



If you are a member of the club, we try to get the information to you as quickly as possible. If you don't have access to E-mail, the clubhouse Travel Bulletin Board is your next best means or a friend who has e-mail and is a member of the Travel Club. The Monthly Media is a wonderful form of media but it sometimes can be 30 or more days too late for some things. Any resident of Briar Creek, their family or friends can be a member. It's only through the many that we can get better travel services with group discounts and savings.



- 1. There are many ways to be a part of the travel adventures we plan each season. There is the clubhouse bulletin board where you can find flyers posted with information on the trips and sign-up sheets so you can join one of the trips.
- 2. There is a website www.upcsportshub.com with a page dedicated to our travel club. This contains the trip information and includes more details on some of the trips. There is also an automated sign-up form on the travel page so you can sign up for a trip, or send information needed for some travel trips.
- 3. We will, on some trips, use the services of a travel agency to assist us with our trips. Our Travel Agent is there to assist you also however it's important to note the travel club needs to get the sign-up information first. Our agent often times may be away escorting other trips. They also assist and service many other organizations and may not be familiar with you individually. The Briar Creek Travel club uses the records we maintain on all trips to validate and confirm guests on our trips. Contacting the travel agency in advance could result in information being lost as we have no way to compare the trip manifest if you are not first listed on our manifest for the trip. Timing could be an issue if the agent is away from the office escorting another group.

Please contact the Briar Creek travel club first. Our Travel Agent can then contact you if any additional information is needed for the trip. For many trips, the Travel Club will maintain the funds until we know we have the minimum capacity necessary to meet the trip requirement. This makes it possible for the Travel Club to refund the trip cost to you if it's necessary to cancel a trip. Once we reach that threshold to pay for the trip, some trips may not be refundable but we can transfer the trip to another name as a replacement.

SCAM ALERTS

I Nana. I'm in big trouble...don't tell Mom and Dad."
This could happen to you. Caller ID may show the name of your grandchild. In some cases, the caller could win awards for mimicking exact tone, phrases, cadence that you grandchild.



awards for mimicking exact tone, phrases, cadence that you grandchild uses. How? I don't know. But it happens. Always be suspicious if you receive this type of call. Hang up and call your grandchild directly to confirm/verify.

The AARP organization targets adults over 50 in their monthly publications as well as their websites. The links below provide a myriad of wonderful, eye-opening information. If you take the time to browse through the site, you may be amazed by how many people get sucked in by fraudulent scams. As well as how many topics scammers use.

Protect yourself. Basically – TRUST No ONE!

Below is a sampling of how to detect a scam or fraud. There are literally, too many to present here. Please check out the AARP website for complete information and ways to stop scammers in their tracks.

- 1. Do not respond to suspicious text messages. Don't even reply by messaging "STOP" or "NO." Doing so signals that your phone number is active, and your number could be sold to other criminals.
- 2. Do not click on hyperlinks or attachments in suspect messages. If a friend sends you a text with a suspicious link, check with the acquaintance to determine if he or she has been hacked.
- 3. Take steps to filter unwanted messages or block them before they reach you. Several mobile phone providers allow you to block a sender by forwarding unwanted texts to 7726 ("SPAM"). Check with your provider about this and other blocking options available on your phone, through your wireless provider or using a call-blocking app. Here's more from the Federal Trade Commission.

- 4. Never share personal or financial information by text, email or phone call.
- 5. Report scam texts to the FCC, the FTC, the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center and to the entity whose name appears in the suspect message.
- **6. Watch out for distress schemes** or grandparent scams, in which you get a message or a phone call that appears to be from a relative saying the loved one needs money because of a situation they got into. When in doubt, contact the person you know outside of social media.
- **7. Enable automatic updates** so the operating systems on your desktop, laptop, smartphone and tablet are updated whenever software patches to vulnerabilities are released. On a related note, be sure to use software to protect against computer viruses and keep it up to date.

s we move into September, less than a handful of named storms have formed so far in this year's Atlantic hurricane season. Forecasters, however, remain confident above-average levels of activity will develop over the next two months. This year Saharan dust in the air has helped to suppress tropical activity due to the abundance of dry air and strong winds. Saharan dust lofting in the atmosphere is one of the main reasons that there were no hurricanes during the months of June and July. Who knew that dust from the Saharan Desert in Africa impacts not just our hurricane season but also, due to the fine dust particles and bacteria in the air, stir up asthma, allergies and pulmonary issues. Historically, during the 72-year period from 1950 to 2021 but normalized to 100 years, September is the most active month of the Atlantic hurricane season and when most hurricanes occur. Saharan dust flow has already begun to dissipate and NOAA predicts a higher than average number of hurricanes this month. Even though we got lucky during June and July, we cannot let our guard down over the next two months. If you are new to Briar Creek and unfamiliar with hurricanes, take time to educate yourself and prepare. Hurricane Guides are available from numerous sources including the City of Safety Harbor and Pinellas County websites. Don't forget that we are in a designated mandatory evacuation zone should

Recently we had a homeowner experience a kitchen fire at their home. The homeowner was warming up some food in the Microwave, in a Pyrex dish, when it exploded. Only minutes before, the homeowner said that she was looking thru the glass door, checking on her food just before the explosion.



Why Pyrex Shatters:

Pyrex is made of glass. When glass changes temperature rapidly it can undergo "thermal shock." The text book definition of thermal shock is: "Stress produced in a body or in a material as a result of undergoing a sudden change in temperature." When a Pyrex bowl is heated or cooled rapidly, different parts of the bowl expand or contract by different amounts, causing stress. If the stress is too extreme, the bowl's structure will fail, causing a spectacular shattering effect.

Please use caution when reheating food in the microwave, if it is a glass bowl. Make sure that the manufacturer states that it is safe to use in the Microwave, and always follow directions.

Most of all, please stay safe.

Wipers On, Headlights On

Jody Larson



Just a reminder to folks from other states—Florida law requires that you turn on your headlights when driving in the rain, regardless of the time of day.

This does not mean your parking lights, your emergency flashers, or your daytime running lights. It means headlights. A good reminder is, when you turn your wipers on, turn your headlights on too. Drive with headlights on low-beam.

If you've been in one of our typical Florida downpours, then you know this makes sense!

It's against the law to drive with only your parking lights on, by the way. And, it used to be against the law to drive with your emergency flashers or hazard lights on—they were to be used only when broken down and stopped on the side of the road, or when in a funeral procession. A change to the law in 2021 now allows flashing hazard lights to be used in extremely low-visibility situations such as heavy rain, fog, or smoke, while driving on roads with speed limits of 55 and above. And yes, you should have your headlights on as well.

Golf for the Briar Creek ladies.

Thile there has always been a fairly large contingent of men in Briar Creek who enjoy golf and play in a number of different 'groups', in the 11 or so years we have lived here there have never been an especially large number of lady golfers who have wanted to play in a BC Ladies League.



When I first arrived here there was a group of maybe 10 to 12 lady golfers, but sadly few of these ladies still live here and fewer still golf. Countryway Golf Club (an Executive 18 hole course just off Tampa Road) which has been our 'home course' for all these years is still very supportive and maintains an early Thursday morning tee time for us and continues to only charge us the reduced fee for an organized league.

The Ladies group has always had a very open and relaxed approach to the game, with everyone simply playing at their own ability level. No scorekeeping, no winners or losers and no prize money.

A couple of years ago, some ladies who did not want to play early in the morning arranged to also have a Friday afternoon tee-time, but last year, to my knowledge, no-one went out to play on the Friday tee-time. Sadly even the regular Thursday ladies group was small, and effectively those interested in golfing simply made up their own foursome and took advantage of the BC Ladies League status for the tee-time and green fees.

I have been golfing with Bill a couple of times each week this summer, and Countryway still offers us the Briar Creek League reduced fee. When I have a better idea of the level of interest in Ladies Golf outings I will talk with the owner at Countryway to confirm what tee-times we expect

to use over the winter.

Jane McKenzie (who has looked after the Ladies League for the last few years) has given me a list of all the people she knows who used to be interested or active in the Ladies League and I have been in contact with them to find out what their golf plans are.

Meanwhile since there are so many new residents in BC 1 and 2, I have asked Pete to put this note into the September Media with the hope that any new residents interested in playing golf will get in touch with me.

HEALING FROM THE PAST

hat choices do we have in our lives? Each and every situation we are in leaves us with a decision or choice. What if we are near sighted or far sighted, or have blind



spots and we simply cannot see all the choices, and simply believe we have no choice? Where in our human DNA deep in our ancestral beliefs have we been programmed to forget that we are all spiritually connected by a higher calling. 
