FROM THE MAIN OFFICE

ell, September is upon us, and I have spent a lot of time writing letters. So, I thought I would go over what all the letters are about. Now, I know it is a repeat, but these letters indicate that repeating is needed.

As many of you are aware, Mr. Houle is making inspections for lawn/home cleaning and painting/etc. Something we are noticing during these inspections is that there are a lot of satellite dishes in yards. I checked the Rules and Regulations and on page 6, it clearly says: "Exterior antennas, satellite dishes and other external signal receivers must be approved in writing by the Management." Now, I do know that satellite dishes have never been approved, in writing or otherwise, so if there is a satellite dish in your yard it needs to go. If it is not in use, you may contact the main office of Teakwood and we will assist in the removal of the dish. If it is in use, you will have to have it moved so it is secured to your home by contacting your provider. Just remember if you put it in the yard, you must get written permission to do so.

Another side effect of Mr. Houle doing these inspections is that he is noticing a lot of vehicles parked on the street. Again, per the Rules and Regulations (page 8): "No on-street parking shall be allowed." Pretty straight forward, isn't it? Yes, if you receive a delivery the driver is allowed to park in front of YOUR house to complete the delivery. If a guest stops by for a couple of minutes to drop something off, then they may stop in front of YOUR house to pick you up or to drop something off. Do not park in front of your neighbor's home, do not park on the lawn, do not park on the sidewalk, do not park in a neighbor's carport without their written permission, you have a carport for you and your guests or your guest may park in guest parking. Oh, along those same lines, any guest is the full responsibility of the resident they are visiting. If your guest violates the Rules and Regulations, it is the same as you committing the violation yourself.

I just saw where September is Children's Good Manners Month and wondered why it's just for children. It's a ponderable for sure. Enjoy National Honey Month and use your manners (we are all someone's child).


FREE FOOD

MISSING MAN TABLE

n Friday, September 16, 2021, Teakwood Social Club will set the MISSING MAN TABLE. This observance takes place on the third Friday of each September. Ben Cortez & Cheryl Tracy are inviting all residents & friends to attend this program. It begins at 12:00 pm (noon) in the Aloha Hall. If you have not attended before, you will be impressed. Several residents of the park set a table in honor of those who are/were POW's and in memory of those who are Missing in Action.

The <u>Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA</u>) is tasked with making continuous efforts to account for the service members who still have not come home from conflicts around the globe. At present, more than 81,500 Americans remain missing from WWII, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, the Cold War, and the Gulf Wars/other conflicts. Of this number, 75% of the losses are located in the Indo-Pacific area, and over 41,000 of the missing are presumed lost at sea (i.e. ship losses, known aircraft water losses, etc.). POW/MIA Day is but one moment in that ongoing effort, but it's an important one.



- Stay active arthritis can make movement difficult so it's important to include physical activity in your daily routine; walking, swimming, yoga & bicycling can keep your joints lubricated and reduce pain. Being active also boosts your mood and decreases stress. If you already have arthritis start out slowly and gradually add time and intensity to your routine as you gain strength and endurance.
- Strengthen & stretch muscles doing regular stretching & strengthening exercises increases your flexibility and improves balance & helps reduce risks of future injuries.
 <u>FYI here at Teakwood</u> we have water aerobics classes that are great for this AND we have a small but very good gym. All of these can help stretch & strengthen your muscles!
- Consult your physician make sure you talk to your doctor about the steps you are taking now and see if he/she has other suggestions especially if your pain increases.







FROM DEE'S KITCHEN TO YOURS

Easy Lobster Bisque

24 oz. Chunks Lobster meat
4 cloves garlic
4 garlic cloves
1/2 purple onion
2 carrots
4 stalks celery
1/2 cup tomato paste
1 qt. seafood broth

2 cups white wine

Tbsp. olive oil
 oz. brandy
 cup heavy cream
 bay leaves
 Tbsp.salt
 tea..peppercorns
 tsp. paprika
 tsp. thyme
 tbsp.fresh lemon juice



Start by chopping garlic, onions, celery, and carrots pretty fine. The end result will be blended so don't worry much about size as it will all come together well. Cook onion in olive oil in a pot until fragrant, then add garlic and cook until pan starts looking a little blackened and crusty at the bottom. Deglaze the pot using the white wine and then add celery and carrots. Pour broth, brandy and tomato paste, stir to mix well. Add in your spices, let soup simmer for 1 hour. Once the soup has cooked and the spices have let their flavors in , remove and discard bay leaves. Add cream and allow to come to a simmer again. Blend soup before adding the chunks of lobster. If lobster is not cooked then sauté it in some butter. If lobster is frozen I sauté it in the butter a little longer than I do if lobster is not cooked. Mix well and enjoy!

Cheese Pizza

14.5 oz. Tomatoes (whole drained and chopped) 1 tsp. minced garlic

1 bag of fresh dough or 1 prebaked pizza crust

2 cups cheese mozzarella or any kind of your choices

1 tsp. olive oil

Roll out dough if you are using fresh. in a small dish put the 1 tsp. of oil and add the tomatoes. Once well blended spread tomatoes mixture over dough top with Mozzarella cheese. Bake 400 for 25 minutes but keep checking it !
