

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup half -&-half

<u>CREAMY COGNAC PRAWNS</u> • pinch red pepper flakes

- 1TBS butter
- 1 TBS olive oil
- 2 cloves Garlic
- ¹/₂ Cup Shallots slice thin
- 1 Lb large PRAWNS (shrimp), peeled
 salt & pepper to taste
 & deveined

Heat the butter & oil in a skillet over med. Heat. Add garlic & shallots and cook while stirring. When golden increase heat to high & add prawns, pepper flakes & sundried tomatoes and cook 5 minutes until shrimp is opaque and golden. Transfer shrimp to plate & keep

warm. With heat remaining on high, add cognac. Stir to loosen browned bits. Reduce heat to low and stir in half-&-half. Simmer 5 minutes of until sauce is slightly thickened. Fold in shrimp and serve immediately over past (or rice if you prefer) editor's note: I like it best over angel hair pasta

VETERAN'S CORNER

The Memorial Day Celebration this year will take place at the Veteran's Memorial at Largo Central Park at 9am on 30 May. The Department of Veterans Affairs has unveiled a plan that calls for closing 17 aging or underused medical centers, while



shifting services to more than 30 new or rebuilt hospitals. In some cases, it would rely on private care. Under the nearly \$2 trillion proposal released Monday, the department would lose a net of three medical centers and 174 outpatient health clinics but would gain 255 health care facilities, including new clinics, stand-alone rehabilitation centers and nursing homes. Medical centers in areas with diminishing veteran populations are among those slated to close, while others would be built in growing urban centers, the West and the South -- areas where veteran populations are growing. The recommendations, which represent the VA's vision for future health care delivery to more than 12 million veterans in the next 25 to 50 years, are the first step in an asset and infrastructure review required by Congress in 2018. The infrastructure modernization proposals will be reviewed next by an independent commission, which will provide its own input. The final plan must be approved by Congress before being enacted. Under the plan, 17 medical centers in 12 states would close, 18 in 16 states would be completely replaced, and 13 new centers would be built in 11 states.

Of the 17 slated for closure, three are in New York City or its suburbs, including Castle Point, Manhattan and Brooklyn. Two each are in Pennsylvania (Philadelphia and Coatesville), Virginia (Salem and Hampton), and South Dakota (Fort Meade and Hot Springs).

Other medical centers on the proposed closure list include those in: Livermore, California, Dublin, Georgia, Fort Wayne, Indiana, Alexandria, Louisiana, VA Central Western Massachusetts, Battle Creek, Michigan, Chillicothe, Ohio, Muskogee, Oklahoma.

Some of these facilities would shift services to nearby civilian hospital networks or become multi-specialty community outpatient clinics, while others would shift their patients to newly built VA medical centers or bolstered existing hospitals nearby.

New medical centers also would be built at: Newport News and Norfolk, Virginia, Macon and Gwinnett County, Georgia, Huntsville, Alabama, Summerville, South Carolina, Grand Rapids, Michigan, Everett, Washington, Colorado Springs, Colorado, Anthem, Arizona. Another 18 medical centers would be completely rebuilt, on existing land nearby.

A Nurse's Self Care Toolbox #47

ast month we brought this series on diabetes <u>up to</u> current treatments including medications for diabetes. Some people do suffer from low sugar or hypoglycemia. Dangerous. I will discuss that in another future article if interest.

Diabetes is quite a bit like having a toddler living with you. You can't let the child run the house. I will admit to you all that the biggest obstacle to getting and keeping blood sugar levels where our body was designed cannot be done solely by relying on medications alone. Best analogy I can think of is trying to push a car when it is in reverse. Remember we can eat most anything if good healthy food. The real questions is how much and what am I going to do when the sugar has been absorbed in the blood and circulating to every cell. All diabetic medications need us to help. The results can be phenomenal when we and are medications <u>are working together</u>.

Ok, let's cover the most frequent medications. The first and most basic medication helps the pancreas excrete more insulin. Remember insulin kicks the sugar found in the blood in to each and every cell, 24/7. Metformin is the most common. Our pancreas ages and just simply gets tired even without the constant stress of too much sugar. Upside to these medications is more sugar gets to where it belongs and blood sugar drops. There are two downsides, one is we are asking the pancreas who is already tired to work harder and for at least 14 days after starting we feel lousy. Why do we feel lousy? Our blood sugar hasn't been more normal for a long time, maybe years? Our body is simply saying I don't like this even if it is better. Many people stop taking the medication and don't even tell their doctor. Sad but true. I would tell my diabetic patients who just started on oral meds to call me if they initially feel lousy. I got called and kept them going for a bit longer.

The second most common medications not only help the pancreas make more insulin but also help the sugar get into each body cell easier. Many diabetics over several years begin to have problems just getting more sugar from the blood in to each cell regardless of enough insulin. Sort of like becoming insensitive or ignoring the needed sugar. Again many people feel lousy and stop. Sad again.
