Day 1: You will depart your community aboard the motor coach for a fun filled tour to St. Augustine, with comfort stops being made enroute. You will arrive early afternoon and disembark in the Historic District where you will have the day to shop and explore the city. You will have plenty of time to take in the local sights but be sure to stop by the visitor center where you can purchase discount tickets for many of the attractions. You will then meet our vehicle at the earlier drop off point in the Historic district at 4PM so we can check in at our hotel. After you have had the chance to freshen up our motor coach will be waiting at the hotel at 6:30PM to take you to the trolley station for the Nights of Lights trolley experience. This evening you may feel free to choose one of the many fine dining experiences downtown, (Dinner is not included in tour price).

Day 2: Breakfast is available at the hotel from 6:30AM. You will then have the entire day to explore St. Augustine's historic downtown, an old Spanish town established in the 1800's. This was the first European colony in North America and began to bustle with the arrival of Henry Flagler who developed the downtown as a major resort for leisure travelers. Historic St. Augustine has become a center of Spanish culture and a popular destination for travelers from all parts of the world. You are free to ride the trolley on/off all day.

Day 3: After having breakfast, you will join the motor coach which departs at 9AM. You will have a picturesque journey home, traveling the A1A Highway that takes you along Florida's beautiful East Coast beaches with white sand dunes, rolling waves, and luxury homes. 






Neighborhood Watch Program – Vacation House Checks

From Ken Simms Honeymoon Park Neighborhood Watch Co-ordinator.

The summer season us upon us and it is usually a quiet time in Honeymoon Mobile Home Park with the many snowbirds having returned home for the summer. This does not deter criminal activity.

Vehicle Burglaries

This is a common occurrence in Pinellas County. It occurs in home driveways, shopping center parking lots, parks, and at the beach. It is important to note that well over 80% of reported vehicle burglaries are to unlocked vehicles. When criminals break a window to gain entry to a



locked vehicle, it is usually due to something of value being left in plain view. No matter how safe we believe we are in Honeymoon Park, ensure your car doors are locked, and remove any valuables out of sight to prevent an opportunity for criminal activity.

Latest Scams

One third of business-imposter scams involve scammers claiming to be from Amazon. Senior adults tend to be their main targets. The scammers use phone and social media messages to scam people. Ignore all calls, texts, emails and social media messages about suspicious Amazon account activity, raffles, or unauthorized purchases. If you thing you have a real account problem or to verify any suspicious messages, contact Amazon support at 888-280-4331.

Scammer's newest payment methods involve Cryptocurrency ATMs. Scammers pretending to be government officials, utility agents, collection agencies, or sweepstake representatives, direct you to pay a purported bill by sending cryptocurrency bought at ATMs to an untraceable digital wallet. Once the payment is made it is irreversible. There is no way to get your money back.

Phishing continues to be the most common cyber threat around. Phishers take on a persona of someone trustworthy, a friend, neighbor or colleague, in an attempt to get you to provide them with personal information, or to entice you to click on a malicious link via email, social media, or other messaging apps. The most important step in spotting a phishing attempt is to carefully review the email message. This will help you to identify inconsistencies like misspelled names, poor grammar in the text and links that don't leads to the place they should. If you are unsure of the link, move your mouse over the link and you will see in the bottom corner of the page, the full URL, and you can then identify if they are linking you to real or a scam website.

What to Bring:

- Electronics:Cell phones, computer towers/CPUs, drives (e.g. hard drives, CD drives), laptops, monitors, electronics with rechargeable batteries (if possible, remove battery from device, place device in garbage), smart phones, tablets, televisions (must be whole).
- Chemicals: Automotive fluids (including oil, antifreeze, and gasoline), fuels (e.g. kerosene), cooking oil, lawn and garden chemicals (e.g. pesticides, herbicides, and fertilizers), paints (dried paints and empty cans should be disposed of in garbage), stains, paint thinner, solvents, wood preservatives, adhesives and epoxies, aerosols, cleaners, smoke detectors, rechargeable batteries (dispose of single-use batteries in trash), and fluorescent bulbs.

Customers must stay in their vehicle. Items must be placed in the trunk, truck bed, or trailer to allow for ease of access.


