any water entering Tampa Bay must be treated through a filtration system or connect to the city storm sewer system. Either modification would cause a considerable expense for MAROA. Fortunately, the Division judged that the Cove is 'grandfathered' and simply pays the storm sewer 'upkeep' cost – a much less expensive alternative. Meanwhile, we continue to seek a relief effort on the higher rate for the south side.



All their father really cared about in life was his work: the buildings he built, owned, and rented out. One day while inspecting a building site, he died suddenly of a heart attack.

Shortly after the funeral, Danny's stepmother ejected him from the house and into his sister's care. Maeve persuaded Danny to "bilk" the educational trust fund intended to provide for the two step-daughters.

Danny eventually marries, has two children, and is doing well for himself. Maeve is diagnosed with diabetes and eventually dies. Their stepmother has a degenerative mental condition so one of her daughters moves back home to take care of her while the other remains estranged from her mother ... (and the saga continues).

& Gail Larkin's daughter who came for a surprise birthday visit. Laurie won the 50/50 raffle for \$92.00.






