rectings from The EBO HOA. I just wanted to give you all a brief update on our meeting with the park management. Kristen and Lisa spent a hour meeting with us to hear our concerns that we brought up



on your behalf. These are just a few of the matters that we can report to you to expect upcoming changes. \*Regarding the pool, they are cleaning cigarette butts from the water system every weeks. The smoking has become everyone's problem. There will be additional "no smoking" signs placed around the pool. Also, no glass bottles around the pool. People will be expected to self-govern theirselves. If these same issues continue to be a problem, a designated smoking area will be created away from the pool and patio. Additionally, we will go back to enforcing the wristband identification for the pool. Homeowners should have one green wristband per adult in your home and a red wristband for your temporary guest. Please wear your wristband at the pool so we can begin to monitor people who are just walking in the park off the street and using our facility. A a reminder you are expected to take a brief shower prior to your entrance in the pool or jacuzzi. This simple measure will cut back on the obvious problem of mold in the pool caused by a build up of body oils and gels. \*Regarding the clubhouse; if residents chose to use it for a function you must obtain insurance. Also, you can not serve alcohol at your private function however people can come with their own alcoholic beverage in a discreet manner. \*Regarding parking over flow, residents and guest are permitted to use the parking spaces around the office after 5PM and the spaces around the clubhouse after 10PM. If any vehicle is found in violation of this or caught parking there without prior permission and proper sticker from the office their vehicle will be ticketed with a warning notice. After documenting your tags and your one warning, your vehicle will be towed. \* Finally, due to the abuse of some, "water restrictions" will go into the next media. Please read your media so you can stay informed regarding any upcoming events or changes in the park. Thank you for your immediate attention in these matters.

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#### **Manager's Corner**

Kristen Pruett, Resort Manager, East Bay Oaks and Eldorado Village

hat am I Paying For? - Many questions have come up since I have been here regarding the different fees involved in your monthly payment. I wanted to clarify for you what they are

Lot Rent- your monthly rent on the lot itself

Trash-this is the monthly fee for the Valet Trash service

Water - this is your equal share of the water bill from the county and will change monthly Sewer-this is your equal share of the sewer bill and will change monthly

Now for the 2 that aren't so obvious, Admin Fee and Tax Pass On (which really has nothing to do with taxes at all)

These are from Florida Statute 723, which governs the way that mobile home parks are to operate:

Admin Fee - Pursuant to FL Statutes Annotated Title XXVII, Chapter and Section 367.022(9), effective January 1, 2022, you will be charged a monthly Administrative Fee equal to an amount that does not exceed the actual cost of meter reading and billing, not to exceed 9% of the actual cost of water and wastewater service. The initial amount of the Administrative Fee is \$1.27.

Tax Pass Through Charge - Pass-through charge" means the mobile home owner's proportionate share of the necessary and actual direct costs and impact or hookup fees for a governmentally mandated capital improvement, which may include the necessary and actual direct costs and impact or hookup fees incurred for capital improvements required for public or private regulated utilities.

I encourage everyone to get out there and spruce up your lots and homes so we can give you proper kudos for the pride you have in your home and community!! Good Luck!!!

**Smoking and drinking at the pool** - There is now designated smoking area at the pool and if you smoke, you will be required to smoke there and only there. Also, cigar smoking is offensive to most people and is strictly prohibited at the pool. Violators will lose their privileges to the pool, and if that doesn't work, we will make the pool completely non-smoking. Every week, the pool company finds butts in the filters. clogging them up and leading to downtime on the pumps which means the pool is closed until repairs are made.

Also, per the health department and code enforcement, drinking alcohol at a public pool is strictly prohibited. NO GLASS OR CANS OF ALCOHOL ARE PERMITTED. The health

department will shut down the pool and if we find bottles in the trash we will be forced to shut down the pool as well.

The bottom line is, that this is a community, which means that the amenities are for everyone. Please be considerate of your neighbors and follow these simple rules so that everyone can enjoy a day by the pool. Thank you.

Reminder on Trash Policies

- 1. The trash area is open Tues, Weds and Fri 8:00 AM to 3:30 PM (Unless it is full or the City has picked up the compactor)
- 2. You can only throw basic household garbage in the compactor, bundled yard waste, or small furniture items in the roll-off and recyclables in the recycle bin-please do not leave anything on the ground or sitting outside the dumpster area, and anything else will need to be hauled off of the property. NO CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS EVER.
- 3. Trash pick up is Tuesdays and Fridays in front of your house, must be out be out by 8 AM.
- 4.All trash must be bagged, they will not take loose trash, boxes that are not broken down, any bags with kitty litter, dog feces, etc. Yard waste must be bundled or bagged.
- 5. They will not take furniture.



5. Excessive barking must be controlled so the pet is not bothering the neighbors.

**Watering** - We are under watering restrictions in Florida and Pinellas county and any watering of your yards or plants is STRICLY prohibited during the day. In addition, the following restrictions apply and will be strictly enforced:

If your lot# ends in an odd number-Wednesday and Saturday between 12:01 am and 10:00 OR 4:00 PM to 11:59 PM FOR NO MORE THAN 2 HOURS PER DAY.

If your Lot# ends in an even number- Thursday and Sunday between 12:01 am and 10:00 OR 4:00 PM to 11:59 PM FOR NO MORE THAN 2 HOURS PER DAY.

#### **Basic Rules (from the Pinellas County website)**

#### Wasteful and Unnecessary Use of Water Is Prohibited

Allowing water to flow from an unattended hose

Hand-watering a lawn on a restricted day or more than once a day

Hosing down a driveway or solid surface or structure when a dry method could be used

Allowing water to flow from a broken sprinkler head, outdoor faucet, malfunctioning plumbing, or irrigation system after receiving verbal or written notice

**Violations** - The Year-Round Conservation Measures and Seasonal Reclaimed Water Restrictions allow the first violation of these restrictions to be issued as a "warning" Notice of Violation. In accordance with Sixth Judicial Circuit Administrative Order No. 2018-068 PI-CTY, Local Ordinance Violations, and Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission Violations Uniform Fine Schedule, Attachment A, Miscellaneous Ordinance, Marine Patrol, Fish, and Wildlife Conservation Commission, and Natural Resources Violation fines start at \$193, and may be doubled for a second offense; and for each subsequent offense thereafter. Contested citations may result in the cost of a fine plus additional court costs. For more information after receiving a citation, please contact Business & Customer Services at (727)464-4000.

**Ducks/Wildlife** - Please do not feed or put out feeders accessible to ducks or other wildlife. It is illegal in the state of Florida and you could be charged a \$100 fine for each infraction, and it is a violation at the park. Not only that, but if you put out food for the ducks, anything will eat it, stray cats, rats, snakes,m possums. Just don't do it. Thank you!

### It's too hot for spot

A alking with our dogs is one of life's simple pleasures - and the highlight of a dog's day - but please keep a few tips in mind.

**V** On an 87-degree day, asphalt temperatures can reach a scorching 140 degrees. Even just a few minutes' contact with hot pavement can cause dogs' sensitive paws to burn. Hot sidewalks also reflect heat onto dogs' bodies, increasing their risk of suffering from deadly heatstroke.

A long hot summer is in front of us. Walk your doggies very early or very late, carry water and take frequent breaks in shady spots.

And please **never** leave an animal inside a vehicle in hot weather! Temperatures can quickly soar in parked cars, and a dog trapped inside can die from heatstroke within minutes—even if the vehicle is in the shade with the windows slightly open, which has little to no effect on lowering the temperature inside.

If you see an animal inside a hot car, please take immediate action - a life depends on it.

If there's time, go into the nearest building and find a manager. **Remember:** It only takes minutes for a dog to suffer brain damage when the weather is hot. Time is of the essence!

Politely ask the manager to page the owner of the car.

**BE PERSISTENT!** 

If the owner doesn't show up or doesn't do anything, call animal control (Pinellas County: (727) 582-2600 - put it in your contacts). If animal control can't come immediately, call 911. And remember, if all else fails, do what's necessary to save the animal's life.

According to Florida law (768.139 Rescue of vulnerable person or domestic animal from a motor vehicle; immunity from civil liability), someone who enters a car, including by force like breaking a window, can be immune from penalty for saving a person or animal.
