October –Initial Return of our Northern Travelers.

Cove begins the homecoming of our seasonal Residents, while other travelers begin their arrangements to return to the Cozy Cove. So, welcome back! We stay-behinds have prepared for your return as we all attempt to . . . shape Americana Cove into a premier 'active' 55+ Resident owned community.

The 6thitem in the Covenants of the Cove:

Carports should be kept neat, clean and free of clutter at all times. Only bicycles, barbecues, golf carts, vehicles and outdoor patio furniture will be permitted in the carport area. Clothes hanging outside must be taken in prior to dusk. There are clothes lines behind both laundry facilities. If you are allowing a neighbor to park their car in your carport, please provide written documentation to the office as soon as possible so we will know not to issue a violation.

We address many of these concerns during the Spring Cleaning Review. Please make note that for 2023, we will be starting reviews in late-January, early-February in order to provide more face-to-face discussions to alleviate sending letters once Residents depart for the season.*continued on page 6*

Initiative Updates:

- 1. Lauster Land Survey completed the hydro survey in September, which means the riprap fill should occur by the end of October. That completes the boat ramp project.
- 2. MAROA Board approved Edge Marine to repair a section of the seawall as a preliminary project to determine the effectiveness of the Foster Engineering renovation. Met with Bryan Burge, the Edge Marine representative, to initiate coordination this past month in order to begin construction in early November.
- 3. The WEBSITE Committee, chaired by Phil Quince, continues to update the website based on Resident comments. Lately, they posted the names of the standing committees and our Cove employees.
- 4. Gulf & Bay Dock Wraps should complete wrapping the MAROA dock piles this month.
- 5. ProWay completed the street repairs this past September, so this entry will be the last on that task.
- 6. The St Pete Arborist charged MAROA for the mangrove trimming along the canal, now waiting to obtain the permit and then start cutting.
- 7. JAG will prune, trim, and remove hardwoods this month. A feature of this process is a walk-about / reconnaissance with JAG leadership and the community manager to identify all hardwoods and their expected care.
- 8. The monthly Save Our Seniors produce market occurs on Tuesday morning, 11 October. A future effort is to offer Flu Shots on a Tuesday in early October. *Please, look for Brad Coath's Flu article in this issue.*

There are sewer blockage issues due to Preparation H and Swiffer wipes. Please, do not dispose of these items through the toilet.







New height requirements for new homes

ast October, we had an article outlining the new height restrictions that came into effect June 2021. Due to the number of questions that we continue to receive from residents and potential buyers, we are reviewing them again.

The city of St. Petersburg permitting department issued new guidelines for the elevation of new homes within an AE-9 flood zone, which is the flood zone that Americana Cove is located.

As of June 22, 2021, new homes placed in Americana Cove must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be elevated to a Base Flood Elevation + 2 feet, which equates to approximately 10 stairs high.
- 2. All HVAC equipment and electrical services must be elevated to Base Flood Elevation.
- 3. Homes must now have a permanent foundation cast in reinforced concrete footings and reinforced masonry piers. Additional anchors and wind tie-down straps are required. According to Broker/Dealer Marty Pozgay, the new height and foundation requirements

will add approximately \$25,000 to the price of a new home.

What is a flood elevation certificate? To obtain flood insurance, an insurer will need a flood elevation certificate, which is an official FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Association) approved document that identifies the elevation (height above sea level), the special flood hazard area, and required base flood elevation (BFE) based on the communities Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM's) in effect at the time of certification. By having this document, an insurer knows what rate to charge based on the height of the home if an owner wants flood insurance. A surveying company completes flood elevation certificates. The cost of flood insurance is based on the height of the home, so new homes have lower flood insurance than an older home that is closer to the ground.
