

Summer begins in 2022 on June 21 with the summer solstice, the day when the Earth's axis tilts our northern hemisphere most prominently toward the sun. On this day, the sun will reach its highest point in the sky, and afterward the daylight hours will grow shorter.

The solstice has been a time of celebration and ritual in cultures around the world throughout history. At Stonehenge, a visitor standing in the center of the stone circle can see the sun

rising directly over the Heel Stone, located just outside the ring of stones. The Egyptian Great Pyramids were built in such a way that an observer standing near the Sphinx can watch the sun set directly between two of the Pyramids.

Celts and Slavs celebrated the event with bonfires and dancing to help the sun increase its strength. The Native American Hopi tribe had males dress as dancing spirits of rain and fertility known as Kachinas—messengers between humanity and the gods who left the villages at midsummer to live in the mountains, where they were said to visit the dead.

The ancient Druids' belief that the solstice represented the wedding of heaven and Earth is responsible for the tradition of brides planning a lucky June wedding.

Then the consultant pulled out a bag of sand and poured it into the jar. "Now is the jar full?"


A smart woman in the front row raised her hand and said, "No, you can still pour water into the jar."


So the consultant did, filling it to the top.





Guard your home against burglars

e all want to be secure in our homes, but burglars are out there, looking for vulnerable houses to rob. Keep your home safe with this advice from the CNET website:



- Keep doors and windows locked. This is the simplest step to take for security, but it's easy to overlook. Don't make things easy for burglars by leaving any access point unlocked, even when you're home. Doublecheck before you leave or go to bed to make sure everything's locked up tight.
- Strengthen your entrances. Every door leading outside should have a deadbolt to make breaking in more difficult. Make sure your door frames and hinges are secure as well. Replace them if they've gotten old. Look into smart locks that you can engage remotely.
- Get a home security system. Security cameras will scare any would-be burglar off. They can alert you to movement outside even if you're not at home, and notify the police automatically. Motion sensors on your doors and windows can also add extra security.
- Keep valuables hidden. Don't leave jewelry, electronics, cash or credit cards, or anything else of value where they can be seen through a window. Keep curtains and blinds closed so your interior isn't visible to anyone outside. Close your garage doors so passersby can't spot bikes or expensive tools.
- Light up your yard. Install outdoor lighting so no one can get close to your house without being seen. Motion sensor lights will illuminate the outdoors whenever they detect movement, and if you have security cameras, you'll get a good look at anyone trying to break into your house.
- **Hide keys effectively.** Don't just leave a spare house key in a flowerpot or underneath your welcome mat—that's where most burglars will look first. Use a lockbox that can only be opened with a combination, and hide it away from your front door. If possible, leave an extra key with a neighbor you trust.
- **Don't let your house look empty.** Burglars target houses where no one is home. Remember to stop your newspaper and mail delivery when you go on vacation. Leave a few lights on inside when you go out at night. Install a system for turning lights on and off when you're away to give the illusion that someone is inside.

New mineral discovered in diamond

reprint the contract of the co in the heart of a diamond. Scientific American reports that the D mineral, a form of calcium silicate perovskite, has been created artificially in laboratories under high-pressure conditions, but it reverts to a different form under normal pressure. However, scientists found three small chunks of

the material when examining a diamond from Botswana. Because it has a different crystalline structure, they gave it a new name, davemaoite (after one of the researchers, geologist Ho-Kwang "Dave" Mao).

The diamond was formed deep in the mantle of the Earth, some 410–560 miles down. The davemoaite was found to have high levels of potassium, which may have helped keep it stable; it also contains small amounts of uranium and thorium, which are radioactive and contribute to the heat the Earth generates beneath its surface. Geologists speculate that dayemaoite may make up to 5–7% of the material in the Earth's mantle, providing new clues to the structure of our planet.

Greenland holds clue to ridges on Jupiter's moon

Tupiter's moon Europa is covered by ridges that appear in pairs stretching for hundreds of miles over channels of ice, and until recently scientists were puzzled about how they were created. Now, according to the Science News website, they believe the ridges arose from a process resembling the formation of similar ridges found in Greenland on Earth.

A NASA satellite in 2016 showed the existence of an 800-meterlong double ridge system in Greenland. Astronomers analyzed the Greenland ridges, which are much smaller than those on Europe

due to Earth's higher gravity. Radar shows that the Greenland ridges lie on top of a layer of water-filled snow about 10–15 meters deep; meltwater from the surface sinks into the buried snow beneath the ridges of ice.

Scientists theorize that the ridges on Europa have a similar origin, although the lack of meltwater or precipitation on the moon's surface means that the shallow water probably comes from an ocean under the shell of ice that makes up Europa's surface. When water rises through cracks, it collects in thick layers of ice from which the ridges grow.

A NASA probe scheduled to launch in 2024 and arrive at Europa in 2030 will provide more data to confirm the theory.
