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

PARKING:

All cars must fit in your carport. If furniture is preventing this, it needs to be moved. If guests come and need to park in the street remind them to not block your neighbor's driveway. Do not park in cul-de-sacs if you do not live there. Residents who live in the cul-de-sacs and their guests are the only ones who are allowed to park there. Parking too close to an intersection may impede traffic. Please be aware of your surroundings and not if you may be causing a dangerous situation.

LEASES:

If you are a new resident, please stop by the office to sign your lease and some other documents. It is very important.

DOGS

All dog walkers be sure to walk your pet **only in the dog section** and **only on the side of the street designated as dog section.** Many streets are designated "dog section" on one side of the street, but the other side is not in the dog section. Keep your neighbors happy and obey the pet rules. And, of course, don't forget the 'Litter" bag. If you have a service dog in the non-dog section, please be respectful and use your lawn only.

The office has received many complaints that people are walking in non-dog areas and allowing their dogs to run free. Without a name or address we cannot contact the offenders.

If you do not know where the "dog section" is, please stop by the office and pick up a map. Dogs are always to be on leash and waste is to be picked up.

<u>HOT TUB USE</u> is for <u>adults only.</u> No one under 18. <u>Food and drink are not allowed in</u> <u>the pool/hot tub.</u> The hot tub is only meant for short sessions, <u>no longer than 15 minutes</u>. The use of alcohol combined with the relaxing heat of the hot tub can be a dangerous combination. A person can easily slip under the water unnoticed and tragedy can strike quickly. <u>Never</u> swim alone, use the buddy system for safety.

Also, for the health and well being of everyone, please do not go in the Hot Tub or Pools if you have wounds or open sores.

<u>STOP SIGNS</u> – Just your monthly reminder to please stop at all STOP signs in the Park. Cars, golf carts, and bicycles, continue to roll through them and someone could easily get hurt one day. Just please pay attention.

<u>**DRIVEWAYS**</u> – When backing out of your driveway, please stop and look before entering the street. There have been several 'close calls' with residents backing out and not looking.

<u>I strongly urge residents</u> to obey the one-way arrows in the roads, especially around the clubhouses. Those following the correct direction of the arrow are not looking for those going the wrong way. We have seen many instances where someone has almost gotten run over because of someone going against the arrows.

<u>Good Morning/Good Night</u> signs are available in the office for those who live alone and would benefit by having their friends/neighbors see a sign that all is well with them. The sign is placed in your window. In the morning you turn the sign so that the "Good Morning" side



faces out. In the evening before you retire for the night you turn it to the "Good Night" side. If a neighbor should notice that the sign hasn't been turned they will try to contact you or they will call the office and have a welfare check made. The manager and maintenance also watch for the signs in the windows as they travel around the community. This system has been a great comfort to many of our residents already and many "buddy systems" have been set up. If you have questions please call the community office and we'll be glad to explain it to you or supply a sign if you are unable to come to the office to pick one up.

WEEDS – As our northerners go home, please remember to make arrangements to have your home cared for in your absence. The weeds grow during the summer and will need to be pulled while you are away.

<u>Sewers and sinks</u> can be kept flowing and in good condition by the addition of enzymes available at nearby home improvement stores or hardware stores. Enzymes poured down the sink periodically will help to break down the grease and gunk that build up in the plumbing. Only a couple ounces a month will do the job. For the sewer a twice per year treatment of <u>Copper</u> <u>Sulfate Pentahydrate flushed</u> down the toilet is also available. This kills off the roots and growth that get into the sewer line. These small investments now can prevent costly plumbing bills later.

Another seasonal tip is to remind our gardeners to pull out the little oak seedlings that are popping up all around the homes from fallen acorns. Some of these "seedlings" have grown into rather large plants already and are up against homes. They might not seem like much now but trees in Florida grow fast....VERY FAST! We really recommend that homeowners remove these plants while they are still able. As many know, oak trees can cause great damage to homes, drives and sidewalks.

RENTERS

It is the responsibility of the homeowners to make sure that any additional occupants in their homes are properly registered with the park. If you are planning to rent out your home or have someone stay with you, review your Ranchero **Rules and Regulations** first. **PET RESTRICTIONS MUST BE OBSERVED BY ALLANDAPPROVED BY MANAGEMENT BEFORE A PET CAN BE BROUGHT INTO THE COMMUNITY.** Additional occupants and renters must be registered with the office and a background check performed prior to their arrival. It is the Homeowners responsibility to meet all the requirements. There is an application fee to cover this expense. Applications are available in the Office. They must be accompanied by two legible forms of identification for each person. For international applicants, copies of passports and driver's licenses are required. These should be submitted at least 30 days in advance of the person's arrival. Renters are to check in at the office upon arriving in the community.

IF YOU ARE A RENTER OR ADDITIONAL OCCUPANT and haven't done the above, please come to the office immediately and get properly registered. Thank You! Landscaping and Mowing

If you have any problems with the landscaping or mowing, please contact the Ranchero office and not the mowing crew. The office will contact their managers and get the situation resolved

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as quickly as possible.

Also, Brightview employees DO NOT use handheld leaf blowers. They only use the backpack type. If you seen anyone walking around homes looking suspicious, please call the office and then the Largo non-emergency # 727-587-6730. Please call when this is happening immediately.

TRASH & RECYLING:

We would like to remind everyone that trash and recycling needs to be out by 8:00am But NOT overnight. Please bring trash and recycling to the end of your driveway or cul-de-sac. Trash must be in bags and securely tied. No loose trash will be picked up. You may also use the maintenance yard during the day. All the bins are marked. Do not put kitchen trash in the 2 large roll offs by the gate. The sign posted states "No Kitchen Trash". Use the 4 dumpsters marked "Kitchen Trash Only". The City of Largo has brought bags of trash back to us that was placed in the roll offs.

If you are putting out kitchen trash and yard waste, please separate yard waste from kitchen trash to make it easier for the maintenance crew to identify.

Please flatten cardboard boxes. Yard waste must be bagged, and branches tied in bundles.

<u>Do Not Leave your garbage or recycling outside the yard gate.</u> <u>The gate closes at 10:00pm and opens at 7:00am.</u> <u>Please plan accordingly.</u>

Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

Please make sure all medical and personal use items are disposed of in a safe and sanitary manner.

GUESTS

Guests staying more than 1 week MUST be registered in the Community Office.

Guests MUST display Ranchero Village ID tags when at the pools. Residents should be accompanying their guests while at the pool or other location and are responsible for the behavior of their guests. Please review your Rules and Regs and acquaint your guests with the rules also. Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult who shall assume full responsibility for their safety and conduct. No running, jumping or diving into the pool.

The Corral Pool is the only pool children can use. The hours are 10:00-2:00 and 4:00-7:00. **PARKING**

All vehicles are to fit in your carport. Do not park on grass or sidewalks.

If you need **<u>temporary parking</u>** due to visitors, please come to the office and request a pass to park in the back of the Hacienda parking lot.

Any vehicles left in any of the parking lots without a special permit displayed is subject to being towed at the owners' expense.

If you have permission from a neighbor to use their carport, please have them put it in writing and file it with the office.





GOLF CARTS

Golf carts are to only be driven by persons 18 years of age or older per Ranchero Rules and Regulations.

SOLICITORS

DO NOT let them into your home! Call the Largo Police Department (587-6730) immediately if you see solicitors and please let the management office know after you have called the police. We have been trying to catch and trespass them. If we can even get a license plate number it would help immensely. Management has been working with the police in an attempt to stop these offenders. Ranchero is a plainly posted No Soliciting Community; no one should be coming to your door. These people are very bold and brazen; please help us stop them and any other solicitors before they take advantage of anyone else in our community.

THE OFFICE NEVER GIVES PERMISSION FOR SOLICITORS TO GO DOOR TO DOOR SELLING ANYTHING!

<u>GLASS BOTTLES –</u> PLEASE REMEMBER that no glass of any kind is allowed around the pool area. We are getting reports of beer bottles around the pool. If glass is broken, you have the potential of people getting cut. If glass is broken in the pool, it can be quite expensive to clean out.

<u>No smoking at the pools</u> – please adhere to the No Smoking Rules at the pools and smoke only away from the pool area in the designated areas. This includes vapor and e-cigarettes.

HOME SITE ALTERATIONS

If you are making any changes or additions to your home site or the exterior of your home please come to the office and submit a completed request form. Paint colors must be approved, and a permit obtained from the office. The same applies to alteration requests; this includes plantings. Submit your written request and wait until you have received approval and a permit before proceeding with any work. Also, be sure to obtain any required City permits.

PUT IT IN WRITING!

All requests and complaints should be put in writing and signed. Anonymous reports will not be addressed. Forms are available in the office for your convenience

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
If you need assistance to go into a pool, we have a Handicap Chair Lift available at the Hacienda swimming pool.

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
