Let umana hosts food pantries throughout Pinellas County and the HOA has teamed with them to host a food pantry in Lake Haven on October 25. At this event will be prepackaged bags filled with food items donated to Tampa Bay Harvest. The bags normally include produce, meats and non-perishables but is dependent on what was donated that day. This event is entirely free to all residents.

Due to the current economic condition demand for this program is extremely high. The HOA has asked that 100 bags of food be available for distribution at this trial event. In order to be fair, sign-up forms have been posted in all three clubhouses; when all 100 slots are filled the forms will be removed.

The food truck is scheduled to arrive in Lake Haven Park #1 Clubhouse at noon on October 25. To receive a bag, you must be present to pick it up and your name must be on the list; one bag of food per person. Dependent on participation, the HOA will schedule this event on a regular basis.

Humana also has a Laundry Day event available but unless there is a demand from the residents, we have opted out of the program as Humana obtains most laundry related items from the Dollar Store and the quantity sizes are small.

By now ELS should have completed the 360s in all three parks. If you find that some areas of your home require improvement to meet Prospectus standards, and you are physically unable to do the work required, please remember that Lake Haven has an active volunteer program available to help you.

ELS has installed electronic locks on the clubhouses, pool gates and workout center. These facilities will be remotely opened and closed based on the times stated in our Prospectus - 8:00AM - 10:00PM.





What to know about September

t's September! Summer is over, school has started, and the leaves are starting to turn. As we're getting ready for fall and winter, remember these factoids about the ninth month of the year:

- September was originally the seventh month, according to the ancient Roman calendar, and that's where it gets its name. It became the ninth month after the calendar changed in 451 B.C.
- The Romans associated September with Vulcan, the god of fire, possibly because as the seventh month it was in the middle of the hot summer.
- The Anglo-Saxons called September Gerst Monath, which meant "Barley Month," because barley was harvested at that time of year. The barley was also brewed as a popular beverage in celebration of the harvest.
- In another calendar change, the British eliminated Sept. 2–14 in 1752 to bring the month in accordance with the Gregorian calendar, which replaced the Julian calendar.
- Fall begins in the northern hemisphere on the equinox, which falls between Sept. 21–23. In the southern hemisphere, the equinox signifies the beginning of spring.

What is Labor Day all about?

abor Day is a yearly celebration of the American worker. Created by the labor movement, it's a national tribute to workers' contributions to the social and economic achievements of the United States.

There is some uncertainty about how Labor Day began. Some

records show that Peter J. McGuire, general secretary of the Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners and a co-founder of the American Federation of Labor, was first to suggest a day to honor those "who from rude nature have delved and carved all the grandeur we behold." Other sources suggest that machinist Matthew Maguire, later the secretary of Local 344 of the International Association of Machinists in Paterson, N.J., proposed the holiday in 1882 while serving as secretary of the Central Labor Union in New York.

The first Labor Day holiday was celebrated on Tuesday, Sept. 5, 1882, in New York City, in accordance with the plans of the Central Labor Union.

In 1884, the first Monday in September was selected as the official holiday.

The first governmental recognition of Labor Day came through municipal ordinances passed in 1885 and 1886. The State of Oregon passed the first law recognizing the Labor Day holiday on Feb. 21, 1887. Four more states—Colorado, Massachusetts, New Jersey, and New York—followed suit that same year.

On June 28, 1894, Congress passed an act making the first Monday in September of each year a legal holiday in all the states, the District of Columbia, and all U.S. territories.


