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Manager's Message

September – Prepare for the High Season.

S eptember marks preparation for the return of our seasonal Residents and those Residents beginning their arrangements to return to the cozy Cove. Our preparation follows the basic sailor, soldier, and airmen

tasks – cleaning, polishing, and maintaining – as we ready the Cove to receive our returning Residents. Please, let us know any specific areas requiring our attention as we strive to *shape Americana Cove into a premier 'active' 55+ Resident owned community.*

The 4th item in the *Covenants of the Cove:*

Manufactured home living is unique and homes are close to one another. Consider your neighbor with respect to loud noises such as radios, stereos, televisions, and voices that would disturb others, particularly during the evening and nighttime.

This covenant is pretty direct in addressing the Golden Rule to "treat others as you want to be treated." Noise pollution is the thrust of this tenet; however, the Golden Rule can apply to many challenging situations requiring neighbor cooperation within our community. Recently experienced this maxim firsthand as next-door neighbors coordinated their actions to remedy a dollar weed problem. Each had a case to go-it-alone and point fingers at their neighbor, but they chose to cooperate to address the situation. This example serves as a reminder that the **Covenants of the Cove** were developed *For The Betterment of Our Community*.

Initiative Updates:

- 1. Lauster Land Survey should complete the hydro survey this month, which should put us closer to completing the short-term riprap fill. ProWaycompleted the renovation of the south boat ramp in early August that completes all south ramp repairs. So, one down with one ramp to go.
- 2. MAROA Board approved Edge Marine to repair a section of the seawall as a preliminary project to determine the effectiveness of the Foster Engineering renovation. This month will meet with Bryan Burge, the Edge Marine representative, to initiate coordination in order to begin construction in early November.
- 3. The WEBSITE Committee, chaired by Phil Quince, instituted the 'new' Resident Portal log-in feature that allows Residents to forego entering passwords to open documents upon registering and logging in to the site.
- 4. Gulf & Bay Dock Wraps should complete wrapping the MAROA dock piles prior to 15 October 2022.
- 5. ProWay arrives in mid-month to asphalt three areas, seal the January asphalt patches, and reseal portions of Americana Drive and Mt Piney Avenue under warranty. At the end of the month ProWay will re-stripe the roads and Clubhouse parking areas.
- 6. Turns out that trimming the mangroves on the in-/out-bound access canal is not under the Pinellas County jurisdiction and therefore requested through the St Pete Arborist. Waiting for reply.
- 7. JAG will prune, trim, and remove hardwoods in early October. A feature of this process is a walk-about / reconnaissance with JAG leadership and the community manager to identify *...continued on page 6*



all hardwoods and their expected care.

8. Healthy Residents remains a goal. The monthly Save Our Seniors produce market serves to achieve that end, and well as the monthly Bloodmobile. A future effort is to offer Flu Shots on a Tuesday in early October. *Please, look for Brad Coath's Flu article in this issue.*

ARHC Requirements

Recently there have been a few ARHC requests submitted after the fact, so I have provided you with a list of example of items that **require ARHC** approval prior to proceeding with a project: If there is a question with what you are doing or having done, contact the office for clarification.

The following REQUIRE a St Petersburg Building Permit

upgrading AC or replacement installing, repairing/replacing a dock expanding a shed or putting in a new one re-wiring electricity replacing or upgrading windows or doors structural renovations or modifications to dwelling for any exterior walls installing solar panels renovation of plumbing fixtures and water pipes replacing water heaters installing generators

The following DO NOT require a Permit from St Petersburg

expanding a shed or putting in a new one less than 100 square feet restoring a roof (new shingles or roof-over) painting a driveway erecting a porch refurbishing or replacing siding painting a home, trim, shutters or awning installation of Handicap Ramp outside light construction and renovation installing satellite dish installing flag pole stairs construction building temporary parking area

For renters: We have added a form to the https://www.americanacovehomes.com website that potential renters can fill out and it will be sent directly to us. Once we receive, the information is added to our list. If you have friends or relatives who would like to rent in the community, have them go to the website and fill out the form to be added to the renter list.

The following are the renting rules for Americana Cove:

- Renters are treated just like buyers. All renters must have a background/credit check and be approved by management before moving in.
- All renters must have a credit score of 700 or above just like all home buyers. If renting to a couple, both people must have 700 or above credit score.
- Homes must be rented for a minimum of two months.
- For rentals less than six months and a day, residents must pay a tourist development tax to the state and county. Go to this website to learn more about this tax: <u>https://pinellastaxcollector.gov/property-tax/tourist-development-taxes/</u> The county has a simple process to make it easy for individuals to register and pay the tax.


