rectings Teakwood Residents; Because we have been getting reports about dogs in the park not on a leash and feeding of wild animals, I went online to see what the Florida laws for Pinellas County are pertaining to these problems in Teakwood.

- 1. <u>Is there a leash law in Pinellas County?</u> Yes, the law states "no dog or cat shall run at large within the county. Any person who possesses, harbors, keeps, or has control of any dog or cat which is running at large shall be in violation, regardless of the knowledge, intent or culpability of the owner. "John Houle advised the Board of Directors to tell the people complaining to report them to Animal Control Code Enforcement at 727-582-2600 for removal from the premises. Please if you can, supply a picture and time of day of the violation.
- Feeding of wild animals in Pinellas County. In Pinellas County it is UNLAWFUL to feed wildlife. Feeding can increase the danger of the spread of disease and draws in larger predators. Wild animals fed by humans may quickly lose their natural fear and possibly attack without provocation. Wildlife habituated to humans feeding them often have to be destroyed because of the danger they pose to neighborhood pets and residents. Again, you may call Animal Control Code Enforcement.





Boil a large pot of water and add a little bit of white vinegar. Then pour it directly on the weeds. Within a few days all the weeds will be dead. Be careful to only pour on plants you want to kill. They may need up to three treatments to totally kill them. Be careful of the splashback. We don't want you to get burned.

This is easy, cheaper and so much better for the environment.









FYI, Roundup only kills the live plant, not the underlying seeds. That is why they come back within a few days. The boiling water will kill both the plants and the underlying seeds. Hoping you have a weed free life!!!

Clearwater Family Restaurant (CFR) is a laid-back casual family restaurant serving breakfast all day, lunch and early dinner. I got together with a few friends for lunch and everyone declared that what they ordered was good, the portions large, the prices were very reasonable and they would come here again.

The lunch menu has a bit of everything on it; appetizers, salads, specialty sandwiches, wraps, melts, paninis, burgers, club sandwiches, open face sandwiches, and wide choice of dinner entrees. You definitely won't lack for choices. Items our group sampled were: Hamburgers – $\frac{1}{2}$ pound 100% angus beef freshly made & cooked to order with fries (\$7.95); Gyro Platter – open faced served with pita bread, Greek salad, tzatziki sauce & French fries (\$10.95); CFR Club Sandwich – ham, bacon, cheese & a sliced hard boiled egg with a side of fries (\$9.50); Cheddar Jalapeno Poppers – a large portion served with marinara sauce (\$6.95); Turkey Caliente Wrap – loaded with roasted turkey breast, jalapenos, bacon, cheddar cheese & a dipping sauce comes with fries (\$8.95). As I said, everything was good, but the big hit of the day were the fries!! Crunchy outside tender inside everyone agreed these were great.

So if you are looking for a place you don't have to get dressed up for with really good food and reasonable prices this is worth checking out.

who couldn't even afford to buy a pot... they "didn't have a pot to piss in" and were the lowest of the low.

The next time you are washing your hands and complain because the water temperature isn't just how you like it, think about how things used to be. Here are some facts about the 1500's; Most people got married in June because they took their yearly bath in May, and they usually still smelled pretty good by June. However, since they were starting to smell, Brides carried a bouquet of flowers to hide the odor. Hence the custom today of carrying a bouquet when getting married.

Baths consisted of a big tub filled with hot water. The man of the house had the privilege of the nice clean water. Then all of the other men & sons, then the women and finally the children. Last of all the babies. By then the water was so dirty you could actually lose someone in it. Hence the saying "Don't throw out the baby with the bath water!"

Houses had thatched roofs; thick straw piled high with no wood underneath. It was the only place for animals to get warm, so all the cats and other small animals including mice & bugs lived in the roof. When it rained, it became slippery and sometimes the animals would slip and fall off the roof. Hence the saying, "It's raining cats & dogs". There was nothing to stop things from falling into the house. This posed a real problem in the bedroom where bugs and other droppings could mess up your nice clean bed. Hence, a bed with big posts and a sheet hung over the top afforded some protection. That's how canopy beds came into existence.

The floor was dirt. Only the wealthy had something other than dirt. There fore the saying, "Dirt Poor". The wealthy had slate floors that would get slippery in the winter when wet, so they spread thresh (straw) on the floor to help keep their footing. As the winter wore on they added more and more thresh until, when you opened the door it would start spilling outside. At that point a piece of wood was added to the entrance way. Hence, a Threshold was created. (Getting quite an education, aren't you?!?)

In those days they cooked in the kitchen with a big pot that always hung over the fire. Every day they lit the fire & added things to the pot. They ate mostly vegetables & did not get much meat. They would eat the stew for dinner, leaving leftovers in the pot to get cold overnight & then start over the next day. Sometimes the stew had food in it that had been there for quite a while. Hence the rhyme: "Peas porridge hot, peas porridge cold, peas porridge in the pot nine days old".

Sometimes, they could obtain pork, which made them feel quite special. When visitors came over, they would hang up their bacon to show off. It was a sign of wealth that a man could, "bring home the bacon." They would cut off a little to share with guests and they would all sit around and "chew the fat".

Those with money had plates made of pewter. Food with high acid content caused some of the lead to leach into the food, causing lead poisoning death. This happened most often with tomatoes, so for the 400 years or so, tomatoes were considered poisonous.

Bread was divided according to status...workers got the burnt bottom of the loaf, the family ...continued on page 30

got the middle, and guests got the top, or "upper crust".

Lead cups were used to drink ale or whiskey. The combination would sometimes knock the imbibers out for a couple of days. Someone walking along the road would take them for dead and prepare them for burial. They were laid out on the kitchen table for a couple of days and the family would gather around and eat & drink & wait to see if the person would wake up. Hence the custom of "holding a wake."

England is old & small, and the local folks started running out of places to bury people so they would dig up coffins, take the bones to a bone-house, and reuse the grave. When opening these coffins, 1 out of 25 coffins were found to have scratch marks on the inside and they realized they had been burying people alive. So, they would tie a string to the wrist of the corpse, lead it through the coffin and up through the ground & tie it to a bell. Someone would have to sit in the graveyard all night ("the graveyard shift") to listen for the bell; thus, someone could be "saved by the bell" or was considered a "dead ringer".

Now, whoever said history is boring ??!!

Roasted Lemon Chicken Thighs

- Ingredients:
- 1 lemon
- 4 lg. or 8 small boneless Chicken thighs
- Salt & pepper
- 3 tsp. olive oil divided
- 3 sprigs of oregano
- 1 tbs. Minced shallots
- 1 clove garlic minced
- 1/8 tsp.red pepper flakes
- 1/4 cup dry white wine
- 1/2 cup chicken broth

Directions:

Thinly slice lemon 1/2 cup, remaining lemon into 2 wedges.

Season chicken thighs with salt and pepper

Put 1 tsp. Oil in sauté pan, add chicken skin side down brown, drain excess fat off. Put in 350 oven for 35 minutes, halfway through add slices of lemon over chicken. When chicken is done take out chicken, put on platter to keep warm. Return pan to medium heat, add the oregano, shallots, garlic, and red pepper flakes. Cook for about one minute. Add wine to cook over medium heat. reduce half then 1 to 2 minutes add broth. cook until thickened three minutes. Squeeze one lemon wedge over the seasoned reduced sauce, add salt and pepper. add both wedges drizzle with 2 teaspoons of olive oil return chicken to Pan skin side up to rewarm pouring caramelize lemon sauce over chicken. Serve and enjoy.






