LHRO BOARD MEETING APRIL 14

(notes from Editor, not official minutes)

o one spoke at Open Forum. March minutes posted and approved. President's Report: Met with Beth and 2-year contract was signed by all.

Manager's Report: Remember to do summer maintenance – weeding and clean outside of homes. Notices will be sent out if work needs to be done. Also remember that nothing should be flushed down the toilet other than toilet paper – no diapers, no disposable wipes, etc. Residents on Kimberly may get letters (notices) of an \$1800 cost for sewer cleanout.

We are entering hurricane season – snowbirds: take all of your outside tables, chairs, yard art, flower pots, etc. and put it in your shed / house for safekeeping.

The park truck is available for use by residents and there is a 10 fee and $1\frac{1}{2}$ hr. time limit. If you go over you will be charged additional 10/hr and can only go to Home Depot or Lowes.

For water shut-offs – let the office know and they will shut it off, and remember to turn off your water heater and refrigerator.

Treasurer's Report: \$21,053.90 in operating account, the audit is done and all is in good order. A 1920-21 statement will be sent to residents. Mortgage will be paid off 3/20/30.

Reserve Study: purpose – need more information before recommendations will be made, get back in May with recommendations. Reserve is at \$230,000.

Crock Pot Garlic Brown Sugar Chicken

6 plump, skinless boneless chicken breasts

³/₄ c. brown sugar, packed
²/₃ c. balsamic vinegar
¹/₄ c. Sprite or 7-Up soda
²/₃ T. minced garlic

2 T. low sodium soy sauce ¹/₂ t. pepper (black or cayenne)

Place chicken in crockpot. Mix all remaining ingredients and pour over chicken. Cook on low for 4 hours. (Will dry out if cooked longer.)

White Chocolate and Cranberry Cookies

½ c. butter, softened
½ c. brown sugar, packed
½ c. white sugar
1 egg
1 T. brandy
1 ½ c. all-purpose flour
½ t. baking soda
¾ c. white chocolate chips

1 c. dried cranberries

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Grease cookie sheets. In a large bowl, cream together the butter and sugars until smooth. Beat in the egg and brandy. Combine the flour and baking soda; stir into the sugar mixture. Mix in the white chocolate chips and cranberries. Drop by heaping spoonfuls onto prepared cookie sheets. Bake for 8 to 10 minutes. For best results, take cookies out while they are still doughy. Allow to cool for 1 minute on the cookie sheet before transferring to wire racks to cool completely. Makes 2 dozen.

MY HOMETOWN, SAUGATUCK, MICHIGAN

 \frown outhwest Michigan is one of the most beautiful places in Michigan. Beautiful rivers and lakes, majestic Lake Michigan, and gorgeous white sand beaches with soaring sand dunes as a backdrop. I've had the pleasure of living in 3 different towns in the area, but most recently, Saugatuck was our home for 20 years before we moved to Florida. Saugatuck is located on the Kalamazoo River, just over the dune ridge from Lake Michigan, about 140 miles from Chicago. A tiny town of 1500 or so in the winter, it swells to 30,000 in summer with cottagers, boaters and daytrippers. Our downtown is just a few blocks long and wide but you can find just about anything you want. Known for our artists of all media types, we have a great selection of art galleries and are also the home of Ox-Bow, School of Art and Artists' Residency,



associated with The School of the Art Institute of Chicago.

We have very few chain stores in town (of course, we have Kilwins), many locally-owned restaurants – be sure to go to the Butler and Phil's if you visit – both have fabulous food --- oh, and Marro's pizza is great!!! As in most small tourist towns, parking is always an issue, but you can take one of the side roads east of town and go up on the hill and park on the side roads up there or in the high school parking lot – it's a short walk or they usually have a shuttle going up and down the hill from the high school.

And just north of town they have the Saugatuck Dune Rides – a fun roller coaster type ride through the dunes and gives you a fabulous view of the area. Or you can take the Chain Ferry across the river and walk to Mount Baldhead where you can climb up 302 stairs, take beautiful pictures of the area, or take the 1-mile hiking trail, and then run down the back side of the dune to Oval Beach!

There is live music at Coral Gables, The Butler Deck or Wally's most every weekend from Memorial Day to Labor Day. Coral Gables and The Butler sit right on the river so you have beautiful views of the boat slips, the river activity, and can watch the Star of Saugatuck paddle wheel boat taking tourists down the river out to Lake Michigan. Take the tour, it's worth it! Enjoy Saugatuck!!







A Bit of History

reat Britain briefly had a Cones Hotline in the early 1990s. It was a special number citizens could call if they saw traffic cones on the road for no reason. It was disbanded after three years because almost no one ever called it.

New York City's oldest house is a cottage in Queens near LaGuardia Airport. It was built in 1654 by the Rikers family (the same family that gave Rikers Island its name) and even has a family cemetery in the backyard.


